Visitor Center Could Get Life Line With USACE Consolidation Plans

The Kansas City District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will hold a public meeting on May 1, 2025, at 530 P.M> to discuss office consolidation efforts at Harry S. Truman Lake. The public is encouraged to attend the meeting to learn more about the preliminary office consolidation effort for budget and design, and to discuss interests and concerns with the USACE team. The meeting will be held in the Truman Lake Visitors' Center.

Current USACE office space at Harry S. Truman Lake is inadequate and unsafe; therefore, some project staff have been temporarily relocated. USACE has evaluated consolidate options to

staff workspaces to achieve long term operation and maintenance efficiencies, if funding becomes available. The recommendation is to consolidate the office space

will provide the Visitors' Center the ability to remain open and possibly expand the current hours of operation, to maintain efficient and effective levels of public education and interpretation missions while reducing operational costs.

Mile Long Bridge Scene Of Deadly Vehicle Crash



TRAGEDY UNFOLDED Friday evening with the death of two Clinton residents who were involved in a vehicle accident on the Mile Long Bridge. One of the vehicles a Chevrolet Tahoe flipped over the structure and sank to the bottom of Truman Lake. The Tahoe was pulled to the

surface on Saturday. A report has been released by the Missouri State Highway Patrol after a head on collision that killed two Clinton residents on Friday evening. According to the report, the crash happened around 8:45 PM after a woman driving south on Missouri 7 Highway

over the Mile Long Bridge crossed into the path of an

oncoming vehicle. The woman's Dodge Avenger hit a 26 year old northbound man's Chevrolet Tahoe head-on. This caused the Chevrolet, which was towing a boat, to hit the edge of the

current operating hours, will continue to share information with the public, and seek input on certain design elements of the office consolidation plan.

There will be a short presentation by USACE staff on the recommendation and floor plan overview, followed by an open forum for questions and comments, including the opportunity to submit written comments.

Back in November, Clint Mason, Branch Chief from the Kansas City District, addressed a group of concerned citizens at the meeting and offered some possible solutions to the problem of how to keep the Visitors' Center open throughout the year. One solution was to remodel the Visitors' Center and make 18 work stations so all of the Truman Dam staff could be together in the building on the bluff. If this were to happen then the current administration building and the two houses behind the building would be abandoned and possibly demolished.

"We currently have offices the Administration Building across the lake from the Visitors' Center," "We also said Mason. are currently using the houses behind the two Administration Building for offices. These houses were built for living quarter for Corps employees, but they have been converted into office spaces. These houses were built in the 70s and are in need of repair. After a feasibility study in December, costing approximately \$270,000, Travis Rayfield, the District Kansas City Commander, will make the final decision on whether or not the three current buildings will be torn down and the Visitors' Center will become the main office for employees of Truman Dam and Reservoir."

If the plan is approved then the land where the present administration office sits could be used by the City of

Warsaw for campgrounds or other recreational venues.

The Harry S. Truman Regional Visitor Center, one of only a handful of Class A visitors' centers in the United States, sits atop Kaysinger Bluff and provides a spectacular view of Truman Dam and Reservoir. Exhibits within the Visitors' Center provide information about the rich history of the Osage River Valley from pre-civilization to modern day. Waterfowl, bald eagles, and turkey vultures can routinely be observed from the observation deck.

If the Visitors' Center is remodeled then some of the exhibits will have to go because the work stations will take up some of the present exhibit space. The plan is to keep the viewing area available for the public and if this happens then visitors will be able to go into the center throughout the week as the staff will be working there.

Presently, the Visitors' Center is only open Friday, Saturday, Sunday and on Mondays following a holiday from 9 AM until 4 PM from April until September.

Rich Chiles of the US Army Corps of Engineers said that the plan is to consolidate the project office and the visitor's center.

"There presently is no funding to remodel the visitors' center but our plans are to remodel the visitors' center so we can accommodate our work force and allow visitors to enjoy the great view from the visitors' center," said Chiles. "This will also allow us to keep the visitors' center open more days since we will be working there."

The architectural firm of Linscott, Haylett and Associates, AIA, of Kansas City, Missouri, designed the Visitors' Center. Construction on the building began in 1975, and was completed in 1977 by Miller-Stauch Construction Company of Kansas City, Kansas. Kaysinger Bluff provides a natural setting for the structure's contemporary design, with the exterior and interior surface treatment developed to blend with the surroundings both in texture and color.

Upon entering building, a large map greets the visitor, showing the location of all park areas at Truman Reservoir. Visitor Attendants are on duty at the reception desk to answer questions about the project and lake area. Truman Lake Brochures and other informational pamphlets are available to visitors. Directly behind the information desk is an orientation and welcome video. The paintings on display in the building are by the late E.M "Ike" Parker. Exhibits on the main floor provide information on the lake area, Harry S. Truman, Partnerships, Living History and westward expansion. Wildlife, history, and water safety videos are available by request for viewing in a

67-seat theater.

The rotunda area contains reproductions of archaeological fossils and artifacts found in an area now covered by the waters of Truman Reservoir. On the south wall is a life-sized painting of the Missouri Leviathan, a creature once thought by scientist Albert E. Koch to have roamed the area. Actually, the bones of this extinct "creature" were that of many Mastodons and other creatures that Koch discovered in the area in 1840. Ramps on each side of the rotunda lead to the observation deck. A social history time line depicting the exploration and settlement of the Osage River Valley is displayed on the north wall for viewing as visitors walk up the north ramp.

Exhibits on the upper deck explain Truman Lake's role in cultural history, wildlife, and environmental management, the operation of the powerhouse, Corps of Engineers Missions, and Construction of the Harry S. Truman Project. Views from the upper deck allow visitors to see both Truman Lake and the Lake of the Ozarks. Visitors get a sense of the construction and operation of Truman Dam, which separates the two lakes.

Other items of interest within the Harry S. Truman Visitors' Center Complex include a nature trail along Kaysinger Bluff (approximately 3/4 mile), the Hooper House and Barn, the Log Cabin complex, the Kaysinger General Store, and the Concord Schoolhouse located just off the Hooper House Trail.

In addition to the regular summer operation of the Visitors' Center, the area is open during Heritage Days and the Kaysinger Christmas celebration.

(Continued from Page 1) permanent areas of grass and trees on land that needed protection from erosion, to act as windbreaks, or in places where vegetation improve water quality or provide food and habitat for wildlife. The farmers entered 10 to 15 year contracts with the Commodity Credit Corporation. In return, they received annual rental payments, incentive payments for certain activities and cost-share assistance to establish the protective vegetation. This CRP program was one of Federal Governments largest improvement programs and one of its most productive and costefficient.

During his career with the FSA Brent also worked with Farm loans and Price Support programs as well as the CRP programs. He

was a good fit as he grew up in the Ionia area where his parents resided on a farm west of town. The adjoining farm was his grandfather's and Brent now lives there while his brother Neil adjoins him on their father's place. The boys have the land rented out and still pursue their love of music, as most locals know. Their band, Midnight Hour, played at many venues over the

years in the area. Now both boys, Neil and Brent, have joined forces with Kelly Jones in a new musical pursuit. They buy and resell vintage musical instruments and amplifiers, etc. This I discovered when I asked the typical retirement question of, "Do you have any trips planned?" Brent replied the trio will soon be headed for Texas in their interesting new recreational hobby.

When further questioned about a Bucket List he replied, "I used to think I'd like to go to Europe but I haven't thought about that in a long time. Maybe being on the road with Leroy Van Dyke cured my traveling ideas." VanDyke himself is winding down as Brent only performed two shows with him in 2024.

Brent was retiring in September of 2025 but has now taken Technical Administrative leave and is no longer going into the office. Rogena Whitney, the other FSA office employee, has been transferred to working in the Hickory County office four days a week. Rogena is in Lincoln on Wednesday and the other four days can be reached by telephone, as the call transfers to Hickory County.

(Continued from Page 1) The Warsaw R-IX Board of Education officers for the 2025-26 school year are: President Leslie Grace, Vice President Amie Breshears, Secretary/Treasurer Karr, and MSBA delegate Amie Breshears.

The regular meeting began with student, staff, and community recognitions. The recipients included Deckard-Student Jaxson Spotlight; Andrea Ferguson-Classified Staff Member of the Month; Jackie Downing-Certified Staff Member of the Month; and the Warsaw Shrine Club-Wildcat Pride

Award recipient.

The meeting included two program spotlights: the first by kindergarten, first, and second grade teachers, who shared an overview of their classroom learning strategies and activities; and the second, a review of the district's Title I Program, requirements, covering regulations, federal student selection criteria, district priorities, Title I team, budget and funding allocations, and program goals.

New business started with a review of the district's March Revenue and Expenses, available online on the district website under the "About" section, by selecting "Board of Education" and then "Financials." district's fund 4 budget and plans for various projects this summer were also reviewed.

In other new business, the board approved the substitute salary schedule and CTC driver rate of pay for the 2025-26 school year, the 2025 senior graduates, the 2025 summer school rate of pay for both certified and classified employees, and surplus property from the technology department. The board also approved a \$27,991.33 project to service the outdoor athletic bleachers recommended by the district's insurance company.

During the closed session, eight resignations, fifteen new hires, and the 2025 summer school custodial staff was approved. The board also approved all classified employees work agreements, all classified salaries that are not on the salary schedule and extra duty stipends for the 2025-26 school year. All internal moves were also discussed. Community members interested in a position within the district are invited to check out the job vacancies that are posted on the district's website.

The next Warsaw R-IX Board Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 20 at 6:00 PM in the HS/JBMS Library. The 44 year old female was pronounced dead at the scene. The 26 year old man was recovered from the lake and pronounced dead soon after. His Chevrolet was pulled from the water on Saturday, closing the Mile Long Bridge for several hours. Officials also confirmed that two dogs were recovered from the Chevrolet, both dead.

According to the MSHP, neither victim was wearing a seat belt at the time of the collision. To date this year, Troop A has investigated 20 fatal crashes in their eleven county area, with a total of 23 fatalities reported.

Well known Benton County resident and owner of Tolliver's Towing, Jeff Tolliver, reported, "I've done this for 24 years. That's the first vehicle I've known to ever go over the Mile Bridge."







Until recently, if you received a pension from a job that did not pay into Social Security and you've also worked in a job that did, your Social Security benefits at retirement were reduced based on your pension income.

As of Jan. 5, 2025, that's no longer the case, thanks to the Social Security Fairness Act. Now, you'll receive both your pension and your fully earned Social Security benefits because the Act Windfall repealed the Elimination Provision (WEP).

This new law also repealed the Government Pension Offset (GPO) provision had which reduced spousal or survivor Social Security benefits for people employed in government jobs. These benefits will be increased in 2025.

There are nearly 3 million people who, depending on their situation, may see their benefits increase - from very little to \$1,000 a month or more. Those impacted fall into these professional categories: teachers, firefighters, and police officers in many states; and federal employees covered by the Civil Service Retirement System.

The Act is retroactive to January 2024, and the Social Security Administration paid an additional lump sum benefit to affected people in March 2025. Going forward, most monthly income "raises" appear on April checks (for March benefits). A few more complex cases may take a little longer.

A word of caution beware of scammers. The Social Security Administration doesn't tend to call, email or text; they'll send a letter regarding changes to your retirement benefits. And they will never ask you to pay for assistance or to have your benefits started, increased, or paid retroactively. But you can call the SSA at 800-772-1213 to ask if your retirement benefits have changed.

Plan for your increased retirement income

Of course, everyone's needs are different, so there's no one "right" way to handle a lump sum benefit or a monthly raise in income. But here are a few suggestions:

• Pay off some debts. If you have credit card debt a car or student loan, you may want to pay it down, or even pay it off.

• Invest in an individual retirement account (IRA). If you still have "earned" income - from wages, salaries, tips, bonuses, commissions, employment earnings or long-term disability payments you

contribute from these sources to an IRA. There are tax benefits and an array of investment choices, so it's an excellent way to build resources for retirement.

• Save for college. If you have children, or grandchildren, who have college in their plans, you might want to put some money into a college savings vehicle, such as a 529 plan, which provides tax benefits and gives you great flexibility in distributing the money.

Different Flowers from the Same Garden.

Once upon a time there was a lovely fence that encased the yard here at the old homestead. My Grandfather John built it shortly before he died. Sadly all that remains are the crumbling stone corner posts and the tilting concrete support walls. I have been urged by some to have that "eyesore" removed and buried but that old wall holds a vestige of my childhood that I'm not ready to discard. On it can be found various hand prints with names and dates. They belong to me and my Chehaski Cousins. my Grandfather painstakingly erected that fence in the last summer of his life, he had each of us press our hands into the fresh wet concrete. Then

our name and our age

was scratched beside it.

A couple of years ago, I,

and two of those cousins

strolled around the yard

and searched out our

names, each of us seemed

to know just where to look

in the parapet.

With the rush of emotion that we felt at discovering "ourselves" on the concrete support, came floods of memories that we lovingly shared, memories that bind us as a unit as strong and steadfast as the ancient concrete itself. It made me know the truth in an old quote; that we were "cousins by blood but friends by choice.

I feel a sorrow for the children of today. They are growing into adulthood in a nucleus family which lives unto itself. With no relatives, no support and that puts the child and that tiny family unit in an impossible situation. Few of them will ever relate to a bumper sticker I chanced to read recently. It said: "In the cookies of life, cousins are the chocolate chips."

Family folklore taught me as a child that "persons" grow on family trees. It taught me that we had unique family expressions, food, mementos and "inside jokes" that no one else could ever possibly

find amusing because they didn't know the history of the anecdote. The maternal side of my family was small compared to Dad's side. In fact I'm still meeting people that are third, fourth and fifth cousins. And then there are the first cousins once removed.

Usually people were just identified to me that they were "cousins". No one ever explained the degrees of cousins; maybe because it was too confusing to them too. I actually found a chart recently that defines the bewildering subject. For example a first cousin has two of the same grandparents as you would. Second cousins share the same great-grandparents, third cousins have the same great-great grandparents and fourth cousins have the same great-great-great grandparents and so on.

When the word "removed" is used to describe a relationship, it indicates that the people are from different generations. I and my first cousins are the same generation (or two generations younger than our grandparents) so "removed" is not used to describe our relationship.

The words "once removed" means that there is a difference of one generation. An example being that my Mother's first cousin would be my first cousin "once removed". This is because I am one generation younger than my Mother's cousin. And twice removed means two generations difference.

"Removed" and "once removed" wasn't used much in Mother's family but I heard the term frequently in Daddy's. Possibly because that part of the family tree had some roots that ran deeply into the southern side of the Mason-Dixon line.

I knew a lady once that was forever referring to her "Kissing Cousins" and I never quite knew what that term meant. Upon doing some research on the subject I discovered the term is understood in different ways to different people. It can mean

Cousins that know each other well enough that they greet each other with a kiss. Cousins that are not related by blood (they have married into your family) thus they become "kissable" by marriage. And then there are the cousins that actually marry each other, such as Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. Or our own Jesse James that married his first cousin Zerelda "Zee" Mimms.

I grew up believing that they had married what I was taught to know as "Forbidden Relatives". In this country there is actual legislation against marriage between first cousins based on biological risk to the offspring.

Now it comes to light that there were European countries prohibited such marriages and that it was done in America to promote more rapid absorption of the immigrants. As mentioned before, Queen Victoria and Prince Albert were prime examples of first cousin marriages which proved to be a great love story. Unfortunately their grandchildren went to war with each other in World War 1. Few of us ever pause to think that Russia. England, Germany, etc; were ruled by "cousins", talk about a family feud.

Life moves on sometimes repeats itself in small ways. In my back yard lies concrete impressions of my nine grandchildren's hand prints. A Mother's Day gift from them a couple of years ago. What a priceless treasure they are to me and I am searching for the proper spot to install them in the landscape here on the Creek. A special spot that they can stroll to in their later years to search out their hand prints and recall their individual memories about good times with their "cousins" The cousins that are different beautiful flowers all from the same garden.







Shelly loved her family dearly, caring for each child as her own. They always knew where to go if they needed something. Shelly was always sure to give her whole heart to each of them.






