After 33 years as an elementary teacher, Roxana Eckhoff will say goodbye to her final class of kindergarteners on May 16. Eckhoff, a kindergarten teacher at Warsaw South Elementary, is retiring from a job she has loved for more than 30 years.

"I love children," said Eckhoff. "I always wanted a big family and my whole life has revolved around children."

The youngest daughter of the late Dr. Leo and Rita Porter graduated from Warsaw High School in 1987 and continued her education at Central Methodist University in Fayette. She attended Central Methodist on volleyball and music scholarships.

"I loved CMU because I was able to continue with the sport I loved in high school and the music program allowed me to travel with the choir to perform," said Eckhoff.

Her high school sweetheart, Dustin Eckhoff, attended Mizzou and after they were married, they eventually found themselves back in Benton County.

Eckhoff taught for two years n Higbee, MO, and then one year in Lincoln when a position

my children as they play sports and are active in many activities," said Eckhoff.


Eckhoff commented that she would miss the children and her school family, but she wants to be a full-time

This time of year I get many questions about snakes. The one thing I tell people is if they want to win a bet, ask someone how many species of poisonous snakes there are in Missouri. Do you know the answer?

Snakes belong to the class Reptilia, a group that also includes turtles, alligators, crocodiles and lizards. There are over 3,000 named species of snakes globally. Missouri has 51 species and subspecies of snakes.

The answer to the question is zero. Plants and some other things are poisonous, snakes are venomous, of which we have five species: Timber rattlesnake, Eastern Massasauga rattlesnake, Western Pygmy rattlesnake, Western cottonmouth and the Copperhead.



venomous snakes have eyes with vertical and elliptical pupils like a cat, while all harmless snakes have round eyes. Venomous snakes also have a single row of scales on the underside of the tail while the harmless snakes have two rows of scales. The old adage of a triangular shaped head to identify venomous snakes is not reliable.

All snakes are ectothermic (cold-blooded) which makes them unable to regulate their NICHOLS Page 3

She called 9-1-1 when she and her dog were alone with her mother who passed out while helping Myracle with her homework. She provided details and her address to the 911 Dispatcher and remained calm while EMTs hurried to her house.

"Myracle's ability to remain composed and provide pertinent details undoubtedly facilitated the dispatcher's efforts in orchestrating a timely and

appropriate response," said Emergency Management Director Jessica Mayfield. "We may have a future 911 Dispatcher on our hands. Operator (Karmen) Smith's professionalism and

adeptness in guiding the child through the process commendable, ultimately leading to a favorable outcome with the mother's well-being preserved. This incident

serves as a testament to the significance of emergency training and the crucial role that both civilians and emergency responders play in safeguarding lives."

Myracle told the dispatcher that her mom did not eat dinner and then the little girl had a Pepsi and ate some cookies. She said that her mom had taught her to call 911 in case of an emergency. The little girl stayed on the phone with the dispatcher until EMTs arrived and revived her mom.

Maurica Cross, Myracle's mom, says that she is doing better although she has always had some medical issues and that is why she taught her daughter to call 911 if no one else is around. She said that she also told Myracle to answer all questions from dispatch as well as stay calm.

Top with 2 slices of the cheese, the eggs, and then the remaining 2 slices cheese. Close the sandwich with the remaining bread slice butter-side up. Press the sandwich slightly to close, flip, brown and eat!

The Food Pantry has purchased additional food utilizing grant funds or funds that have been donated, however, this is not allowing us to meet the food demands for the number of Benton County residents we serve. This has forced us to reevaluate our hours of operation. As of May 1, the

Benton County Food Pantry

will be open on Monday and

Wednesday from 8 am to 12

pm," said Sullivan. The Food Bank works with more than 145 partner agencies across a 32-county service area to provide food assistance to any person who needs it. These partner agencies include local food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, senior centers and more. Functioning like a distribution center, The Food Bank provides these partners with food at no cost so they can distribute it to their communities.

The role of The Food Bank often misunderstood, and few realize the scope of its impact. Instead of working as a single entity, The Food Bank uses bulk-purchasing power, community partnerships, and its association with Feeding America to obtain an average of 30 million pounds of food a year. That food is distributed through The Food Bank's network of partner agencies, reaching as many as 100,000 Missourians on a monthly basis. Last year, the equivalent of 24 million meals were provided by The Food Bank through its partner agencies.

"We receive food shipments from the Northeast Central Food Bank once and week and lately the amount of food we receive is not enough for the demand," said Sullivan. Sullivan explained that while the people of Benton County have been generous in their help with donations and food, the demand for food is greater than what the

BCFP receives.

"We are serving 80 to 100 people a day and we are continually having more people sign up," said Sullivan. "The majority of the people who come to the BCFP are senior citizens and many of them are supporting grandchildren as well."

In order to receive food, recipients must have proof of residency in Benton County and a photo ID. Recipients can receive food once a month.

"We have the most people on the first of the month since that is when they are eligible to pick up food again," said BCFP manager Jeannie Arnold.

According to Sullivan, Walmart has been a good supporter of BCFP by donating fruit and vegetables.

"We appreciate the donations from Walmart," said Sullivan. "Our volunteers go through all the produce and anything that isn't good is picked up by local farmers to feed to chickens or pigs so nothing goes to waste."

In addition to donations from Walmart, the BCFP also receives deer meat from the Share the Harvest program from Jackman's Processing during deer season as well as canned goods from many local churches and community groups. The Leathernecks recently presented a check for \$2,500 to the BCFP to help them purchase food.

"We also do our best to use all donations to buy food locally," said Sullivan. "We recently purchased \$6,000 worth of meat from G & W Foods. All donations are used to help those right here in Benton County."

All of the people who work at the BCFP are volunteers including Sullivan and Arnold. The truck drivers who go to Columbia once a week to pick up food are volunteers as well as the workers inside the building. The expenses the BCFP incurs includes rent on the building, diesel for the truck, electricity and insurance.

"We wouldn't be able to keep our doors open without the volunteers," said Sullivan.

The BCFP truck that picks up food in Columbia once a week also picks up the Buddy Packs for school children in Benton County as well as senior citizen food boxes and veteran's boxes.

"Anyone in Benton County over 65 years of age can apply for a senior citizen food box and any veteran can apply for one of the veteran food boxes," said Sullivan.

Members of the BCFP Board include: Chuck Allcorn, Tammy Culpepper, Sherry Davis, Angie Shepard, Tara Chyi, Susan Sullivan and Jeannie Arnold. They are also volunteers.

"We don't want to shorten our hours of operation, but we are closing early because we just don't have enough food to meet the demand," said Sullivan. "We hope this early closure is temporary and we can resume normal hours when we have the food to distribute."

(Continued from Page 1) body temperature. They must seek shelter during excessive heat and extreme

Snakes have 200-400 vertebrae depending on the species which permits extreme flexibility. Some snakes climb trees and all snakes can swim. They can also strike from any position. The snake's long forked tongue is used to pick up odors.

All snakes eat other animals and are classified as carnivorous. Snakes must swallow their food whole and some can engulf animals three times the diameter of the snake's head. The lower jaw is loosely joined to the skull and the upper jaws are moveable. A snake grabs its prey by the head and engulfs it by advancing first one side of the jaw and then the other. The snake's teeth are sharp and curve toward the rear of the mouth to hold the prey and prevent escape. Some snakes such as water snakes and garter snakes eat their prey alive while venomous snakes usually inject venom into the animal and swallow it after it's dead. Several Missouri snakes such as rat snakes, king snakes, milk snakes and bullsnakes kill

by constriction.

Food habits of Missouri snakes are as varied as the types of snakes we have. Some, such as the rough green snake, eat insects and insect larva. Others, like water snakes, eat fish, frogs, tadpoles and crayfish. The black rat snakes, king snakes and bull snakes eat rodents,

small birds and their eggs. King snakes are immune to the venom of venomous snakes and will kill and consume them if given the opportunity.

Missouri, snakes normally breed in the spring soon after they emerge from winter dormancy. About half of Missouri's snakes lay eggs and the rest give birth to fully developed young. The size of the egg depends on the species and the number of eggs produced depends on the size of the female. The larger the female the more eggs she can produce. Snake eggs are elongated and have tough, leathery shells. As young develop within the egg, a small "egg tooth" grows at the tip of its snout which is used to slit the shell when hatching. Afterwards, the tooth is shed. Snakes, which retain their young until fully developed, are water snakes, garter snakes, brown snakes, copperheads, cottonmouths, and rattlesnakes. Snakes that develop within the female are normally born in mid to late summer.

All snakes shed their outer skin periodically as they grow. Young snakes usually shed every 4-5 weeks during warm weather, whereas adults may shed once every 6-8 weeks. In the case of rattlesnakes, a new segment is added at the base of the rattle at each shedding. In Missouri, rattlesnakes may shed from 2-5 times a year. As the rattle becomes longer, the old segments weaken and may break off so it is not possible to age a rattlesnake by counting the segments in the rattle.

About 8,000 people are bitten by venomous snakes each year in the United States. Fewer than five die. By comparison, about 120 people die annually from bee stings and 150 from lightning.

Snakes have a difficult time surviving, not only because of persecution but primarily because of habitat destruction (deforestation, pollution and urbanization). As with many animals whose numbers are declining, most problems associated with the plight of our native snakes result from a lack of understanding. People traditionally have been brought up to fear snakes so consequently snakes have not fared well in their relations with humanity. Psychologists have proven that Ophidiophobia, a fear of snakes, is acquired and not born within.

The smallest snake native to Missouri is the flat headed snake which averages 7-8 inches. The longest, the bullsnake, is from 50-72 inches.

As with all other wildlife, snakes are an important part of the natural food chain and play an important role in the balance of nature. Overall, snakes are a fascinating part of the natural world in which we live.

Few Missourians realize that all snakes native to our state are protected. The Wildlife Code of Missouri treats them as a non-game species and it is against the law to kill them. An exception to this rule is when a venomous snake, in close association to people, might result in someone being bitten.
