These seminars are competitive to attend and a student must be academically outstanding, have athletic honors and participate in extracurricular activities.

Summer seminars are taken by prospective cadets looking to apply to the highly prestigious military

This quick and easy brownie cookie recipe is great for beginning bakers as well as busy ones. Just 3 ingredients (four if you add chips or chunks)

- 1 (18 oz.) box brownie mix, I prefer Ghirardelli
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- 1 large egg, well beaten

1 cup chocolate chips or chunks (optional)

In a large mixing bowl, combine the brownie mix, oil, and egg. The batter will be very thick. Fold in the chocolate chips or chunks now, if desired. Set the batter aside for about 15 minutes to allow the dry ingredients to hydrate while the oven preheats.

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Line a baking sheet or two with parchment paper or a silicone baking mat. Use a medium cookie scoop to portion out the batter into 1.5-tablespoon balls onto the prepared baking sheets. The cookies will spread while baking, so I recommend only placing 8 cookies per baking sheet.

Bake for 9 to 10 minutes, check at 9 minutes, they are done when they are

no longer shiny on top, even though they may look underbaked. Let cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire cooling rack.

(Continued from Page 1) time at 5:30 in the morning. Deckard took a particular interest in the Aerospace Engineering class and the Political Science class.

All military academies are extremely rigorous, testing students for academic exceptionality (required to be in at least the top 20% of their graduating class), athletic abilities, leadership qualities in the community, and work ethic. After showing competence in ACT or SAT scores and GPAs, students are then required to complete a physical endurance test. In addition to proving their athletic prowess, the applicant should secure a recommendation from the vice-president or a congressman from their state. After the process is concluded, only a small percentage of applicants are chosen. The acceptance rate for military academies ranges from around 7 percent to 20 percent, depending on the academy. These percentages are comparable to highly selective schools such as the Ivy League's Dartmouth College which has only a 10.6% acceptance rate.

Deckard's current plan is to go into the Navy and possibly become a pilot but has not overlooked going into the Air Force or the Coast Guard. His career path has been inspired

by his family members. Deckard's great-uncle was a Navy Explosive Ordnance Disposal Officer, his great-grandfather joined the Army and fought in the Korean War, his grandfather was in the Air Force and served in Vietnam and his grandmother served in the Air Force and was in the Israeli Defense Force when she lived in Israel. His father joined both the Army and the Air Force and served during Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom and later retired from the military.

When asked why he wanted to join the military, Deckard stated "America has really blessed me with a lot, and I want to give back."

In addition to serving the country in the Armed Forces, Deckard plans to pursue a political career after retiring from the military.

When asked about his seminar and his plans, Murrell stated that the seminar showed him how to "understand the life of a midshipman at the naval academy" and explained that the seminar helped him decide that service was the career path he had decided on. Murrell has used his time at the seminar to reflect on plans and his favorite part of the seminar was to meet new people who share his interests in the military.

Both Deckard and Murrell are highly accomplished in multiple fields in high school. Deckard has been filling his resume with competitive college mathematics courses such as trigonometry, athletics such as cross country and track, has gone to state in Madrigal, and has been accepted as a participant of Missouri Boys State.

Murrell has been a juggernaut in both athletics and academics, competing in baseball and football with a state qualification under his belt as well as a conference championship in wrestling. In addition, Murrell has excelled in academics through college-level mathematics courses and has also been selected to attend Missouri Boys State.

to be included as part of the city's in-kind match for the TAP Grant being used for the Rock Island Trail trailhead.

After other questions were fielded from the crowd as well, Alderwoman Mindy Fox made a motion to accept Great River Engineering as the city's firm. Alderman Steve Knox seconded the motion and it was approved with all ayes.

The city received 7 bids for the 2015 Dodge Charger, formerly a vehicle included in the entity's police fleet. A high bid of \$6,500 was accepted from Pam Brandt.

The city also received 3 bids to conduct its 2024 audit with the winning bid being accepted from Decker & Decker at a cost of \$7,500 for 2024. However, the contract is part of a 3-year deal with the cost to increase incrementally for 2025 and 2026.

Lastly the city accepted a bid from Kats Place Construction for the installation of new windows at city hall.

Under new business, city accepted three resolutions, 1) to pay a reimbursement for sales tax in the amount of \$111.60 to Steve Knox for his up-front purchase of the city's new microphone and speaker system, 2) to accept Great River Engineering as it's firm to proceed with the sidewalk project on the west side of the city's streets, funded by a recently received TAP Grant, and 3) to approve Kevin Cupka from Missouri State University to complete a Cultural Resource Survey as part of a requested grant through the LWCF to improve Butterfield Park.

Jean Eckstein was re-appointed to the city's Planning & Zoning committee and presented

3 building permits, all approved by the board after a motion made by Dave Locke and seconded by Steve Knox.

Police Chief Jeff Canfield informed the council that he has preliminarily looked into security cameras for city hall but quotes were still incomplete.

There was no report from the city attorney.

Mayor Burdick gave updates on the culvert that needs replaced on Spring Street that was a victim of a recent, torrential downpour and also updated the council on RFQ's that have been sent out, moving forward on the Safe Streets For All Grant.

Scott Balke addressed the council with an issue that he has with his driveway located on Hwy 52 and rectification of that issue may come to light after an upcoming visit with MoDOT.

Tracey Duvall spoke to the council as well concerning animal regulations, particularly concerning 1 dog within the city limits.

Roy Wagner presented a check in the amount of \$500 from the FOE Countryside AERIE Eagles to be applied to spaying and neutering stray dogs and cats.

The open session

concluded and the meeting adjourned to executive session around 9:00 PM.

The meeting re-opened, however, at 9:38 PM and a motion was made by Mindy Fox, seconded by Dave Locke to re-consider the previous vote of accepting Great River Engineering as the city's firm to proceed on the Rock Island Trail project on their behalf. The motion passed with all ayes.

Locke then followed with another motion to postpone to a later date a decision to accept a firm. That motion was seconded by Steve Knox and passed with all ayes.

The second part of the open session was adjourned and the council re-entered its closed executive session at 9:41 PM.

City Council meetings for Cole Camp are regularly held on the third Wednesday of each month. Visitors are always welcome to attend.

If you've retired, you may have thought you closed the book on one chapter of your life. But what happens if you need to "reverse" your retirement?

Due to higher inflation and rising interest rates, many retirees are taking out more money from their retirement accounts than they had originally anticipated. As a result, some are headed back to the workforce. If you're thinking of joining them, you'll need to consider some factors that may affect your finances.

First, if you've been taking Social Security, be aware that you could lose some of your benefits if you earn over a certain level, at least until you reach your full retirement age, which is likely between 66 and 67. Specifically, if you are under your full retirement age for the entire year, Social Security will deduct \$1 from your benefit payments for every \$2 you earn above the annual limit, which, in 2024, is \$22,320. In the year you reach your full retirement age, Social Security will deduct \$1 in benefits for every \$3 you earn above a different limit, which, in 2024, is \$59,520.

Social Security will only count your earnings up to the month before you reach your full retirement age, at which point your earnings will no longer reduce your benefits, regardless of how much you earn. Also, Social Security will recalculate your benefit amounts to credit you for the months your payments were reduced due to your excess earnings. Social Security also allows you to pay back early benefits received if you withdraw your application within 12 months of starting benefits. This move could help you receive substantially higher benefits at full retirement age.

Your Social Security isn't the only benefit that

could be affected by your earnings. Your Medicare Part B and Part D premiums are based on your income, so they could rise if you start earning more money. Also, your extra income could push you into a higher tax bracket.

Nonetheless, you can certainly gain some benefits by returning to the working world. Obviously, you'll be making money that can help you boost your daily cash flow and possibly reduce some debts. But depending on where you work, you might also be able to contribute to a 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. And regardless of where you work, you'll be eligible to contribute to an IRA. By putting more money into these accounts, you may well be able to strengthen your financial position during your retirement years. You might also be able to receive some employee benefits, such as group health insurance — which could be particularly valuable if you haven't yet started receiving Medicare.

In addition to the potential financial advantages of going back to work, you might get some social benefits, too. Many people enjoy the interactions with fellow workers and miss these exchanges when they retire, so a return to the workforce, even if it's on a part-time basis, may give you an emotional boost.

In the final analysis, you'll want to weigh the potential costs of going back to work against the possible benefits. There's no one right answer for everyone, but by looking at all the variables, you should be able to reach a decision that works for you.

MSHP: Plan A Safe July Fourth Holiday



Colonel Eric T. Olson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, reminds Missouri's travelers to make smart choices for a safe July Fourth holiday. Whether planning to visit one of Missouri's recreational opportunities or hosting a backyard barbecue, everyone should make safety part of their plans. No matter how you decide to celebrate, your smartest choice is to follow all Missouri traffic and boating laws.

During the 2023 counting period, 15 people were killed and 646 injured in Missouri over the holiday in 1,505 traffic crashes. Last year during the counting period, troopers arrested 125 people for driving while intoxicated. In 2023, there were 11 boating crashes, which included two injuries and no fatalities. One person drowned during last year's July Fourth holiday. Troopers made 10 boating while intoxicated arrests over last year's July Fourth holiday weekend.

The 2024 July Fourth holiday counting period will be from 6 p.m. Wednesday, July 3, 2024, through 11:59 p.m. Sunday, July 7, 2024.

All available troopers will be patrolling Missouri roadways and waterways to enforce traffic and boating laws and offering assistance as needed. The Highway Patrol will participate in Operation C.A.R.E. (Crash Awareness & Reduction Effort) and Operation Dry Water over the July Fourth holiday. Operation Dry Water specifically targets impaired vessel operators. Missouri's boaters are

asked to do their part by remaining alert for other boats and swimmers and being courteous on the water. Never operate a vessel if you've consumed alcohol. Boaters need to be aware that it is illegal to discharge fireworks from a vessel. Leave all fireworks in a safe place on shore. Remember to share the waterway, watch your wake, and use common sense, good judgment, and courtesy to ensure the safety of all. Life jackets save lives. Wear It!

more than \$1 billion. This is not the state's money - it is Missourians' money, and I am committed to returning it to its rightful owner.

Please scan these lists to see if they include your name, or the names of relatives or friends, including those who may be deceased or who no longer live in Missouri. One in 10 Missourians have unclaimed money, and there are nearly 330,000 unclaimed property accounts, so it is likely you or someone you know is on the list. Even if you don't find yourself on the list, please still check our database—the listings in

this newspaper are for those with over \$50 in unclaimed property. You may have some under that value!

It is fast, free and easy to go online at www.ShowMeMoney.com to find out more information and apply to get your money returned. Just enter your name exactly as it appears in the newspaper list, starting with the last name first.

Since I became State Treasurer in January 2023, my office has returned more than \$80 million to its rightful owners. The average amount returned is nearly \$300, so it is worth your while to check the

database.

Why does the State of Missouri hold unclaimed property? State law requires financial institutions, insurance companies, governmental agencies and many businesses to turn over unclaimed assets to the State Treasurer's Office after several years of no activity on accounts. This includes cash from bank accounts, stocks and bonds, utility refunds and the contents of abandoned safe deposit boxes.

The vast majority of unclaimed property is cash or the equivalent, but there are also many items from

safety deposit boxes, and these have ranged from valuable jewelry, historical books and documents, even false teeth. There are always surprises.

If these items of actual property go unclaimed from the State Treasurer's Office for several years, they are subject to public auction. This year's Unclaimed Property Auction will be held July 29-30, starting at 9 a.m. each day, with previews starting July 28. The auction location is the Oasis Hotel & Convention Center, 2546 North Glenstone Avenue, in Springfield.
