## How Sweet It Is: Vidalia Onions Are Lasting Legacy For Shriners

Every September down in Georgia, farmers start growing world-famous Vidalia sweet onions. First, onion seeds are germinated in a controlled environment, then the seedlings are planted by hand in the fields to grow over the winter. In mid-April, the onions are harvested by hand and shipped all over the country.

Last Thursday, a truckload of Vidalias arrived in Clinton where they were sold by Joel Semler, Zach Hill, Bud Eason and Ken Cox of the Golden Valley Shrine Club outside Ace Hardware.

"Rain or shine, we're selling onions," Joel said.

Every year, the Golden Valley Shrine Club orders 500 bags of Vidalia onions, Joel said. They went on sale last Friday for \$12 each. By Friday afternoon, the Shriners had sold 375 bags of onions. Usually by Sunday they have 6 or 8 bags left, Joel said, but this year, sold out by mid-afternoon Saturday.

"Every year, we get calls after the sale asking 'Do you still have any onions?'" Zach said.

The money from onion sales goes to the Ararat Temple in Kansas City, who handle the bookkeeping,

returning about 3 and half percent, \$350 to \$400, to the Clinton club.

The Golden Valley Shrine Club puts the money they make towards local projects, they said, but there's not a set charity. Last spring the club members replaced all the benches in front of the Clinton Cham-

ber of Commerce, located in the old train depot.

One year, Joel said, the club paid for tuition to send Boy Scouts to summer camp.

"It's where the need is," Zach said.

Sales of Vidalia onions also help support Shriners hospitals for children. Joel

said he used to drive the 17-passenger hospital van from Kansas City to the hospital in St. Louis, picking up children and an adult family member at pick-up points along I-70. The longest round trip he made was 12 hours.

"We picked up a lot of Amish," he said of those he

gave a ride to the St. Louis hospital.

Shriners St. Louis specializes in pediatric orthopedic surgery and research, he said, and also treats breathing problems, Joel said, recalling a passenger who Joel was afraid wouldn't make it to the hospital.

Joel also drives a mini-car as part of the Shrine Club's entry in parades.

"They are fun to drive and the kids love them," he said. "They all have horns that make different sounds."

It was a Georgia farmer in Toombs County who discovered in 1931 that the Granex sweet onions he grew were sweeter than those grown elsewhere. The Vidalia Onion

### 911 Mapping Gives Emergency Help Big Boost

Henry County, MO 911 will be launching a County-wide GIS Remediation Project to update the 911 mapping to improve 911 services throughout the county and the State of Missouri. The project is funded by grants using federal ARPA funds.

The purpose of this project is to improve the accuracy of the county map and addressing data used by emergency responders. Doing this work is a requirement of the Missouri 911 Service Board so that our local mapping data can be used to route 911 calls more accurately.

Mapping engineers from Henry County's 911 mapping contractor, SDR Inc., will begin surveying properties next week. They will be driving throughout the cities, towns and some recreational areas during daylight hours to verify locations. The 911 field vehicle will be clearly marked with white signs and "911 Mapping" in red letters.

The 911 field vehicle will stop in front of structures to observe, verify and document the posted address but will not knock on doors or conduct interviews with residents. If no address is posted or legible, the technician will mark the record for further investigation. They may leave the vehicle to verify the layout of apartment units in buildings, but will not trespass on private property.

The field work for this project is expected to be complete by the end of May, 2024.

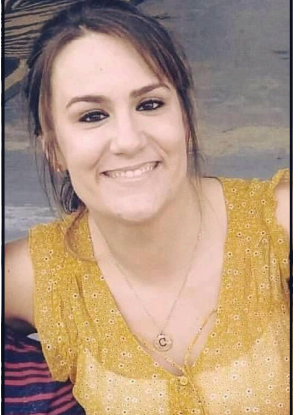

Act of 1986 trademarked the product and limited the area where it could be grown, within a 35 miles radius of Vidalia, west of Savannah.

In 1990, the Vidalia onion became the official vegetable of Georgia. The town of Vidalia, known as "The Sweet Onion City," has a Vidalia Onion Museum, a Vidalia Onion Hall of Fame, and a Vidalia Onion Festival, complete with a mascot, "Yumlon."

"Pretty much all the people around Vidalia are associated with onion growing," Joel said.

Because the harvesting is all done by hand, not by machine, there are no bruises on the onions, he said. And bags of onions are shipped soon after harvest, so don't sit around a warehouse.

"They're fresh," Bud said. Vidalia onions will last for months if stored in a cool, dry place. Zach said he stores his Vidalias in the crisper drawer in the refrigerator and they are good through Christmas. Joel said he used his last ones in February.

Pat Harrell of Clinton was one of the first customers to drive up and buy two bags of onions last Friday morning. Vidalia onions are wonderful, she said, saying she comes and gets

some every year.

"I grill them and we eat them raw," she said.

Zach and Joel, who joined the Golden Valley Shrine Club in 2012, said the Golden Valley Shrine Club has been selling Vidalia onions for 20 or more years. They didn't know how long the Shriners have been involved selling Vidalias, but noted that the growers put special labels on the onion bags that are packaged for the Shriners, he said.

Georgia farmers attribute the sweetness of the Vidalia, aka the "caviar of onions," to the low-sulfur soil and the rain-fall pattern. Vidalia onions contain 12.5 percent natural sugar, about the same as an orange, and 1.5 percent higher than an apple. In addition to a sweet, mild flavor, the Vidalia onion does not cause indigestion or bad breath.

For the 2024 season, growers in Georgia planted 11,000 acres of Vidalia onions. Each acre contains around 90,000 onion plants.

The Shrine Club also has a sweet legacy. When Joel wears his Shriner's uniform, he said, people often come to him and say "I was a Shrine kid," meaning they were treated at a Shrine Children's Hospital.

with the exception of maybe once, does Jonah ever listen to God and follow what God tells him," Marshall said.

Since moving to Clinton three months ago, Marshall has dealt with flu and the death of his grandmother. He and his family, who live in a parsonage near the church, are still settling into life in Clinton. Marshall and his spouse, Ashton, who is from Georgia, were married on St. Simon's Island by Marshall's grandfather in 2010. They have three children, ages 6, 4 and 1. Ashton has a degree in mission work from Asbury University, and has gotten connected to the home-school community and MOPS.

Marshall said he is interested in getting connected to the service community — police officers, fire fighters, ex-military, teachers and other ministers in

Clinton. He's also worked in prison ministry, and is interested in working with the local Celebrate Recovery group.

Marshall shared his path to the ministry at a career day at Lakeland Schools. Being a pastor is a 24/7 job, he said, living life alongside people he meets.

"I see behind the curtain of people's lives," he said, "so that I can participate in what Jesus wants to do in their lives."

The Clinton Church of the Nazarene family is also participating in the Door of Hope's "baby bottle" drive to provide financial support for the crisis pregnancy center, starting on Mother's Day and continuing through Father's Day.

**Roadrunners Come Up Big In Track And Field At Culver-Stockton**

The State Fair Community College (SFCC) Track and Field teams (men's and women's) competed at the Wildcat Invitational hosted by Culver-Stockton College inside Ellison Poulton Stadium in Canton on Saturday, April 20. The Roadrunners finished in the top three positions across multiple events.

On the men's team, freshman Peyton Ligon finished second in the high jump with a jump of 1.87 meters.

Freshman Isaiah Waller finished second in the discus with a throw of 49.40 meters. Waller finished third in the hammer throw with a throw of 47.56 meters. Waller finished fourth in the javelin with a throw of 44.26 meters.

The 4 x 100m relay team consisting of freshman Ross Johnson, freshman David Leon, freshman Mario Nunez and freshman Isaac Phillips finished third with a time of 45.46. Sophomore Keyton Laire finished third in the javelin with a throw of 44.29 meters.

Leon finished fourth in the 400m with a time of 51.22. Freshman Justin Horn finished

fourth in the 800m with a time of 1:59.30.

Freshman Jasper DeGraffenreid and freshman Sebastian Meyer finished tied for seventh with throws of 14.19 meters.

Nunez finished eighth in the 400m hurdles with a time of 1:01.83.

For the women's squad, sophomore Keiyah Cole won the 100m with a time of 12.68. Cole also won the 200m with a time of 26.23. Cole claimed second in the 400m with a time of 1:06.69.

Freshman Meghan Campise finished third in the high jump with a jump of 1.50 meters.

Freshman Kira Phipps finished third in the pole vault with a clearance of 2.65 meters. Phipps finished fourth in the high jump with a jump of 1.45 meters.

Sophomore Tanner Maggard placed third in the 800m with a time of 2:30.74.

Freshman Madison Johnson finished third in the 200m with a time of 27.81. Johnson also placed third in the 100m hurdles with a time of 17.05.

Freshman Molly Prichard finished fifth in the shot put with a throw of 11.04 meters. Prichard finished sixth in the discus with a throw of 34.19 meters.

"We really had a fabulous day in Canton at Culver-Stockton," said Head Coach Brad Hagedorn. "Our performances have been on par for everything we've done this year. We finally were in a competition where our performances matched up with the schools in attendance. We had several event wins and we placed high in many events. Our throwers really had stand-out performances as most all the kids had personal bests in their events. We look forward to wrapping up the regular season next Friday at Grand View in Des Moines."

To improve his language skills, Marshall starts each day reading a verse from Corinthians in Greek, he said, then translating it into English, followed by a prayer time and reading scriptures.

Marshall had always been aware of God speaking to him, but didn't always listen. The grandson of a Church of God minister, Marshall was six years old and sitting at the dinner table when he accepted Jesus Christ into his life. Both he and his mother, who was doing the dishes, felt the presence of Jesus in the room, he said. The family lived on a soybean farm in Louisiana until Marshall was 6, then moved to Natchez, Mississippi, where he remembers riding his bicycle on the nearby Natchez Trace before it was developed into a parkway.

When Marshall was 15 or 16, he was attending a Baptist convention on the Gulf Coast when God called him to the ministry.

Knowing of the call, his minister put Marshall in the pulpit a few times to preach, he said, but it wasn't a success. Marshall's thoughts: "I'm bad at this, and the call must have been a mistake."

A fan of LSU baseball and football, Marshall started college there, and thinking he wasn't cut out to be a preacher, bargained with God.

"I told God that I would be an excellent lay person, become a doctor and a strong supporter of the church," Marshall said. "I wasn't living in His will, but living in my will."

Knowing that he wasn't what God wanted him to be, Marshall made a course correction in his life. He has been a pastor for 20 years, and has served in five other churches, including seven years in Gloucester, Mississippi, and in Ocean Springs.

He didn't know much about the Nazarene Church, but learned that is part of the Wesleyan-Arminian theology, Marshall said, which includes Methodist and Assembly of God churches.

"Nazarenes are the spiritual great-grandchildren of John Wesley," Marshall said.

It was on an impulse, he said, that he attended a General Assembly of the Nazarene Church in Indianapolis, where a door literally opened for Marshall to come to Clinton.

"I was walking in a door and the district superintendent for this area was walking out of the door," Marshall said. "A friend introduced us."

The D.S. offered him several churches, but Marshall knew which one he was supposed to accept.

"God would not let me get away from Clinton," Marshall said.

Marshall has been corresponding with a former member about its history about the history of the church, which shares a corner with Henry Elementary and was probably built before it. He does know the church was started in 1945, so next year there will be an 80th anniversary party. The sanctuary was added about 40 years ago, Marshall said, but you can tell from the way the lights down the sides of the wall of a side room lead to the east wall that it was used for services.

The current sanctuary has arched windows with stained-glass panels suspended over them, with a video screen in front displaying the words of the hymns. Marshall starts the Sunday morning service with an informal time of sharing at 10:30 a.m., followed by the service around 11 a.m. He's preaching on the book of Jonah.

school year faculty and staff review their safety plan and practice this plan.

The beginning of this year was no different but the Diocese felt it was time for each school to have an on-site facility risk assessment, expert witness services, and intruder response training to equip schools with the knowledge and strategies needed to keep kids and faculty safe.

Strategos International provided Holy Rosary School with suggestions and strategies to help improve upon what Holy Rosary School already had in place. This helped train the faculty and staff specifically to their site and the unique challenges at their school.

This School Safety Grant has provided video surveillance systems inside and outside the school and protective laminate for windows and doors. There were additional updates to their building too.

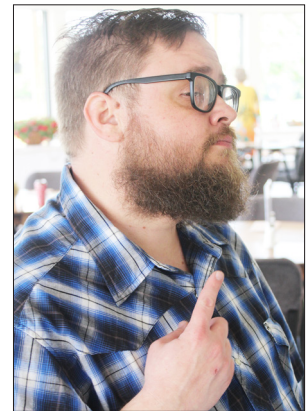

**The Shepherd Calls**

**DISCOURAGEMENT**

The word "discouraged" does not appear in the Old Testament account of Gideon, the fifth judge of Israel (Judges 6:1-8:28). However, Gideon must have been discouraged. The neighboring people---the Midianites---raided their crops and possessions systematically. If an Israelite managed to grow anything to eat, he had to hide it from the pillaging neighbors. Gideon was threshing wheat at a winepress to hide it from the lazy, thieving enemies. His family and other Israelite households were living in caves fearing for their lives and the lives of their children. Suddenly, quietly an angel appeared and spoke to Gideon. The angel said, "Gideon, mighty warrior, the Lord is with you." "Please sir," Gideon replied, "I am not a mighty warrior. If the Lord is with us, why are we in all this mess? Our fathers tell us the Lord delivered us from Egyptian slavery, but it seems He has abandoned us now to die in this God-forsaken desert." "Not so," the angel replied, "God is planning for you to deliver your people." "Like I told you, I am not a mighty warrior. My tribe is the least of all the tribes, and I am the youngest in our family. I am the least of the least . . ." Perhaps you are familiar with the rest of this story. In response to Gideon's call to arms, thousands of men answered. "Hey, that's pretty good," God said, "But it's too many." "Too many? Lord, have you counted the Midianites?" Before God was through, the army was reduced to three hundred soldiers armed with kitchen equipment and musical instruments. And just in case you do not know the rest of the story, Gideon and his tiny army chased their neighborhood troubles away. If you are presently discouraged, you may think, "That story is thousands of years old and from the Old Testament no less." It is common for the discouraged to resist rescue by saying, "My problem has no answer. I am sure the worst is going to happen." Experience teaches us the worst seldom happens. And with God's help, what we assumed would be the worst possible happening often re-

sults in good. Oh, there is one thing in the story I did not mention. God told Gideon, "I will go with you."
