Sometimes you just want something creamy and chocolate: which for me is most of the time. The following recipe for a Mocha Marshmallow Mousse fills the bill. It is light and fluffy and the marshmallows (which are a type of meringue) give the mousse structure. I add a little espresso powder to elevate the taste.

¾ cup milk, whole or 2%
4 cups mini marshmallows
3 ounces bittersweet chocolate, finely chopped
2 teaspoons instant espresso powder
¾ cup cold heavy cream (it whips better when cold, chill the bowl and beaters)
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Combine milk, marshmallows, chocolate and espresso powder in a medium sized heavy saucepan; heat over low heat, whisking constantly until marshmallows and chocolate are melted and incorporated. Then set pan in bowl of ice water and let stand, whisking often, until cool and thick, about 15 minutes. Meanwhile, combine cream and vanilla and beat with electric mixer until the stiff peak stage. Fold cooled chocolate mix into whipped cream. Ok to leave some streaks so you don't over fold. Spoon into dessert goblets, serve or refrigerate up to one day. (Cover with plastic wrap)

One of the newer features in 2024 will be the ability to provide a live scoreboard that will be visible on a viewer's screen during the entire game, complete with graphics.

"One thing that people have always told us is that they wish our broadcast had a scoreboard, so we have really worked on perfecting that this year," White said proudly. "In the past, fans have been reliant on commentators to announce the scores, but they won't have to do that as often now."

An added feature this

year will also be the ability for broadcasters to highlight starting lineups and individual players throughout the game.

The crew for all Warsaw broadcasts throughout the 2024 season will be Matt Dove and Drew Burdick. Adam Howe will join them in the booth at all away contests.

Dove will do the play-by-play for the Wildcats and Burdick will do color commentary along with game stats. Howe will provide additional commentary at away games. "BCE TV is a great way for former players, fans and coaches to check in on their teams, no matter where they are in the world," Dove said. "It's a great way to stay connected."

The production of BCE TV also encourages and helps to connect the school and their respective community as several advertising options are available for businesses and organizations to show their support. Full video commercials, either previously produced or shot and produced by the BCE TV production team is the most popular. The Benton County Commission meeting was called to order by Presiding Commissioner Steve Daleske on August 19 at 9:00 AM in the Board room.

Presiding Commissioner Daleske reported that he was notified that two individuals were arrested in Henry County for possession of several Benton County Road signs and brackets. An investigation is pending and the Commissioners indicated that they will pursue charges in such instances.

Emergency Blood Shortage: Severe Weather Further Strains Red Cross Blood Supply

Communities encouraged to stay ready, give blood or platelets during National Preparedness Month

The American Red Cross continues to experience a national blood emergency as remnants of Hurricane Debby and other severe weather events across the country have further complicated efforts to rebuild the nation's blood supply. Those in unaffected areas are urged to make an appointment to give now.

Weather in recent weeks has added to the summer shortfall in donations by forcing the cancellation of nearly 60 blood drives throughout the country, many of which were caused by Debby, causing approximately 1,500 lifesaving blood products to go uncollected. Annually, severe weather – such as blizzards, tornadoes, flooding and hurricanes – impacts about 90,000 blood donations made to the Red Cross. In Missouri, 527 blood drives have been canceled due to weather over the last 10 years, including 37 so far this year. This has resulted in

about 1,324 donations going uncollected in the Red Cross of Missouri and Arkansas region to-date in 2024.

Because blood has a short shelf life and can only come from volunteer blood donors, any disruptions in the ability to collect lifesaving blood can have serious consequences for hospitals and patients.

First-time donors and those who give regularly are critical to blood supply recovery. 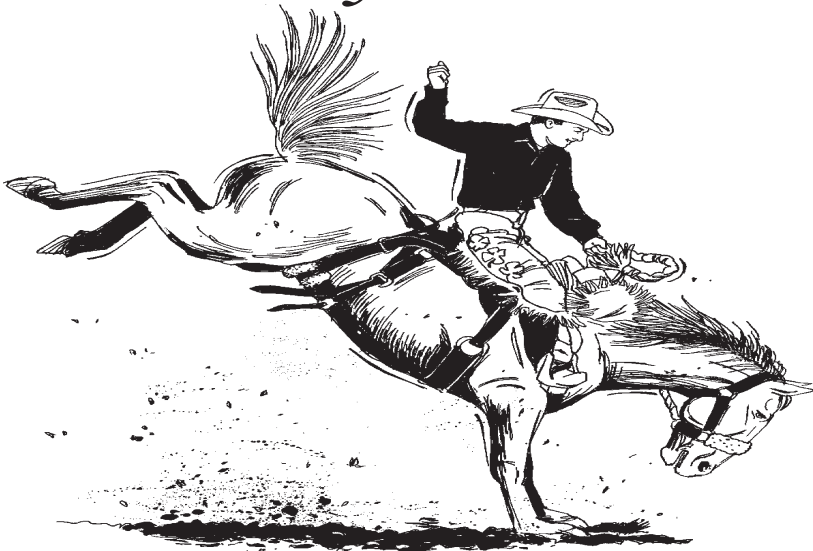

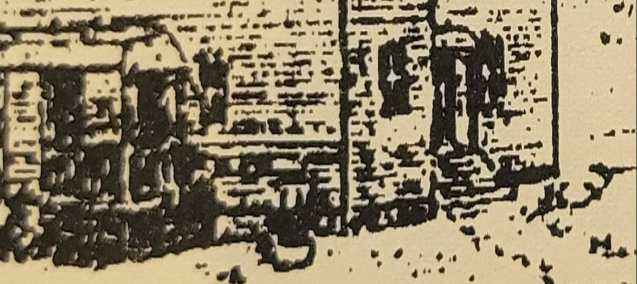

To Act As Devils

Never before in the history of the Catholic Church have we had a Pope the likes of Pope Francis. He seems so attuned to the problems of everyday living and not removed from the Parishioner's daily struggles with life. For instance, shortly after he took office he stated: "We live in a very sinful world where the wheat and the weeds grow together. The mission, as parents, is to protect the wheat and leave the mowing of the weeds to the angels." The importance of being a good parent is not overlooked by Francis and he managed to stir up a media storm when he backed parents who spank their children, providing the child's dignity is maintained. In remarks devoted to the role of fathers in a family he said: "One time, I heard a father say he sometimes had to smack his children a bit, but never in the face so as not to humiliate them." "How beautiful," he continued: "That father recognized the sense of dignity. He punished his children but did it justly and then moved on."

The Church's position on corporal punishment came under criticism some time back during a grilling by members of a UN human rights committee monitoring of the UN treaty on the rights of the child. I personally feel the lack of discipline of children has led to many of our social problems facing us as a Nation. I won't attempt to list them but I can say that when I was a single parent I enrolled my children in the Catholic School where I had the backup of strict rules and set guidelines. The Principal's opening statement to me and my children was: "Attending school at Sacred Heart is a privilege and not a right. Mess up and you can be

removed." I knew from that instant forward if when I needed reinforcement, it would be there.

As Jackie Kennedy once wisely stated: "If you bungle raising your children, nothing else much matters." Another famous mother, Lillian Carter knew disappointment in her son Billy. He and his brother, Jimmy Carter, might be the prime example of parental laxness. Jimmy was thirteen when Billy was born. Their father, Earl Carter, felt he had been too tough on his eldest son, Jimmy. He now doted on Billy. Billy became the family's "wild child." When Jimmy Carter was elected to the Presidency, the limelight quickly centered on Billy and his "good ole boy," antics. At first he provided a charming contrast to his straight laced brother, the President. But by 1980 his act had worn thin. So much so that a newspaper story stated: "If Billy isn't working for the Republican Party, he should be." Even Billy's own Mother, Lillian Carter, told a reporter: "Wherever there's trouble, that's where Billy is! Sometimes I say to myself, 'Lillian, you should have stayed a virgin.'"

Parenting is possibly the toughest job in the world. To raise good human beings, it is not only necessary to be a good mother and father but to have had a good mother and father. I think I was blessed with having good parents and my father certainly never spared the rod. I recall the last "whipping" I received from him when I was about twelve. He took a limber switch from a "pussy willow" bush and set my legs on fire. I had red whelps for a couple of days, and I can truthfully say, I deserved them. I can also say, if you have never been hated by your child, you have never been a parent.

Often parents think their child can do nothing wrong and then there are those

that believe their child can do nothing right. One is as destructive an attitude as the other. As difficult as it seems, we need to maintain a happy medium by punishing bad behavior and praising the good. As Pope Francis said. "Let the child maintain his dignity."

You don't always have to strike a child to crush them. A destructive incident I once observed will remain with me forever. I was attending a high school commencement program. The Seniors came off the stage and carried long stemmed roses to their mothers, grandmothers and other feminine members of their families. One female graduate gave a four-year old girl cousin, a rose. The beautiful child was seated on her father's lap and her face lit with an inner joy upon receiving the special gift from her older cousin. Her mother reached across and jerked the flower from her, refusing to let her have it back. The look that came into that little girl's eyes will haunt me to my dying day. In that single swift, cruel, action the mother had crushed her own daughter's spirit as surely as if she had struck her in the face with her fist. The wound was devastating, even though there was no visible evidence of abuse. If I had to bet, my guess would be that mother had received similar treatment as a child. As I stated previously, good parents are usually descended from good parents.

When I was a child, children were expected to defer to their parents in everything. We were to wait on them and have our own chores around the house. By the time I became a parent childrearing had changed. Many of my contemporaries believed parents were expected to defer to their children in hopes of not damaging their creativity and squelching their little imaginations. Frankly, I still believed it was my turn, as a parent, to be deferred to.

I don't know who's right and who's wrong in this argument but I firmly agree with Pope Francis about "smacking" behinds. P.D. James stated it in a nutshell when he wrote: "If from infancy, you treat your children as gods they are liable, in adulthood, to act as devils."

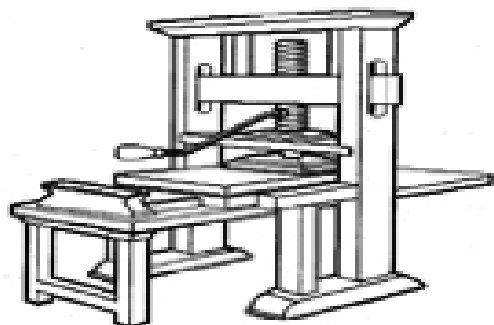

Cole Camp Ambulance District Forced To Make Tough Decisions; Employees Take Pay Cuts, Services Reduced

The Cole Camp Ambulance Board met and first order of business was to approve the local tax rate. Hearing no public comment the Board moved forward, following the calculation tools provided by the state. The Board then approved the tax levy.

Next the Board approved the agenda and the minutes from the July 2024 meeting. Financials were then approved before moving to the old business.

The immediate plan is a short term loan of \$50,000. Since the tax increase wasn't approved a conversation with the bank resulted in a different game plan of lumping everything together which would include the equipment, building loan, etc. Then, a once per year \$25,000 or \$30,000 payment in January when tax revenue

is received. This will stretch out the time of the loan repayment originally set. Not an ideal plan but the only way the District can continue to operate.

Secondly, the District will reduce services. The Full-time employees have offered to take a \$1.00 to \$1.50 per hour pay cut for a time. Every other Sunday the District will be served by Lincoln/Warsaw Ambulance, not Cole Camp. The reality is, if all of Lincoln/Warsaw is already on calls the patient will have to wait in line to get attention.

Every other Saturday the District will be served by part timers and may only be a BLS service, not an ALS. Difference is with only BLS there will not be a paramedic aboard and many medical procedures cannot be performed by EMTs.

The District plans to put a tax increase back on the November ballot. In the mean time the District will be a Mutual Aid service.



If the measure fails in November the reality is the District will become a straight BLS service.

The Board wants all residents to realize the District has survived this long only because of all the Covid money made available before. And there is no more Covid funding! Even if the Future income loan passes on the November ballot the District won't receive any money until August 2025.

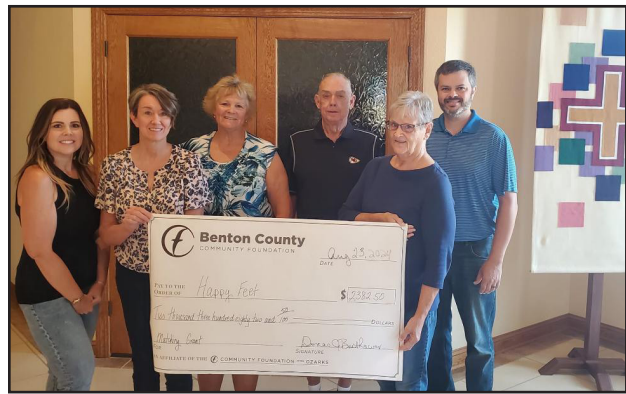
The Board is putting a sunset clause in the tax rate

which insures they come back and re-evaluate the increase. The Sunset clause is for ten years. The Board unanimously approved putting the increase on the November ballot and it is only a twenty cent increase.

If you have any questions, ask a Board member and get the straight dollar and cents facts. Facts such as the District had to pay out \$60,000 in 2023 to upgrade the 911 radar. There was no choice, it was mandated.

That had to be paid back this year, 2024.

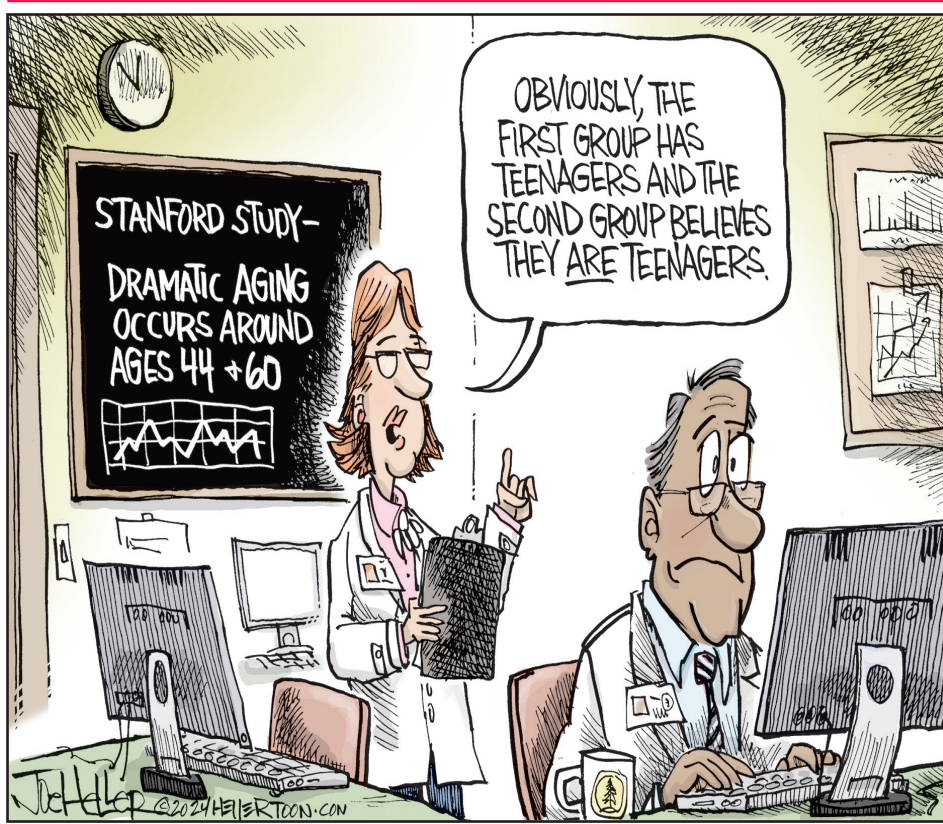

During your working years, you know where your income is coming from because you're working. But once you retire, you'll have to identify your income sources, know how much you can expect from them and know how to manage them to help support a retirement that could last two or three decades.

So, where will your retirement income come from? And what decisions will you need to make about these income sources?

Consider the following:

- **Retirement accounts** – If you've regularly contributed to an IRA and a 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan, you likely have accumulated substantial amounts of money in these accounts — but during your retirement, you'll need to start tapping into them. In fact, once you turn 73, you're required to start taking withdrawals from some of your retirement accounts, with the amount determined by your age and account balance. You could take out more than these amounts (technically called required minimum distributions, or RMDs) but you can't take less without incurring penalties. Many people take out 4% of their balance each year, and this guideline may be reasonable, but everyone's situation is different. So, you'll need to weigh various factors including your age, health and other sources of income before deciding on an appropriate withdrawal rate.
- **Social Security** – You can start collecting Social Security at age 62, but your payments will be much higher if you wait until your full retirement age, which will be between 66 and 67. And your benefits will reach the maximum amount if you wait until 70

before collecting. So, your decision on when to take your benefits will depend on whether you can afford to wait, and for how long. With the added income, you might be able to afford delaying Social Security, and you would still be eligible to contribute to an IRA.

- **Supplemental lifetime income** – There aren't many guarantees in the financial and investment worlds — but one of them is the income from a fixed annuity, which can be structured to provide you with a lifetime income stream. Annuities aren't for everyone, however, and they do involve penalties for early withdrawals and lack of protection from inflation.

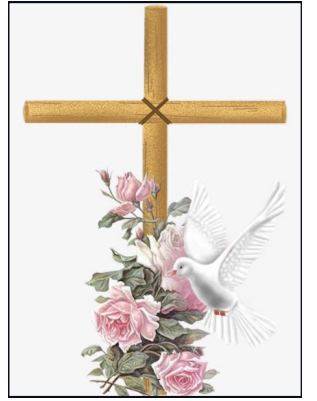

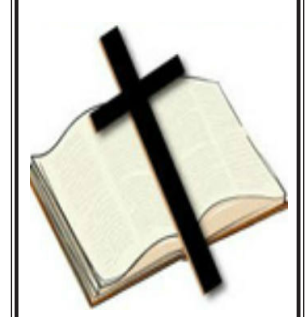

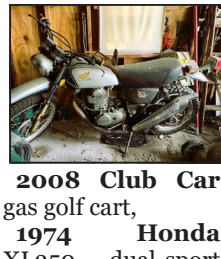

Monitor Late-Summer Body Condition of Spring Calving Cows

Late summer is an ideal time to begin thinking about winter feeding programs for beef cows. Winter feed costs are dictated by

two important factors, forage quality and cow body condition score. Late summer management for maintaining body condition on spring calving cows is crucial in helping manage winter feed costs.

To illustrate this concept, various winter feeding scenarios were based on a forage sample that was 7.8 percent protein and 55 percent TDN. This marginal quality hay was used to feed cows at maintenance or requiring the addition

of either ¼ body condition score per month or ½ body condition score per month. Remember it takes approximately 80 pounds of liveweight gain to increase body condition score one point.

This hay meets the energy requirement for a dry, mid-gestation cow not needing to add body condition. Adding ¼ body condition score per month requires 14% more energy in the diet compared to the animal that does not need to add body condition. This extra energy can be provided by feeding 2.5 pounds of corn, 2.5 pounds of dry distiller's grains, or an equivalent energy supplement.

Adding ½ body condition score per month requires a 31% increase in energy content of the ration. This can be provided by feeding a supplement consisting of 4 pounds of corn plus 2 pounds of dry distiller's grains for a total of 6 pounds of supplement, or an equivalent energy supplement.

Since forage availability and quality in September may be questionable, begin monitoring forage disappearance, pasture regrowth and cow body condition in August. Then if forage availability becomes limiting, calves can be weaned before cows lose a substantial amount of body condition that must be replaced with high energy grain supplements or be dependent on the availability of adequate fall stockpiled forage. Be sure to factor in the time necessary for preweaning management when determining a target weaning date. After weaning, supplements can be fed to weaned calves to add weight to a saleable product.

If the addition of body condition is necessary, begin that process long before calving and breeding when body condition scores need to be at their greatest. One simple way to add body condition is to not remove it from the animal in the first place. Timing of weaning can have a dramatic impact on the necessity of adding body condition to cows and overall winter feed cost for the cow herd.

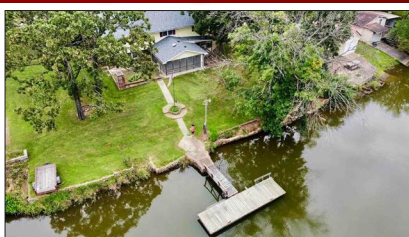

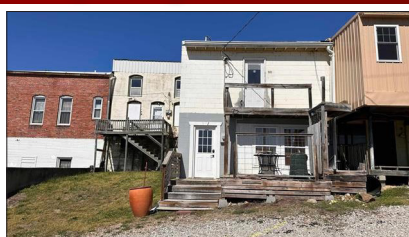


