

#### Freshman Warsaw Will Use "Balanced" **Offense To Build On Success**

The Wildcats are in a rarely heard of situation this season as they return 3 runners who each tallied nearly 1,000 vards in 2023. Though they refer to their offense as "balanced", collectively, the Wildcats backfield averaged 264 yards per game a season ago and just 71 yards through the air en route to averaging 33 points per game. They will, undoubtedly, rely heavily on those weapons in another explosive rushing attack this year and that could lead to mounds of success and a late season run for Warsaw. Garrett Ferguson is back for his senior season after gaining 908 yards on the ground last season while collecting 13 touchdowns along the way. Ferguson also threw for 838 yards and 9 TD's with 7 picks. Those numbers garnered him All-Conference and All-District honors and with that much more understanding of the Wildcats offense, he could improve on those numbers in his final campaign in the green and black.

Jayce Depriest was another workhorse for the Wildcats last year after putting together a fine season with 944 vards and 11 rushing touchdowns. But Depriest also brings extra value to the offense as a receiver out of the backfield. Last season, he hauled in 13 catches for 256 yards and 4 more TD's. After another solid off-season, Depriest should definitely knock on the door of 1,000 yards on the ground this fall and add to his collection of All-Conference and All-District awards. Anything he provides through the air will, again, be an added bonus to an already potent offense.

As if that wasn't enough though, neither Ferguson or Depriest even led the ground attack for the Wildcats last season. That accolade belongs to Josh Harvath who enters his junior year after leading Warsaw with 995 yards rushing with 18 touchdowns in a spectacular sophomore season where he earned All-Conference and All-District honors. Harvath's

stature makes him a tough one to take down and if he can reach the second level of an opposing defense, he also has the speed to burn it

While they aren't quite as "balanced" as claimed, offensive coordinator Danny Morrison does have skill players outside who can pose a threat to stretch a field.

Senior Drake Murrell is the "Swiss Army" knife of the Wildcats offense. He will be lined up in several different spots on the field and Warsaw will find ways to get the ball in his hands from any of those positions. Senior Shane Poyser showed promise early in the 2023 season but then spent the rest of his junior year battling a nagging hamstring injury. If Poyser can get out of the blocks early, he could give the Wildcats offense an entirely different feature. Senior Logan Gemes and juniors Jace Hubert, Luke Henderson and Noah Siebert could also be big targets through the air for Ferguson.

Perhaps the biggest question mark for the Warsaw offense could be their shakeup on the offensive line. Senior Kendall

Gemes will handle all kicking duties for Warsaw again. His leg earned him All-Conference and All-District awards in 2023 and a strong off-season filled with strength, conditioning and kicking-specific camps should give the Wildcats offense ammo in any tight contest they may find themselves in.

On defense, the Warsaw linebacking corps is as good as they come. They'll be led by Murrell who notched 100 tackles last year on his way to attaining All-Conference, All-District and All-State honors. As good as he is on offense, Murrell shines on the defensive side of the ball and has shown glimps-







Chase Young is pure speed and could be used in several fashions. If he catches the ball in an open field, he could be gone.

Honestly, with Srader and Parrott healthy, they could be a final four team in the making. So it falls to Sanders to stay healthy and run the show. Lincoln legend Connor Lynde handed him the torch two years ago. Lynde and Kaleb Mundy won district titles in football, baseball and basketball their senior year as the only two Lincoln players to ever do so. Sanders is capable of doing the same .He can pass and run the ball as well as most players in the area. He thrives under pressure to succeed.

Another big key is having enough experienced players on the bench to spell the starters for a breather.

They added far away Willow Springs to the home schedule for the first game. Adrian, Holden, Tipton and Butler will be huge tests.

Lincoln has a new weight room, a new parking lot and a beautiful new gym. A lot of community pride has gone into the transformation.
