Pediatric Place POPS With Color For **Autism & Neurodevelopment Opening**



Confetti fireworks and a pink, teal and white balloon arch marked the opening of the new Autism and Neurodevelopment Center on June 21. More than 70 people gathered under a large canopy in the parking lot for the opening last Friday. Pediatric Place staff in teal polo shirts and yellow T-shirts with the teal and pink logo added more color to the event.

The Pediatric Place offers speech, physical and occupational (small motor skills) plus a variety of multidisciplinary developmental therapies to children. The new center, constructed next to the existing one at 210 S. 2nd., expands the Pediatric Place facilities for Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) for children with autism, who have difficulties with social interaction, communications and sensory processing.

"It's not grandma's Safeway store any more," said Mayor Carla Moberly, referring to the original use of the adjoining building on the site.

Moberly, one of the guest speakers at the opening ceremony, commended Jeff Klassen and Klassen Construction of Clinton

for the amazing job they did on the building. She also commended Pediatric Place founders Carmen Rathert and Jessi Frencken for their dedication and vision in growing the Pediatric Place from a small office on Ohio Street with three therapists to three buildings, one in Knob Noster, and 65 employees in nine years.

With 30,000 square feet

of space, the Pediatric Place is one of the largest facilities in the state dedicated to therapy services for children.

With the Pediatric Place, Golden Valley Memorial Healthcare, Compass Health and the new Bourland Radiation Oncology Center, Clinton is becoming a real leader in healthcare in Missouri, the Mayor

Brittany Pickens, Pediatric Place marketing manager, also introduced Melanie Stinnett, state representative for District 33, a speech pathologist in Springfield who is a friend of Carmen's. farm equipment as well as lawnmowers, construction and landscaping equipment, utility vehicles and equipment by other manufacturers as well as the iconic John Deere brand.

There has been a John Deere dealership in Clinton for decades. In 2002, it was owned by the Shoemaker Equipment, and then it was purchased by a company in Harrisonville. In 2007,

Heritage Tractor bought the Clinton dealership. Currently, there are 20 employees.

"We were very surprised to receive the donation," said Heidi Crabtree, director of the Clinton Animal Shelter, "and we're very grateful. Funds are tight right now, and this donation is greatly appreciated." Abbie Cardwell, parts lead at Clinton's Heritage





munities around it. "It's so important to families in rural communities, to give them options local-

ly," Ussery said. Jessi Frencken also thanked Klassen Con-

struction for helping the Pediatric Place reach this significant milestone. Carmen Rathert said the Pediatric Place has impacted thousands of children in realizing its motto, "Collaborative Care for Successful Lives."

Carmen and Jessi cut the ribbon to officially open the new facility as confetti fireworks shot colorful bits of paper into the air. Guests then went under the balloon arch through the door, which will be the main entrance to the Pediatric Place, to tour the new building. Inside is a reception area and a hallway of individual therapy rooms, which will connect with a hallway to the existing building to the south. Across the back of the building is a 3,000 squarefoot gymnasium.

An outdoor playground is planned for behind the gym, staff said. On the north side of the building are two preschool classroom settings, offices, a conference room and a large kitchen and dining area for eating and swallowing therapies. The tour ended in the staff room, where pink punch and iced cookies were served.

Brooke Allen of Springfield has been hired to be the ABA director. Brooke said that the new building will welcome 14 kids on July 15. All will receive oneon-one therapy, she said, ranging from one hour a week to 34 hours a week.

"First and foremost is to give back something to those who are doing good in our communities. Second is to have something that employees can get excited and feel good about. The donations were based on their choices, and they will get to help present the checks. Lastly, our goal is to show customers that it is more than just selling a tractor to us, (we want) to be part of the communities we serve and stick around for generations to come,"

The presentation will be more than just presenting a check. It will start with the flag-wrapped Heritage Tractor leaving the dealership on Highway 7 and driving to the Clinton Animal Shelter for the presen-

"We'll try to have members of the board here," said Crabtree, "to receive the check." She added that the money will be used to pay medical bills and not to fill the constant need for food.

Currently, the animal shelter is running very low on Pedigree Adult dog food and Purina Cat Chow as well as bleach, paper towels and bath towels in good shape. like the words were capitalized, "and my daughter said, 'That needs to be on a T-shirt."

Now, it is. A polygon is a geometric shape with straight sides used by weather services to outline the area on a map under a tornado watch or warning. "Respect the Polygon" means to go immediately to your safe place when a tornado warning is issued if you live in the area inside the poly-

Angie, a pastor at Victory Church in Adrian, Mo., wanted to help support Subby's WCMO Advisory Facebook page, which now has more than 8,000 followers in West Central Missouri. People from all over the region log onto the page when storms are expected to listen to Jim explain exactly what is happening in their community.

Jim, who studied meteorology at the University of Missouri, provides forecasts to fire departments and other first responders as deputy director of the

Henry County Emergency Management. From his home, Jim reads computer screens showing radar images of storm cells and how a notched area in the front line of a cell indicates the wind is starting to spin, which can result in a funnel cloud.

If a funnel cloud touches the ground, it becomes a tornado.

He also explains computer graphics showing the elements necessary to the formation of an anvil-shaped cloud that rises and hits a cap through instability in the atmosphere, and the wind shear that sets it spinning, which when combined with high humidity levels, results in funnel clouds and tornados.

The difference between a tornado watch and tornado warning, Jim explained, is the difference between having all the fixin's for tacos on hand — in the case of a tornado, storm cells, instability, wind shear and humidity and the moment when the elements have come together and you need to stop what you are doing because dinner, so to speak, is on the table.

Jim's son Remington helps him monitor activity on the screens, and sometimes one of the Nader Boys, who chase tornados in the Midwest, also sits in. The family dog provides background

"Subby does this as a service to the community," Angie said. "I thought this would be a great way to say thanks and raise some funds for the expenses he has to pay."

Jim responds personally to people logging onto his page, greeting members of his immediate and extended family, acknowledging friends logging on, and exchanging jokes. A friend once texted "We're eating tacos," in response to his tornado watch/ warning analogy.

"I've really enjoyed learning about the weather," Angie said. "It makes it fun."

Jim keeps a cool eye on hot storm tracks, depicted in yellow, red or a dark crimson, reflecting how much moisture is present. His calm explanations of exactly what is happening and when to take cover reduces the panic and fear that could complicate a scary situation.

The information is also specific to the counties in West Central Missouri, which fall between weather-station radar in Pleasant Hill, serving the Kansas City area and Springfield in the south.

He is not paid for live-streaming storm coverage from his home.

Jim also works four days a week in Urich, but will stay up all night to show people exactly where the storm cells are, which way they are heading, and how fast. In addition to telling people if and when a severe storm will hit their community, he also lets people know when the tornados have moved out of the storm-warned area and they can go back to bed.

The next day, Jim will be out surveying damage in the county to report to the National Weather Service. His weathercasts have been particularly relevant this spring, which saw multiple storm fronts sweep across the Kansas border and into west-central Missouri, spawning several small tornados.

Angie said she received 42 orders for the shirts, which come in three sizes and three colors. Some orders were for multiple shirts, so she is making around 60. She also presented a T-shirt

Angie likes the fact that Jim monitors the weather in communities other than Clinton, and responds to questions from people who have relatives in the area or students away at college. Others who have been visiting relatives want to know when it is safe to be on the road home. Her daughter, Jordan Rischer, lives in a house in southern Missouri that doesn't have a basement, she said. In that situation, "Respecting the Polygon" means going to an interior room in the house, usually a bathroom, that doesn't have any windows, or small windows that are taped.

Having your safe place ready ahead of time with a flashlight, water, emergency food and a way to receive weather updates is the best way to "Respect the Polygon" and is crucial to avoid being injured. Most fatalities during a tornado are caused by windows exploding inwards due to the pressure differential, and well as A cautionary saying of people who grew on Midwest farms: a tornado can drive a piece of straw through a

Angie said she originally heard about Subby's WCMO Advisory Page from a friend, but before that, didn't keep a close eye on the weather. Her house has a basement, so sometimes the first she heard of a severe storm heading towards Adrian was a phone call from the fire chief, asking if people could use her basement as a storm shelter. People who live in mobile homes are particularly vulnerable, as is anyone outside or in a vehicle when a tornado hits.

People who log onto Subby's WCMO Advisory Page live streams also report what is happening in their area — when the high winds, thunderstorms or hail hit, or that the power went out but has come back on, reassuring other followers of the weather advisory

til the work completes on or before December 15 of this year.

Work crews from MO-DOT closed north and southbound passing lanes of Route 7 on June 24, to begin refurbishing an existing crossover lane set.

On July 1 the southbound traffic will shift to a head-to-head design onto the northbound lanes. They will remain in this configuration for the duration of the project.

Motorists are asked to expect delays during high traffic volume. Lake traffic on Friday afternoons and Sunday afternoons will be impacted.

The speed limits in these one lane areas, will reduce to 60 miles-perhour.

Signs and message boards will be posted in both directions, alerting motorists to the coming short detour.

Weather and or construction delays, could impact the work schedule and planned December completion date.



Beautiful, spacious, waving grain, purple mountains, fruited---Katherine Lee Bates chose those words to describe our country, the United States of America. The words present a true picture. I enjoy being a part of this beautiful land. I say "my Country" with pride.

Missouri v. New York: Combatting Unconstitutional Lawfare

I will be filing a legal action in the United States Supreme Court in order to defend the constitutional rights of the citizens of the State of Missouri to fully and freely participate in the election of the President of the United States. There are two competing visions for the future of America. Some states value freedom and an individual's ability to choose the candidate for President that they prefer, while other states choose a path of lawfare to weaponize government, intimidate candidates, and remove them from the campaign trail during one of the most consequential elections in our nation's history.

In 1787, when "We the people of the United States" joined together to form a "more perfect union" to "establish justice... and promote the general welfare" of all of our citizens, we did so with the promise that our shared Constitution gave each state an equal seat at the table. Under this promise, we agreed that each of the states would jointly participate in determining the course of our nation and one of the most important decisions we would make, as equals, was the selection of our President.

Recent events in New York, Colorado, Georgia, and elsewhere have fundamentally undermined the system that has served us so well for more than 200 years. We are a nation of laws, with checks and balances to protect individuals from persecution. These laws are supposed to be equally enforced and equally applied. State officials, including prosecutors, have a legal and moral duty to seek justice, act fairly, and avoid even the appearance of impropriety. These ethical obligations forbid politically motivated prosecutions and other attempts to interfere in the nation's choice to freely elect the next President.

Unfortunately, over the past several months, we have seen states use baseless criminal prosecutions and judicial fiat in a willful attempt to prevent other states, like Missouri, from fully participating in a national election for the nation's highest office. Political opponents targeting fellow candidates and prioritizing hatred over the rule of law is fundamentally un-American, antithetical to freedom, and blatantly unconstitutional.

All Americans, including the citizens of Missouri, have a right to hear from and have access to a presidential candidate. Led by radical activists in other states, this

malicious lawfare is a direct attack on the democratic process and the values we hold dear as a nation.

President Trump was prosecuted by officials who previously made a name for themselves by narrating and campaigning on promises to go after him and his business practices. These prosecutors coordinated with the Biden administration to further an illicit conviction to take President Trump off the campaign trail.

And that was only in the State of New York. These facts display a level of collusion never seen before between a corrupt Department of Justice and politically motivated state prosecutors.

In 2016 and 2020 combined, more than 3 million Missourians voted for President Trump in the presidential election. Now in 2024, Missourians have selected Trump and Biden to face off once again. Missourians have a right to participate in the presidential election, which means they have a right to hear from both candidates and see each candidate on the ballot.

If we are to protect the rule of law, we must end this unconstitutional lawfare. If we are to remain a nation of laws, we must root out this existential threat to the republic and ensure our elections remain free from political interference. Missouri's lawsuit against the State of New York's unconscionable

actions will do just that.

Since I became State Treasurer in January 2023, my office has returned more than \$80 million to its rightful owners. The average amount returned is nearly \$300, so it is worth your while to check the database.

Why does the State of Missouri hold unclaimed property? State law requires financial institutions, insurance companies, governmental agencies and many businesses to turn over unclaimed assets to the State Treasurer's Office after several years of no activity on accounts. This includes cash from bank accounts, stocks and bonds, utility refunds and the contents of abandoned safe deposit boxes.

The vast majority of unclaimed property is cash or the equivalent, but there are also many items from safety deposit boxes, and these have ranged from valuable jewelry, historical books and documents, even false teeth. There are always surprises.

If these items of actual property go unclaimed from the State Treasurer's Office for several years, they are subject to public auction. This year's Unclaimed Property Auction will be held July 29-30, starting at 9 a.m. each day, with previews starting July 28. The auction location is the Oasis Hotel & Convention Center, 2546 North Avenue, Glenstone Springfield.

BIRTHDAY BLESSINGS DIRECTOR, Jake Rigdon, is preparing a birthday party for delivery to a child in foster care. Gifts are selected based on the individual tastes of each child. This party is headed to a little girl who likes dolls and trucks. After she wraps the gifts, she will carefully pack them in a bag or duffle to be delivered by local child advocates.

Wondering how you can make a difference in the life of an at-risk child? Birthday Blessings is holding their 2nd Annual July Toy Drive to meet needs and spread cheer in Missouri foster community. Locally, they provide services to about 145 kids in state custody through the 27th Circuit Children's Division in Bates, Benton, Henry and St. Clair Counties.

The event is spearheaded by Jake Rigdon, a member of the nonprofit's board of directors and staff member at the 18th Circuit Children's Division in Sedalia. After spending more than 12 years working in the foster system, she has witnessed the impact of Birthday Blessing's programs on this community.

"So many things have to happen at once when a child enters care that birthdays or other special events are often not thought of," Rigdon said. "Some kids enter care and they have never had a birthday party or a gift before. When they come into the office and see the birthday bags, they get very excited!"

"We had one teen who cried when he got a graduation celebration bag from Birthday Blessings. He was overwhelmed that someone would think of him and his graduation," she said. "We had another teen transitioning to independent living who had no way to cook. The nonprofit gave her a toaster oven, pans and basic utensils so she could prepare meals at home."

Watching the nonprofit's impact on kids in foster care gave her the idea to hold an annual toy drive. She approached the board of directors with the idea, and they unanimously approved it.

"July is a great time for this event. People aren't focused on other holidays like Christmas. I thought this would be a great way for each community to support kids locally," Rigdon explained. "Last year was our inaugural year. We got a team together and publicized it through local media and online. We were really pleased with the amount support we received."

Shannon VonAllmen, the executive director of the organization, was excited to try the idea. It was different than any fundraiser they had held in the past.

"We serve kids in 30 counties spread throughout the state, so typical fundraising events like a gala aren't effective for us. This was a way that people in all areas could participate," said VonAllmen. "This toy drive is an opportunity for people, regardless of their geographic location, to add kindness and cheer to lives of kids."

Currently, Birthday Blessings is most in need of gifts for teens. Suggested items are advanced Legos sets, sports balls, fishing equipment, KC Chiefs or Cardinals merchandise, ear buds, gaming headsets, lotion or bath sets, makeup or nail polish sets, craft kits, board games, and snacks that do not expire before 2025.

They also need gifts rated safe for toddlers. Most requested items include developmental toys, toys that light up or make noise, vehicles, dolls, and toys to push across the floor or help a child learn to walk. Mickey and Minnie Mouse, Bluey and Cocomelon are popular with this age group.

The drive will commence on July 1st and run through the 31st. A collection box is located at the 27th Circuit Children's Division office at 1661 North 2nd Street in Clinton. Monetary donations can be made at

www.birthday-blessings. org/donate. An Amazon wish list is posted on their website and Facebook page. Purchased items will be shipped directly to their building.
