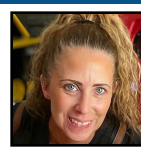

Ozark Foodie

is a quick garlic sauté. Last week I came home with one very large choy and it was delicious. The baby choy's are also quite delicious.



Garlic Greens

- 1/2 cup chicken stock
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon olive or vegetable oil
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 pounds of bok choy
- Salt and freshly ground pepper

Fall is rapidly approaching with major cooking; casseroles, baking, cakes and cookies and pies! Oh my! So, with all the temptations coming up I know I have to keep eating my share of healthy foods. Greens top the list. Growing up in Northwest Missouri, we didn't have access to many of the greens available to us now. I thought I hated spinach since the only spinach my mother served was canned, gross and slimy. Now I love fresh spinach, kale, Swiss chard and bok choy.

Wash choy, cut off stems, remove hard core, slice stems into one-inch pieces. Chop leaves into one-inch pieces. Mix stock and cornstarch together.

Heat oil in a large skillet; add garlic, sauté for 20 seconds. Add choy stems, stirring for about one minute, add leaves, sauté another minute. Add stock; continue stirring and tossing about until thickened. Remove from heat, add salt and pepper.

If you have any left, refrigerate and use in frittatas, quiche or soup.

Wildcats Kick-Off Season With Road Rout Of Lawson



WARSAW'S LOGAN GEMES got the Wildcats 2024 season underway with a strong kick-off. Warsaw scored on their first possession of the game and rolled to a 33-0 shutout win at Lawson.

Week 1 of the high school football season usually always exposes a team in one way or another. However, the Wildcats kept that to a minimum when they executed their offense very effectively and were air-tight on defense in securing a 33-0 season opening win on the road at Lawson on Friday night.

After the opening kick-off by Logan Gemes, it was the Warsaw defense on display first. A 9 play drive by the Cardinals ended on a stop on 4th down with 8 yards to go and the Wildcats offense took over from there.

On their first play of the season, Jayce Depriest rumbled for a 36-yard gain on first down and Warsaw got their first score in a non-traditional fashion after Josh Harvath burst through the middle for 16 yards but the ball popped loose on his way to the ground. Gemes, in the right place at the right time, questionably picked up the ball and jogged into the endzone for the last 13 yards of the play for the score. He also put the PAT through to give the Wildcats a 7-0 lead.

Warsaw's next trip to paydirt came after a huge defensive play on 1st down for the Cardinals from their own 28 yard line. Sitting in the shotgun formation, Lawson quarterback

Brogan Crawford was flanked by one running back in Loki Shields. That would not be enough protection for the signal caller as Drake Murrell and Brecken Brewster both flew into the backfield from their outside linebacker positions. Murrell put the initial hit on Crawford and Brewster cleaned it up, forcing a fumble that the Wildcats would recover at the 9 yard line. Two plays later, Depriest plunged in from 3 yards out for Warsaw's second TD. Gemes PAT was blocked but the Wildcats led 13-0 at the end of the first.

With the defense still amped from their last time on the field, Dakota Todd notched a quarterback sack early in the second quarter to force a 3rd down and 34 for Lawson. A 4-yard run came up way short to force a punt and the Wildcats got back in business quick.

On 2nd down and 7 from the Cardinals' 34 yard line, Harvath found light around the left side and raced into the endzone for another touchdown. Gemes nailed the PAT and it was 20-0.

The Wildcats final score of the first half came on a 4-yard run by Depriest. Gemes PAT was signaled no-good by the back judge but Warsaw took a 26-0 lead into the locker room.

"We felt like, for the most part, we played a good first half," Wildcats head coach Ryan Boyer said. "There's always things that we probably could've done better, but overall, we were

very pleased."

The third quarter presented the most adversity for the Wildcats.

After going 3 and out on their first drive of the second half, Warsaw faced 4th and 2 and brought on the punt team. A Cardinals defender slipped through the line, nearly untouched, to block Gemes' punt. He picked it up and raced to the 13 yard line of Warsaw before being drug down by Gemes.

It was the defense that came through yet once again for the Wildcats when they came up with stop after stop on 7 plays, including 1st and goal from the 2 to put the ball back into the hands of the offense after a strong goal line stand.

An ensuing 9 play drive for Warsaw ended with an interception after bouncing off the hands of Murrell who went to the ground with cramps. The senior would return later in the game. The third quarter provided no scoring as the Wildcats held on to the 26-0 lead.

Warsaw's final touchdown of the night came with 5:37 left on the clock. With the offense content with grinding out time left on the clock, Garrett Ferguson handed off to Shane Poyser on a sweep coming from left to right. Poyser went back, then found a crease and turned on the jets as he picked up big blocks from Murrell and Harvath on his way to a 66-yard touchdown run. Gemes' PAT was successful and that score capped the Wildcats 33-0 win.

Warsaw rushed for 280 yard on the night, led by Depriest with 87, Poyser with 66, Depriest with 59 and Ferguson with 43. Depriest tallied 2 TD's while 1 each was added by

Harvath, Gemes and Poyser. Ferguson completed 4 of 9 passes for 38 yards.

The stingy Warsaw defense was led by Murrell with 10.5 tackles. He was followed by Harvath with 6.5 and Depriest with 5.5. Murrell added 1.5 sacks, Harvath and Todd each had 1 and J.C. Minks picked up a 0.5 sack.

The Wildcats will travel to Adrian for their first OHC game of the year this Friday.

Good pressure on the ball from the front line led by Matthew Cook, Ben Eckhoff, Myles Harms and Ethan Goosen held Willow Springs scoreless in the first half as the Cards led, 8-0.

Coach Brad Drehle must have had a good locker room speech as the Cardinals came out flying in the second half of play.

Parrott made a couple of good defensive plays on long passes that prevented the Bears from getting things turned around and back into the game.

After the TD, a rifle pass to Everhart made it 16-0 and

the Cardinals were on their way.

Everhart would score on a short run at the 5:48 mark for the 22-0 score. A nice pass to Cade Rutherford for the 2-point conversion made it 24 to zip in the final minute of the third, Everhart would ramble in again for the touchdown and Elijah Smith raced in for the PAT. It was 32-0 and the fat lady was ready to sing.

In the fourth, Lincoln wore down and the Bears scored on a nice run by freshman QB Caden Lee at the 6:59 mark to make it 32-7 with the added successful kick through the uprights.

The Bears scored again on a nice run by Tucker Bryan with just minutes left in the contest. The kick was blocked.

Coach Dehle said, "We tired late in game and lost focus a little bit."

Elijah Smith was 6 for 134 yards rushing. Everhart was 17 for 146 rushing with a TD and 3 of 26 receiving with 1 TD and 2 PAT's. He also led Lincoln with 13 tackles.

Up next at Lincoln will be Tipton, who defeated California 40-7 at home last week. Should be a huge challenge.

To Willow Springs credit, they left their home at two in the afternoon to make the three hour journey. Winless a year ago, they have a new coaching staff and some 47 athletes. Like most teams, they should improve as the season wears on.

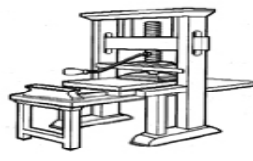

"I'll Keep Sal!"

My Uncle strode behind the mule to turn the rocky soil, while his small son sat beneath a tree at the end of the furrows. It was the 1930s and such was the plight of a man without a woman in the hills.

At about the same time period, a Hillman had lost his wife to the grim reaper and his life was being complicated by a long dry spell. The despairing husband had followed her to the grave and was the last to leave the burying ground. About six weeks later a friend of his from town drove out to see how the widower was doing. He found him sitting on the porch staring hopelessly at the cloudless sky. "If it would only turn in and rain," he stated, "I wouldn't ask nothin' of nobody."

"I suppose the dry weather is hard on the crops," observed the town visitor. "It ain't the crops I'm worried about," remarked the widower, "it's Miss Darcy Johnson. She swears she won't marry me till it rains."

The remark puzzled the visitor and he asked, "Why not?" With a deep sigh the Hillman explained: "She allows that it wouldn't be showin' proper respect for my first wife to marry before my tracks in the graveyard is washed out. I shore do wish it would turn in and rain. I been courtin' her six weeks. Good Lord, a man can't wait on the weather forever."

Marriage there, as in other rural communities, was a necessary institution. Young people didn't decide if they wanted to marry, only who they would marry. If a partner died, neither a man nor a woman remained unmarried for long. It was hard for a country man to farm without a woman's help, especially if he had a brood of children. His days would begin with dressing the children, preparing them a morning meal, care for the livestock and then go to the field and work until noon. He then prepared a noon

meal, watered his stock and returned to the fields, only to return at sundown to do the evening chores, preparing the evening meal and getting the children into bed. All of this was more than a one man job even without the cleaning and laundry. A man needed a woman on the place. Sometimes a man's need for a wife would necessitate a detailed explanation of the composition of the family.

A woman in the hills was heard to explain, "I'm John's third woman. Five of the kids are ours. One he got by his second woman and the oldest one is by his first woman."

All of this could even lead to huge age differences. There was an Eli Simmons, aged sixty-five and his wife was only twenty-four. Some of her step-children were twice as old as she, which just goes to show that no matter how battered the skillet is, you can always find a lid to fit.

My grandmother used to remark when an aged or ugly woman caught a husband, "even a poor jug don't lack for a stopper." This brings to mind the tale about the Ozarker that traveled up to St. Louis on business. He had never been in a big city before. He walked down the streets, looked in all the windows and was really enjoying himself. At one place he saw a sign which read: "Woman's Exchange."

The hayseed thought about this for a moment and then hurried into the store, which was filled with various specimens of feminine articles of attire.

Behind the counter was a very tall, very gaunt, and very spinster like person. The Hillman looked her up and down and thought to himself, "She's so ugly that you'd have to blindfold the baby before it would suck."

Nevertheless, he looked around for another female but did not see another soul. He eyed her keenly and asked, "Be you the woman?" She replied quite primly, "I guess I am." "Well, I guess I'll keep Sal." He said apologetically and hurried out.

the service to that area. Huge segments north of Lincoln and west are without and an area west of Warsaw also. The latter areas will be put out to bid for service.

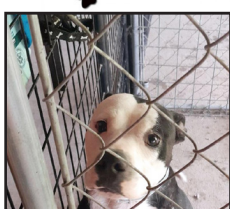

The RFSI grant she and Amie Breshears have worked diligently on is forthcoming for a local business and it is sizeable but she cannot announce details just yet.

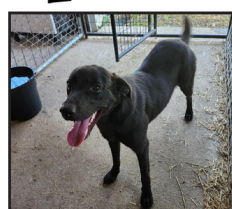

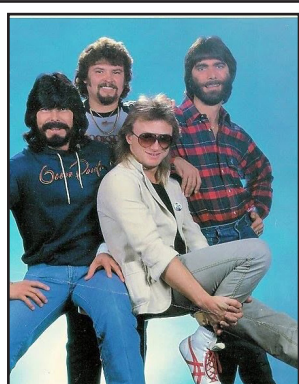

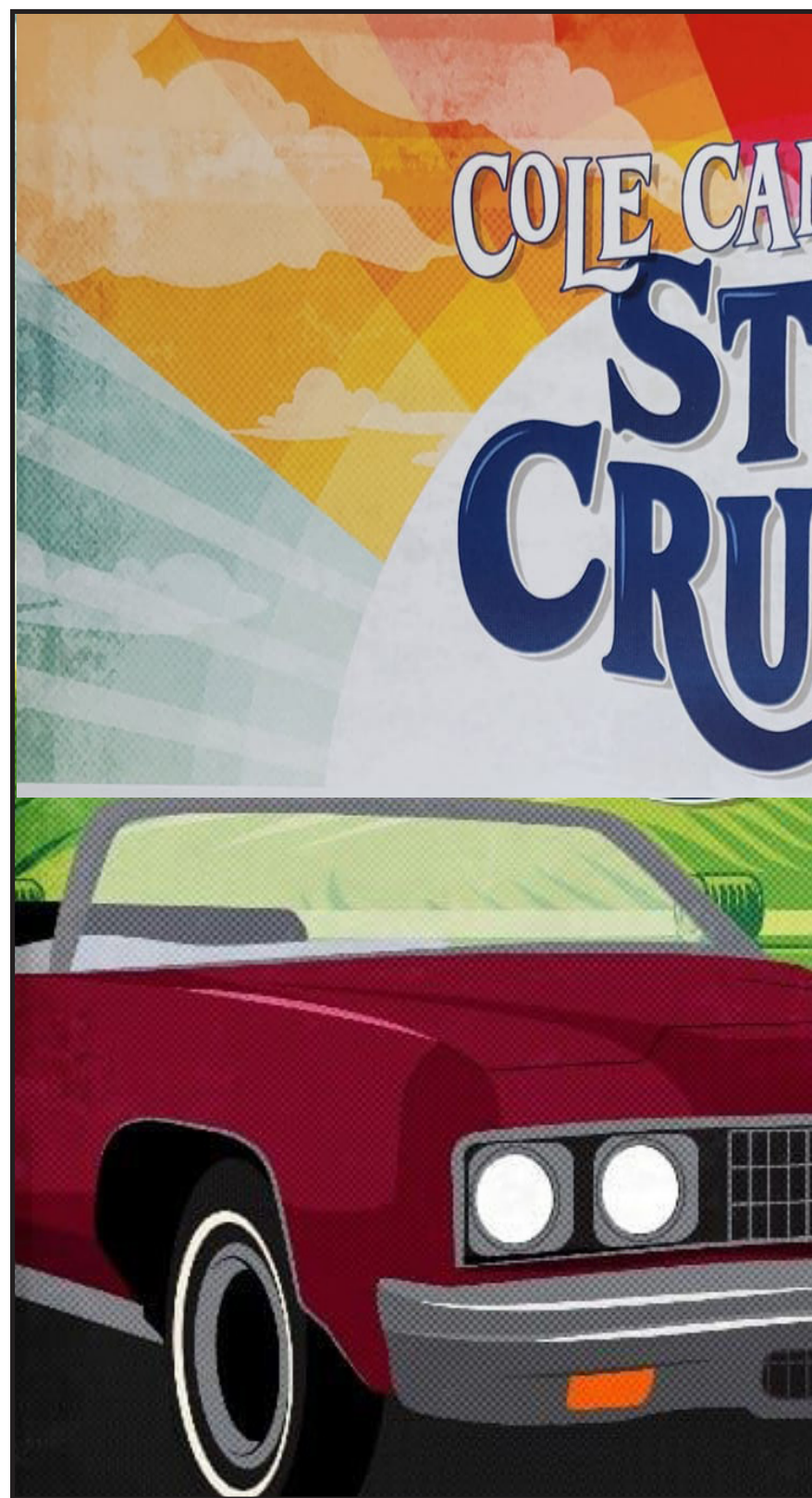

It's probably not on your calendar, but September is Life Insurance Awareness Month. And it's indeed a pretty good idea to be aware of what life insurance can do for you.

Life insurance can help you in two main ways. First, life insurance policies offer a death benefit that can assist your family if you're no longer around. And second, some types of life insurance offer the chance to build cash value, which can work for you during your lifetime.

Let's look at the death benefit first. If something were to happen to you, your life insurance proceeds could help your family meet at least three major needs:

- **Paying a mortgage** – The biggest expense many families face is their monthly mortgage. If you weren't around, could your family continue paying the mortgage? Or would they have to move? With a sufficient life insurance death benefit, they could remain in their home, meeting the monthly mortgage payments, or perhaps pay off the loan entirely (although this might not be in their best financial interest).

- **Paying for education** – If you have young children, you may already be saving for their college education — because you know college is expensive. Without your income, would college, or some other form of post-secondary education or training, still be realistic? Again, the proceeds from an insurance policy could make the difference.

- **Paying off debts** – You might have a car loan, credit card debt or other financial obligations. If your surviving spouse is a joint account holder for these debts, they could still be liable for paying them off. But insurance proceeds could be used to retire the debts immediately, or over time.

All life insurance policies

offer a death benefit. But permanent insurance, unlike term insurance, also offers the chance to build cash value — which can be a valuable supplement to your IRA and 401(k) or other retirement accounts.

A cash value policy such as whole life also can provide flexibility for changing financial needs or emergencies in retirement. And here's another key advantage: Because this type of policy provides fixed, guaranteed returns, it is not dependent on the performance of the financial markets and is thus insulated from the market downturns that can happen while you're retired. So, taking money from the cash value of your whole life policy may help you avoid selling investments that have temporarily declined in value.

Keep in mind, though, that the premiums for a cash value policy will generally be substantially higher than those for term insurance. That's why some people choose to "buy term and invest the difference" rather than purchase a permanent life policy with cash value. Whether this strategy is right for you depends on a few different factors, perhaps the most important of which is your ability and willingness to consistently invest the money you would have otherwise placed in a cash value policy.

In any case, should you choose cash value insurance, you generally have three ways to get at the money: withdrawals, loans or surrender of the policy. You'll want to weigh all the factors involved — including taxes and the effect on the policy's death benefit — when deciding on how to access the cash value.

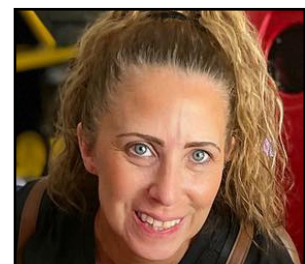

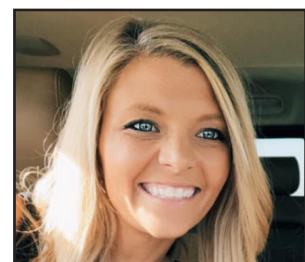

There is a line in an old song that says, "Little things mean a lot." That is true for Christian behavior. Sometimes, we assume that we are in

One of the little things that can ruin our Christian testimony is found in 1 Cor. 13, where Paul reminds us that "Love is not rude." I recall one well-known pastor in Decatur, IL, who did not like tobacco smoke in a restaurant. He said, "Since you were so kind as to share your smoke with me, I thought I would share my gum." I laughed at the time, but I wondered what kind of witness that made. I don't like tobacco smoke either, but is it a good solution to be rude?

We have all been rude at times. The point is we need to think about how our rude behavior impacts non-Christians' lives. It may seem like a little thing, but if rude behavior discourages even one person from considering the claims of Christ, is it worth it? Think about it. Christians should be the politest persons on the face of the earth.

What is your labor of love?

I Thessalonians 1:3, Hebrews 6:10

With Labor Day passing, I was reminded of the above passage. A labor of love is something performed voluntarily, totally out of love and not for monetary gain, reward, praise or to be seen by men.

I have four quick thoughts on this subject that I would like to share.

I heard people say they are Christians but do not go to church and have no ministry to speak of. They say they pray as if they are doing God a favor. By the way, attending church is a labor of love.

IV. For God is not unrighteous to forget your labor of love which you have shewed toward his name, in that you have ministered to the saints and do minister (Heb 6:10).

Not for treasures in heaven but for the glory of God. For the record, I know people who have a labor of love.

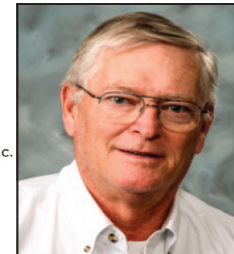
