Stay Cool Benton County! City Pools Open For Season

Warsaw Municipal Pool opened on May 25 and will officially close after an End-of-Summer special offering \$2 admission on September 2 and 3. Cole Camp Swimming Pool opened on June 2 and expects to close sometime in August to allow employees who are teachers to return to school. Both pools have plenty of summer fun for swimmers and those who want to learn to swim.

Warsaw Municipal Pool has a new manager, Cheyanne Beard. She is a second-grade teacher in Lincoln during the school year who is also certified to teach Special Education. She hopes to spend future summers managing the pool.

Open swim hours will take place at the Warsaw pool on Sunday from 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM and from 12:00 PM to 7:00 PM on Tuesday through Saturday. The pool will be closed on Monday's. Daily admittance is \$4.50 during the day and \$2.25 after 5:00 PM. The pool's Facebook page also lists purchase prices for punch cards and passes.

Aerobics are held Tuesday through Friday from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM, Saturday

from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM and Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM. Summer Aerobic Passes are \$80, or \$3.50 per session. Pool parties are available on Friday's and Saturday's from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM and Sunday's from 5:00 PM to 6:30 PM or 6:30 PM to 8:00 PM.

Thirty-minute swimming lessons are available for \$15 each. Three thirty-minute lessons are available for \$40.

The levels are Minnow, Fish, Dolphin and Shark. Lessons are held on Saturday mornings from 10:00 AM until noon, and Wednesday evenings from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM.

Pool Manager Beard moved to the area about three years ago with her fiancé Chance Johnson whom she plans to marry on May 25, 2025. She says she wouldn't have been able to get the pool up and

running this summer without her assistant manager, lifeguards and City Hall.

Swimming lessons led by head lifeguard Laney Arnett are available for beginners up to advanced swimmers. For each level of swimming lessons an age group is recommended as follows: Preschool – ages 3-4; Level 1 Beginner – ages 4-6; Level 2 – ages 5-7; Level 3 – ages 5-10; Level 4 – ages 8-10; and Level 5 – ages 9-11.

Cost is \$40 for members and \$60 for non-members. (See the Cole Camp Swimming Pool Facebook page for dates of sessions through July 26.)

The Warsaw Board of Aldermen convened with a full quorum on June 17 at 6:00 PM in the Community Building's lower level for a regular meeting, Mayor Eddie Simons called the meeting to order and opened with a moment of silence for esteemed reporter of the *Benton County Enterprise*, Homer May, who passed away in the past week and had been a dedicated chronicler of council activities since 1999.

City Clerk Jessica Kendall recorded the evening's session.

After approval of previous meeting's minutes, a consent agenda and bills presented, new Warsaw Area Chamber of Commerce President Tracy Amos introduced herself, sharing her vision for the entity and contact information.

City Administrator Randy Pogue updated the group on recent Playground FUNdraising efforts with an upcoming golf tournament on July 13 as the next event.

Ordinances were presented and all approved for 1) Design-Build project delivery method, a key piece in the progressive advancement of the \$25M RAISE Grant, 2) A reimbursement policy for those city employees who become Medicare eligible,

When Summer Begins, School Meals End-Salvation Army Brings In Help

The local Salvation Army took over the summer feeding of kids in 2022 when a U.S. Department of Agriculture program was defunded for drive-through pick up and it limited access to meals at centralized sites. The community is helping, and meals are expected to be served to 450 to 530 kids within the first two weeks of this summer's program. Meals were to begin being distributed by June 13.

"We have the community stepping in to help and we are selling bracelets, using grants and donations to help fund the food for kids," said Terri Watson, local Salvation Chairperson. "It is unrealistic to have parents come to one location

(centralized site) when Benton County is so spread out. Some of the families would have to choose whether to use gas for going to work or for picking up meals. We have about 30 ladies who help put meals together.

There is also help from the Ministerial Alliance, other organizations, and neighborhoods. Cars from churches around the county pick up meals and deliver them to neighborhoods in their area. There is one

couple who picks up for their own neighborhood and some recipients of meals drop by the Salvation Army office."

Watson said that pickup for the food is once a week from 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM. Food is "kid friendly" and easy to microwave. Meals include three breakfasts and five lunches of fresh vegetables, milk, individually wrapped meals, cereals and snacks. There are fruits, pizzas, corn dogs, hot dogs and burritos. Fresh foods are ordered each week for the meals.

"Some of the communities in the county that we serve are two in Lincoln, Honeybear, Cole Camp, Edwards, Fristoe, Warsaw, Lincoln, Central heights and smaller subdivisions," said Watson. "Some of the volunteers helping with feeding the kids this summer are Tracy Lambeth Barton, Cheryl Elliott, Kathryn

Veteran Enterprise Reporter Homer May Dead At Age 90

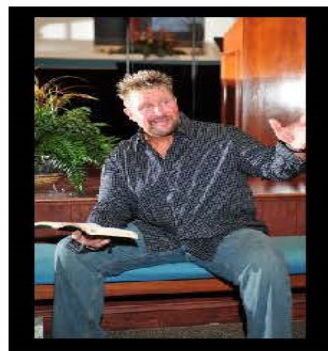

Baked Caesar Chicken
(three ingredients)

Store bought salad dressing is a quick and easy flavor booster to boneless, skinless chicken breasts. I often use Italian dressing but Caesar dressing, packed with garlicky, lemony, cheesy flavor, is the perfect match for mild-mannered chicken breast — and you can even skip the step of marinating. Simply coat the chicken with a cup of dressing, send

it to the oven, and the flavors will infuse into the meat and season it as it bakes. Since there's plenty of salt and pepper in the dressing, you don't need to season the chicken with any extra.

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts (about 2 pounds total)
- 1 cup creamy Caesar dressing
- 2 ounces Parmesan cheese, finely grated (about 1/2 cup)
- 2 tablespoons coarsely chopped fresh parsley leaves (optional)

Arrange a rack in the middle of the oven and heat the oven to 400°F.

Pound 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts one at a time: Place 1 chicken breast in a gallon-sized zip-top bag and pound with a rolling pin or the flat side of a meat mallet to an even 1/2-inch

thickness. Set aside and repeat with the remaining breasts.

Pour 1 cup creamy Caesar dressing in a baking dish large enough to fit the chicken in a single layer. Place the chicken breasts in the baking dish, then flip them so that they are evenly coated with dressing.

Bake until the chicken is golden-brown, cooked through, and registers 165°F on an instant-read thermometer, 20 to 25 minutes. Just before chicken is done, remove from oven, sprinkle cheese on top, put back in oven and let melt. Serve the chicken garnished with the parsley if using.

Terri Watson was in the Salvation Army in Kansas for 10 years before moving to Benton County. She took a hiatus before beginning her local work four years ago.

"We are one of the first Salvation Army locations to have an office and we have now moved to another location at 1872 Commercial Street," said Watson. "The old space was just one room. We now have offices, windows, a conference room and room for volunteers. It is also safer. We share with other agencies to meet the needs of all families. Last year we saw over 600 families helping them to do things like reading mail, filling out papers, helping them understand things, getting them stamps and providing gas for them to get to their first week of work."

(Continued from Page 1) retrospective interview to BCE Reporter Johnie J. Logue. It runs below in its entirety from the July 20, 2023 edition.

Benton County Enterprise Reporter Homer May turned 90 on Monday, July 17, 2023. He started writing for the *Enterprise* in 1999.

Homer, who is always quick with a witty comment said, "A major difference between a criminal investigator and a reporter is that I don't now carry a pistol and most of the people I talk with are not likely to end up in jail."

In his 24 years of practicing his craft, he has earned the respect of the Benton County community and his fellow BCE employees.

He moved to rural Warsaw in late 1985, and helped organize Warsaw Area Resource Ministry (WARM House).

May is a decorated Korea War Air Force veteran and his sixth sense once saved his aircraft.

Born in Tampa, Florida in 1933, he lived with his parents at several locations in Tampa from birth until high school. May graduated high school in about May 1951 at Florida Military Academy in St. Petersburg, FL. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in June 1951. He was an aerial gunner in Korea on a B-26 light bomber and flew 50 missions in 1952 and 1953, while stationed at Pusan Air Base.

May commented, "My pilot, a WWII retreat, said once that if I ever got a bad feeling during one of our

missions, I should let him know. On one night mission, we had been flying along on one course for perhaps 10 minutes. I got that 'bad feeling' and told him so. He responded by flipping our left wing up as we left our course, and an anti-aircraft round exploded where our left wing would have been if we had maintained our previous course. Didn't happen again."

May received the Distinguished Flying Cross and a few other medals during that period. He was discharged from the Air Force at MacDill AFB, in Tampa on June 14, 1955, and was close enough to his residence to take a taxi home. He obtained about 2 years of college education at that last base through night studies.

May went on to say, "I transferred those credits to Florida Southern College, Lakeland, and graduated from that college about March 1957 with a major in Social Sciences and a minor in English. I moved to Boston, MA immediately thereafter and began working at National Shawmut Bank within a month or so, as a credit investigator. I left that employment in early 1959 and returned to Tampa, where I worked for a few months as a social worker.; Furthermore, he said, "I moved from Tampa to Panama City, FL, in late 1959, and married Audrey LeTourneur at year end. We had three children. The earliest was Hugh Douglas May, born in 1960 with a breathing problem. He lived only a few days. The second was Maren Louise May born April 3, 1961. The last was Kathryn Phyllis May, born December 10, 1965.

I was employed in Panama City as a management analyst for the Navy Mine Defense Laboratory from late 1959 to about 1962, when I began training for the U.S. Border Patrol as a law enforcement agent stationed in Harlingen, TX, serving for several years in that capacity until being promoted to a management position in its Washington, D.C. office for a year or so, until I discovered that once I had worked in law enforcement, I was thereafter unsuited for any honest work."

In approximately 1967, May returned to law enforcement as a Criminal Investigator with the U.S. Department of Agriculture in Kansas City, MO.

In early 1975, he was divorced by Audrey May, and on October 10 that year, married Sharon S. Kinsley.

May was later transferred to another office in Denver, CO and lastly promoted to a one-person office in Des Moines, IA, from which he retired in June 1985.

May and his wife, Sharon had one daughter, Netanya Sue, who was born on June 26, 1985, and is now married to Jason Dart.

Congratulations, on your long life and dedication to the community, Homer! Stay safe ol' buddy!

and 3) An agreement by and between the City of Warsaw and Missouri DNR for mandatory water system lead testing, a project that must be completed by October 2024.

Mayor Simons appointed council members to the following positions:

- Parks and Recreation: Coskey, Slavens

City Administrator Pogue then notified the council of a \$25,000 KBRPC Recycle Grant that has been approved and will be applied to the new playground expansion. He also provided a 2024 sales tax report exhibiting a 10.97% increase in the city's revenue over this same time last year.

Pogue followed with many project updates around the city, including 1) Apron expansion at the Warsaw Municipal Airport, 2) TAP project on the east end of Main Street, particularly on the north side, 3) Polk and Commercial Streets and easements at Walmart and Hawthorn Bank, 4) Parking and a new, relocated restroom located on Drake Harbor, 5) RAISE Grant, which is "moving right along" according to Pogue, 6) a Lay Park Master Plan with RFQ's due by July 1, 7) a wastewater treatment study update, 8) lead inventory update, which was covered earlier in the meeting, and 9) an update from the USACE with notification to the council that Jim Sandberg will be retiring and will be replaced as the Project Manager by Rich Chiles, with an introductory meeting set for July 10.

The meeting covered a broad range of topics, from infrastructure projects and financial health to community development initiatives. The council's dedication to improving Warsaw's public services and facilities was evident throughout many discussions.

The session was completed within 30 minutes, followed by a closed executive session.

Open sessions are regularly held on the first and third Monday evenings of each month at 6:00 PM. Visitors are always welcome.

This reporter believes Bug could become an outstanding running back for the Lincoln Cardinals. His shoulder needs to heal and he needs to return to practices under the supervision of running back assistant Coach Connor Spunaugle.

Asked about his summer, Bug replied, "I will be working and doing sports this summer and be in the gym on my own time."

He went on to say, "I am healthy, I just have my shoulder that needs to finish healing."

"I will be playing golf, basketball and maybe football depending on how my shoulder feels," he added. "Just canoing, no big vacations, because I need to get better at basketball."

Sanders, labeled as the next

"big thing" by some, got hurt dunking a basketball in gym class and later was bitten by a horse.

Sanders commented on his summer by saying, "I am playing a lot of baseball, working, summer weights program and summer basketball and football stuff."

Sanders made sure to emphasize that he is also "completely healthy".

His summer will be consumed by playing baseball, basketball and football, in preparation of upcoming season.

He shared his story.

But the pain didn't go away. "By Tuesday, I felt a little better and went to the first weights and agility of the summer. I did fine until the last drill and my injury returned," he said. "I tore my meniscus, had surgery, and now my summer plans are 3 months of recovery and rehab."

"I was set to attend multiple football camps also, including one at Quincy University where Devon punts. I went last summer and was excited to go back," he said.

He added, "I'm thankful I had already attended three football camps before the injury; one was a blue and gray combine and I got 1st in the 40 yard dash. There were over 50 juniors and seniors there and I received a 3 star rating."

"My plans are to come back stronger then before. I plan to work hard to get back in time for most of football."

Parrott isn't about to let his most recent injury derail his summer plans.

"As for vacation, we are headed to Texas and we are making several stops, but the most important one to me is watching the Padres play the Texas Rangers," he said. "I am also looking forward to going to NASA in Houston and Galveston Beach."

There are other talented athletes in this junior class well worth mentioning. Laid back Ben Eckhoff is the Cardinals' hope in basketball. The 6'4" center needs improvement in the paint to be a real force, but he is getting there.

If Lincoln can find a point guard then big things could happen this coming season.

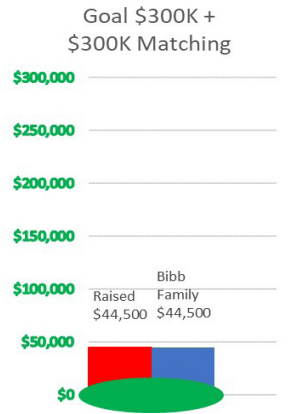

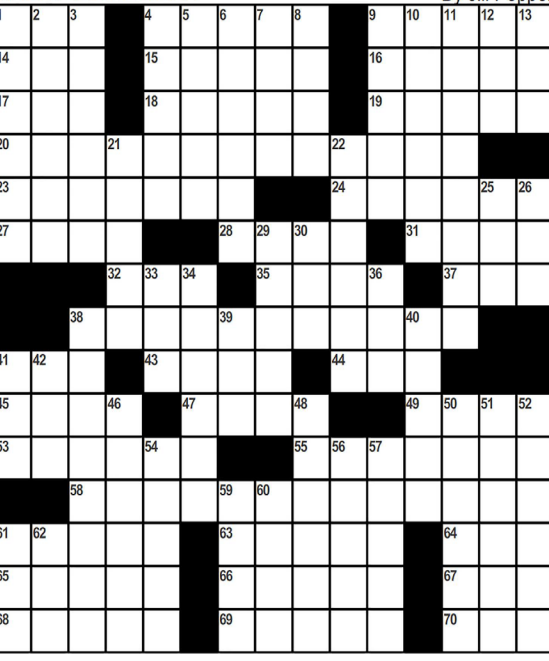

to Missouri.

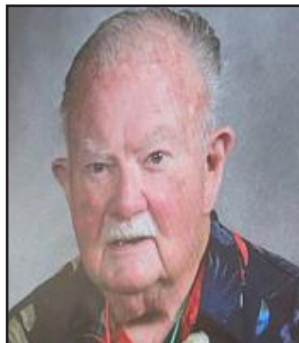

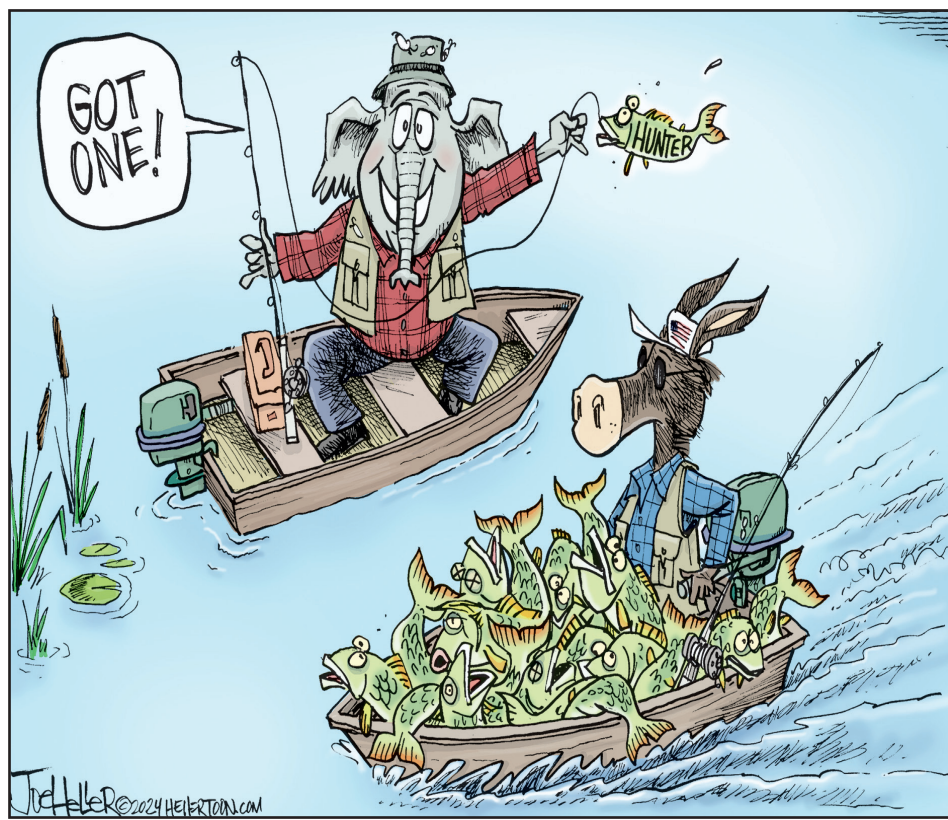

This behind-the-scenes odyssey reveals the countless organizations and volunteers who pour their souls into the event, too numerous to name but deserving of immense gratitude.

Being Chuck's temporary

assistant and right-hand (wo)man during the festival is an experience filled with moments of joy, teamwork, and community spirit. Witnessing the collective effort to keep the festival grounds clean, assist attendees, and ensure everything runs smoothly is a testament to the unity and strength of Warsaw's residents. From the golf cart brigade ferrying people to and from the harbor to the camaraderie shared among all involved, Jubilee Days is more than a festival; it's a celebration of community, dedication, and the enduring spirit of Warsaw.

As we look back on the 57th Jubilee Days, it's clear that this event is not just a highlight on the calendar but a pivotal moment that brings together the best of Warsaw. 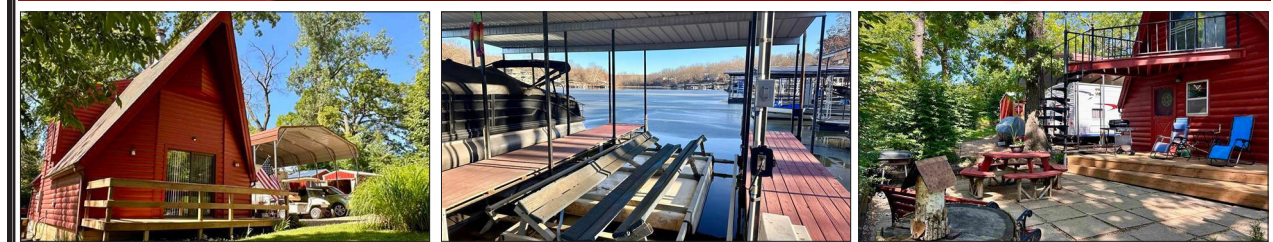


