























# Rebels Make History with First State Tournament

MURFREESBORO (March 14) The McKenzie High School Rebels earned the first state tournament win in program history Thursday with a 68-49 victory over the University School-Johnson City Buccaneers in the quarterfinal round of the TSSAA Class A Boys' Basketball Cham-

pionships. The Rebels led from the opening tip, jumping out to a doubledigit lead in the first three minutes. The Buccaneers would make several brief runs to cut into the deficit, including an impressive burst in the third quarter to cut the gap to six, but overall, the Rebels outscored USJC in each

#### period. McKenzie Rebels 68, **University School-Johnson**

City Buccaneers 49 The Rebels had an 18-10 lead after the first frame, led by Lucas King with six points. Nate Whitsell scored five, including a three-pointer. Lazarick Hill also hit a three, and Ben Austin and Micah Austin each had a pair. Kaleb Meredith led the Buccaneers with five points. Charles Vargo hit a three, and Jonathan Fleenor had a pair.

McKenzie had a 13-11 edge in the second quarter, led by Whitsell with five points, again with a three. M. Austin also hit a three, and Hill scored three points. B. Austin added a pair. Meredith led USJC with nine points, including a three, and Vargo added a pair. At the half, the Rebels led 31-21.

The Rebels enjoyed a 20-15 advantage in the third, led by B. Austin with seven points. King and Hill each scored four, M. Austin hit another three-pointer, and Whitsell added a pair. Meredith had 14 of the Buccaneers' points with a pair of threes, and Mason Broome hit a free throw. Heading into the final frame, McKenzie

McKenzie outscored the Buccaneers 17-13 in the fourth to seal the win, led by B. Austin with six points. Hill scored three points, King, Whitsell and M. Austin each added a pair, and Lane Horton and Caleb Gill each hit a free throw. Meredith led USJC with eight points, including a pair of threes. Daniel David also hit a three-pointer, and Jacob Hubbard

had a pair.

Ben Austin led McKenzie in scoring with 17 points, including a perfect 5-for-5 at the free throw line. He was just two blocks shy of a triple-double with eight to go along with 18 rebounds. Nate Whitsell had 14 points with a pair of threes, five rebounds and a block. Lazarick Hill scored 13

points with a three and had five rebounds, five assists and two steals. Lucas King had 12 points, six assists, three rebounds, a block and a steal. Micah Austin scored ten points with a pair of threepointers and had three rebounds and a steal. Caleb Gill had one point and one rebound, and Lane Horton had one point. Tyler Spiv-

ey had two rebounds and two assists. Evan Jarrett had a rebound. Overall, the Rebels shot 58.1 percent from the field and 62.5

percent from three-point range. Their free throw percentage was 76.5. They out-rebounded USJC 39-31. Buccaneer Kaleb Meredith led all scorers with 36 points including five three-pointers.

He was 7-for-8 at the free throw line and led the team with nine rebounds. He also had a block and two steals. Charles Vargo scored five points with a three and had five rebounds and a steal.

USJC was held to 26.6 percent shooting from the field and 23.3 percent on threes but shot 66.7 percent from the line.


















# Rebels End Historic Season with Semifinal Loss

MURFREESBORO (March 15) – The McKenzie Rebels saw a historic season come to an end Friday as they fell 66-55 to the Humboldt Vikings in the semifinals of the TSSAA Class A State Boys Basketball Tournament at Middle Tennessee State Univer-

sity's Murphy Center. The Rebels never had a lead in the contest. The Vikings led by a dozen at the half, but McKenzie came out strong from the break with a 16-6 run to pull within two points. Humboldt stifled the rally and built the lead back to

double digits with two minutes left to play. The Vikings hit their free throws late to hold off the Rebels and claim the win.

The loss ends the high school basketball careers of seniors Ben Austin, Tyler Spivey, Brandon Hobson and manager Stephone Haynes.

## **Humboldt Vikings 66,**

McKenzie Rebels 55 The Vikings jumped out to an 18-11 lead after the opening frame, led by Anthony Jones with six points. Ronald Abernathy and Montrez Ward each scored five, Abernathy with a three-pointer, and Reginald Manley had a pair. Ben Austin

led the Rebels with six points,

including a three. Lucas King scored three points, and Nate Whitsell had a pair.

Humboldt added to the lead with a 20-15 advantage in the second quarter, led by Abernathy, Ward and Jones with six points each, Ward on a pair of threes. Malik Cox had a pair. B. Austin led McKenzie with eight points. Whitsell hit a threepointer, and King and Lazarick Hill each had a pair. At the half, the Vikings led 38-26.

The Rebels rallied 20-11 to cut the deficit in the third, led by King with nine points, including a three-pointer. B. Austin scored four, and Hill hit a three. Whitsell and Lane Horton each had a pair. Jones led Humboldt with four points, and Trent Green hit a three. Ward and Manley each added a pair. Heading into the fi-

nal frame, the Vikings led 49-46. Humboldt sealed the win with a 17-9 tilt in the fourth, led by Ward with eight points. Abernathy scored seven, and Jones added a pair. King scored five for McKenzie, including a three. and Hill and B. Austin each

added a pair. Ben Austin led the Rebels with 20 points, including a three-pointer. He also led the team all players with ten rebounds and had two assists and three blocks. Lucas King scored 19 with a pair of threes and had three rebounds and four assists. Nate Whitsell had seven points with a three, seven rebounds, three assists, a block and a steal. Lazarick Hill also scored seven with a three-pointer and had two rebounds, an assist and three steals. Lane Horton had two points and an assist. Tvler Spivey had a rebound and an assist. Micah Austin had a rebound, an assist and a steal.

McKenzie shot 45.3 percent from the field and 27.8 percent from three-point range. They hit two of just four free throw attempts for 50 percent. The Rebels out-rebounded Humboldt

30-22. Viking Montrez Ward led all scorers with 21 points, including a pair of threes and a perfect 7-for-7 at the line. He had three


assists and a steal. Anthony Jones scored 18 points and had nine rebounds, an assist, seven blocks and four steals. Ronald Abernathy also scored 18 points, including a three-pointer, and had four rebounds, a block and three steals. Reginald Manley had four points and two rebounds. Trent Green hit a threepointer and had three rebounds, five assists and a steal. Malik Cox had two points.

Humboldt shot 56.1 percent from the field and 44.4 percent from three-point range. They hit 16 of 21 free throws for 76.2 percent.
