A Fragile Existence: A Homeless Man's Journey In Benton County

Vernon Harris's story is a stark reminder of the homelessness crisis right in our backyard. Originally from Iowa, Vernon came to Warsaw, hoping to find solace and support among relatives. Instead, he finds himself living in his car, emblematic of the many who are unhoused in our community. His daily reality was highlighted when, during our conversation, a local business owner requested he leave the property.

The narrative of homelessness is deeply intertwined with the search for stability and dignity amidst adversity. It's a story of resilience in the face of societal, economic, and personal challenges. The uncertainty of meeting basic needs like shelter, food, and safety, coupled with the stigma and isolation that often accompany homelessness, underscores the struggle. Despite these hardships, there's a palpable sense of hope and community support, showcasing the resilience of the human spirit.

Homelessness extends beyond the lack of physical shelter; it's a daily fight for dignity, safety, and stability. Imagine the relentless uncertainty of not knowing

where you'll sleep each night, the challenge of securing your next meal, and the quest for basic hygiene facilities. This condition often leads to feelings of isolation and despair, exacerbated by societal judgment and the hurdles in accessing essential services.

Moreover, the journey out of homelessness is

laden with obstacles. The challenge of finding employment without a permanent address or clean clothes for interviews is daunting. Health issues, both physical and mental, can worsen without proper care, perpetuating a cycle that's hard to escape.

Yet, amid struggle, there's an often-overlooked

resilience and community spirit. Shelters, soup kitchens, and outreach programs stand as beacons of hope, offering not just necessities but a sense of belonging and support. The path out of homelessness is arduous, but with the right support and resources, individuals can begin to rebuild their lives, one step

at a time.

The shift from labeling individuals as "homeless" to "unhoused" signifies a move towards more respectful and accurate language that recognizes the dignity of those without stable shelter. "Unhoused" points to housing instability as a temporary condition, not a defining characteristic, and **HOMELESS Page 3**

City Of Lincoln Receives Clean Audit For 2023

In new business Monday eve, KPM-CPA Auditor Mary Brune reported that the city had received a clean 2023 financial audit, while noting that its major revenue sources were up and, "doing very well." She issued a standard warning to city officials that they should be careful to maintain segregation of duties as much as possible, noting that most smaller cities cannot afford to hire the numbers of employees to assure complete financial security.

The meeting opened at 6:00 PM on May 13, with Aldermen Jack Lietzke, Phil Fisher, Seth Casey present. Alderman Barbara Hammond was absent. Alderman Fisher served as Mayor pro-tem in Mayor Glen Nelson's absence; Clerk Sabrina Brown recorded.

First action by the group was to issue a recognition of service award to recently retired Alderman Janice Sweamgin, who reported she had served on that Board for 12 years, and "had fun doing it."

(Continued from Page 1) highlights systemic issues rather than personal failings. This change in terminology is part of a broader effort to humanize and destigmatize the experiences of those living without stable shelter, fostering a more empathetic and solution-focused approach.

The debate around giving money directly to the unhoused is complex, with valid arguments on both sides. While it can offer immediate relief for basic needs, there are concerns about its long-term effectiveness and use. A holistic approach, combining immediate support with access to services that tackle underlying issues, may provide a more sustainable solution.

Benton County offers numerous resources for the unhoused community. For those looking to help or in need of assistance, a visit to pick up a list of resources is a step towards making a difference.

(Continued from Page 1) year, didn't have as big of a slowdown in the winter as we expected, and are excited about the upcoming spring, summer and years to come," said Brian.

The couple got the idea for the coffee shop from a cousin's daughter of Susan's who created the original shop in El Dorado Springs, followed by Susan's daughter who opened another of the same type of shop. The Templetons were trying to decide on a business they could start where they could work when they retire from their current professions. Susan is a local realtor, and Brian is in construction building apartment complexes in the Kansas City area. They said that they felt there was a need for their type of business in the Warsaw/lake area.

"We took a lot of time to locate a piece of property that we thought would be successful," said Brian. "Once acquired we had to build the shop with a convenient drive through off Commercial Street."

Susan said that her husband hand-drew plans, did all construction and figured the different stations inside the shop. She said that he did all the leg work.

Popular items at The Fix Coffee include iced and hot coffees, Lattes, Frappuccino's, and loaded teas that are flavored and contain plant energy with natural caffeine. Different colors and flavors are added to the fruity drinks. BOBA bubbles can be added to any loaded tea. They also have smoothies and protein shakes, mini-donuts and have recently introduced Acai Bowls - which are

described as a kind of sorbet.

The Templetons have a staff of about 12 including Manager Mark Reimund. They hire Christian college and high school students to give them a learning experience as a first job. The couple said they get compliments daily about the "friendly, amazing" staff who show their happiness at their jobs.

"We are typically only at The Fix Coffee on weekends, and Manager Reimund keeps it all together," said Susan. "He gets fresh dairy and produce each day. The shop is so much fun that we can't wait until the weekend when we can be there. The Templetons are members of the Warsaw Chamber of Commerce and support its activities. The couple also financially support local school activities with gift cards and t-shirts, and also support church related fundraisers. The shop delivers in the local area, and has recently purchased a coffee trailer to use for attending events and functions outside of business.

Susan has lived in Benton County her entire life and graduated from Lincoln High School. Her son graduated from Warsaw High School. Brian is from Lee Summit near Kansas City.

There was no old business discussed, so the group moved into reports from department heads. starting with Police Chief Jason Wenberg, who reported his department had received 9 reports and made 8 traffic stops in April. He added that his department was looking for a grant, following an accident of one of his unit's patrol cars. Public Works Director Josh Cole said his department has been doing lots of mowing and installing water meters. He added PW also had to repair a lift station with problems related to recent rains. Clerk Brown reported that 1st quarter revenues were up, adding that she will be on vacation during the city's June meeting.

Also in new business, the group approved a \$3,746 county Economic Development contract; passed a \$343.20 resolution of continued membership in the Kaysinger Basin Regional Planning Commission, appointing Mayor Nelson as representative to KBRPC;

heard Alderman Casey present a storm grant inquiry; and repealed an ordinance concerning a sales tax measure benefitting the city's police department, and will rewrite an ordinance which better reflects the measure as more recently approved by voters.

The meeting closed at about 6:45 PM. These meetings are usually held on 2nd Monday eves; the public is welcomed.

The fourth year of the Warsaw Outdoor Expo will be held Saturday, May 18 at Drake Harbor, from 9:00 AM to 10:00 PM, and a lot of new things are taking place. It is a one-day instead of two-day event, and entry is free. It is a replacement for the previously known Lake Life Outdoor Adventure Expo.

"We made entry free because we would like our visitors to spend their money with our vendors, and our local businesses while they are in the area for the event," said Megan Petersen, Executive Director of the Warsaw Chamber of Commerce. "There are more vendors this year with over 30 already signed up. In previous years there has been live music at the event, but this is the first time we are doing a concert style. We are very excited that we were able to book a very popular band with a great following - Dirt Road Addiction. The concert starts at 7:00 PM and is also free. The food vendors and beer and wine garden (hosted by Warsaw Leathernecks) will remain open during the concert."



The contact person for Warsaw Leathernecks, Eric Kirby, said that they will have many drinks but have decided not to serve wine. They will have Budweiser, Bud Light, Michelob Ultra, Busch Light and a new Carbliss drink with zero carbs, Gluten Free, zero sugar and is 100 calories. There will also be Nutril products which are like Carbliss. Shots will also be available to mix with sodas - a good variety.

"We also plan a 50/50 raffle at the beer garden to help raise funds for the new playground," said Kirby. "We recently raised about \$750 from our fish

fry and will try to raise that amount to \$1,000 for the playground.)

Petersen said that food vendors will include a B&B Concession that serves burgers, hot dogs, loaded nachos, pulled pork sandwiches, chips and drinks; Ice Ice Crazy for Sno-cones, Hibachi Ice Cream, Mozark Mocha Fine Coffee & More, and another food truck called Blowin' Smoke BBQ. There will also be fishing, boating, hunting, RV vendors and more.

Kids will have fun with a bounce house and petting zoo. The Chamber contracted with Animals for Thorny Ridge Exotic for the petting zoo. The business plans to bring a camel, water buffalo, kangaroo, American alligator, Jacob sheep, fainting goats, an African antelope, a mini-zebra and more.

A Kayak Race (two-mile paddle race) will take place at 10:00 AM from Truman Dam to Drake Harbor. Entrants must bring their own vessel and there is a \$30 entry fee that includes a t-shirt or a \$25 entry fee without a t-shirt. Entries made after May 13 need to pay an extra \$10.

Another activity is Archery Tag which is a mix between dodge ball and archery. According to Petersen, "you shoot your opponent/target with nerf/rubber arrows. If they are hit, they are out! It is a kid friendly game that the whole family can enjoy."

Petersen stepped into her new position on February 19, when the Chamber had 263 members. She has been busy working on the Warsaw Outdoor Expo and has been putting committees together for different events, budget, and Academic Excellence. She has also been bridging the Chamber's relationship with the Benton County Economic Development as well as the Benton County Missouri Tourism and Recreation to make it stronger.

Thinking about the oncoming tomato season, the following recipe for tomatoes stuffed with yellow grits comes to mind. In this rendition I use the quick yellow grits which have a coarser texture and are brighter yellow than cornmeal. This is best made in full summer when tomatoes are ripe, flavorful and inexpensive. The grits mixture can be served on its own, too, as a cushion under a piece of grilled fish or sauteed meat.

½ cup quick yellow grits
4 large, firm tomatoes
3 tablespoons olive oil
6 scallions, cut into ½ inch pieces
1 cup chopped onion
2 cloves garlic, minced
½ pound mushrooms, (2 cups) chopped

Preheat oven to 350 degrees
Prepare grits and salt according to package directions, spread and cool on plate until lukewarm. Hollow out tomatoes, (save cap) chop insides, add 1 tablespoon olive oil, salt and pepper. This is the sauce.
Heat 2 tablespoon olive oil, briefly sauté onions and scallions, add garlic, mushrooms, salt. Cook for about 5 minutes longer or until most of the juices have evaporated, stir in the grits. Fill the tomatoes, top with the cap. Place in baking dish, pour the sauce around them, bake for 40 minutes. I cool these to lukewarm before serving.

Warsaw Track & Field Sends 4 To MSHSAA State Championships

A beautiful day greeted participants at the Class 3 Sectional 4 track meet in Holden on Saturday, and that day got even better when the Wildcats qualified 4 athletes for the 2024 MSHSAA State Track Championships to be held this Friday and Saturday in Jefferson City.

Nate Banfield advanced to the state competition in the Javelin after throwing for a distance of 42.54m, a distance good enough for a

second place finish.

He wasn't the only qualifier in the event though as Dylan Elmer also qualified for the next round with a fourth place finish after throwing a distance of 40.82m.

In the 400m, Kaleb Ragle moved on to state with a fourth place finish after running a 52.38, also setting a new school record along the way.

Fisher Love qualified for the 2024 championships in two different events when he used an 11.20 to finish fourth in the 100m and then leapt 6.38m in the long jump for another qualifying fourth place finish.

Incidentally, Love fell just

short of qualifying in three events when his 12.44m leap left him just outside the top 4 in the triple jump.

Though they did not qualify for the state championships this weekend, the 4x400m Relay team comprised of Ragle, Banfield, Noah Siebert and Mason Anderson finished sixth, but set a new school record with a 3:34.49, breaking the previous record set in 2021.

On the girl's side, Warsaw's Naomi Yoder came up just short when she ran a 60.94 in the 400m, good enough for a 5th place finish. However, Yoder's mark broke the prior school record held by Andrea Kiser since 2008.

Garrett Ferguson, Hubert and Watson all had 2 hits for the Wildcats.

Ferguson took the loss on the mound.

Fair Grove used a 7-run third inning to help lead them to a 13-0 shutout of the Wildcats on Thursday night. The Eagles plated 2 more runs in the fourth and 4 in the sixth to round out their scoring onslaught.

Warsaw drew 6 free passes in the contest but could never exploit those as they came up with just 2 hits, 1 each off the bats of Kendall Bagley and Logan Gemes, over 6 innings.

Josh Bunch absorbed the mound loss.

Despite their lackluster finish to the regular season, the Wildcats still managed to take the number one seed in the Class 3 District 13 tournament. They are slated to take on the winner of the (4) Eldorado Springs and (5) Stover game from Monday night. That contest is scheduled for 4:00 PM on Wednesday, May 16.

That tournament is being played in Versailles.

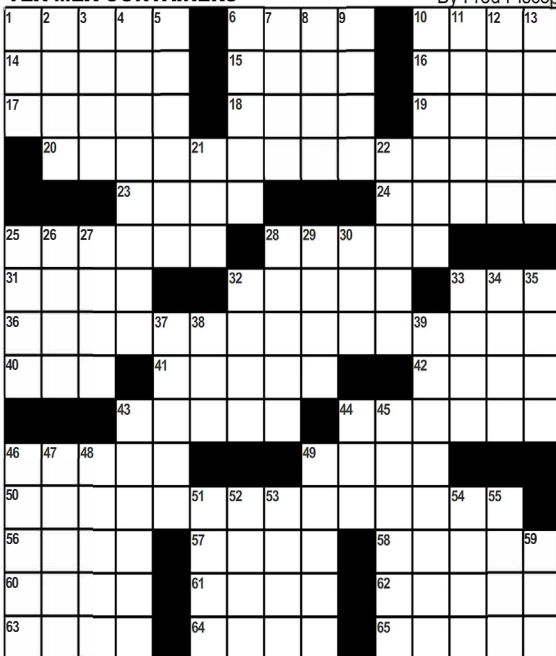

She is preceded in death by her parents, a son Richard Baldwin, three sisters and one brother.

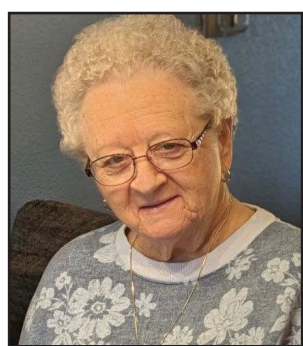

When you're creating your estate plan, your biggest priority may be taking care of your family — your spouse, grown children, grandchildren, and other loved ones. And as you think of where you want your assets to go, you also may be thinking about how to be fair — but is that the same as treating everyone equally?

In estate planning, "equal" doesn't always mean "fair." Let's consider some factors that can help explain the difference:

Need — It's highly unlikely that the individuals you want to include in your estate plan — especially your adult children — have the same family and financial situations. For example, you could have one child who is extremely successful and has no children of their own, while another child earns much less income and supports three children. Clearly, your two adult children have vastly different financial needs — so, you need to consider whether you want to treat them equally or fairly. If you decide you want to treat them fairly, you may want to divide your assets in a way that provides more help to the child who needs it most.

Abilities — You may well have some assets that you believe are more suitable for one child over another. This can be especially true if you are planning on passing on a family business. If you know that one child is the most capable of running the business or has been primarily involved in the business, then you may want to give that child control as a next-generation owner. Yet, this may not seem fair to another child, who might also express interest in the business, so you may want to look for ways to provide this child with enough assets to help make the overall inheritance more equal.

Practicality — In some instances, you might think you can meet both the "fair" and "equal" criteria. Suppose, for instance, that you have a cabin or other vacation home that you think two of your children could share. In theory, this

joint ownership might sound good, but in practical terms, it could cause problems. Are both children equally willing and capable of paying taxes and upkeep on the cabin or vacation home? What if one child wants to sell their share? And then, there's the question of who gets to use the property at various times of the year. All these issues should be resolvable, but they can also cause great stress within the family.

There's no simple formula for solving the fair-versus-equal dilemma. But keep this in mind: Communicating your wishes to your loved ones while you are drawing up your estate plan can help reduce confusion — and hopefully lead to fewer hard feelings — when you are no longer around. By their nature, fairness and equality issues related to estate plans can trigger a range of emotions, and addressing these feelings beforehand can help provide a great service for your loved ones.

You might also find that some objectivity can be valuable. That's why, when creating your estate plan, you may benefit by working with a team of professionals, including your legal, financial and tax advisors.

When developing your estate plan, you might well strive for equality and fairness but above all, you want to get things right. And careful planning, open communication and appropriate guidance can help go a long way toward this goal.

MDC Adds New Fish Habitat At Truman Lake



Sunken brush piles help fish and anglers

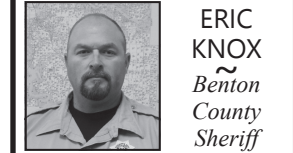
The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) recently boosted fish habitat at Truman Lake. MDC staff cut red cedar trees, tied them into brush piles, added weights and sank them off shore near the Fairfield boat ramp on the Pomme de Terre arm of the lake.

"Cedar trees provide cover for fish and are good places for anglers to catch fish, especially crappie," said Chris Brooke, MDC fisheries biologist.

MDC has added brush piles to large reservoirs throughout Missouri to boost fish habitat. The brush piles provide havens from predators for young fish. They also attract bait fish, which attracts sport fish like largemouth bass and crappie that anglers enjoy catching. To assist anglers, staff will be adding the GPS locations of the new brush piles to lists for all lakes that are available at MDC's Where to Fish webpage or via MDC's MO Fishing app at <http://short.mdc.mo.gov/ZJZ>.
