



Comer Looks to Lead Rebels 'Back to Where We Belong'

The McKenzie Rebels are looking to rebound from back-to-back seasons in which they narrowly missed the postseason.

Last year, they were plagued by injuries early in the season, which, coupled with a tough non-region schedule, led to an 0-5 start. The Rebels turned things around in the second half, winning three of four to go into the final week with a shot at the playoffs. They came up just short, but the underclassmen would carry into the offseason some momentum, confidence and hunger for more winning.

Head Coach Wade Comer hopes to build on that momentum going into this season.

He's got a young squad, but despite the team's overall inexperience, Comer is pleased with the leadership of his seniors. "Kyle Maxwell has been the ringleader of that senior class and our football team. We've got good seniors. Micah Austin is doing a good job, and Evan Jarrett. I'm really proud of our leadership. It's been outstanding... We're looking for a good year."

Those seniors will be centerpieces of the Rebel offense. "Maxwell, obviously he's the leader of our offensive line. And then Evan, coming off of his injury last year, we're looking for hig things out of him

He's had a good camp so far, doing an outstanding job. Those two right there, we're gonna go how they go."

On the defensive side, Comer is relying on a lot of young players, but notes that "Kyle's anchoring that for us too on the defensive line. We're looking for Eli Surber and Will Latimer on the back end of the secondary. They've had a good camp. We're looking for some kids to step up at linebacker. Zach Chandler has had a pretty good camp, as well as [senior] Jordan Barnhart. We've got to figure out who's gonna be the linebackers, but I feel pretty good about them.'

The roster features a huge

freshmen class, but fortunately it's a group that just led the middle school team to a dominant, undefeated season. Asked who he thinks could be rookie playmakers, Comer said, "Obviously, the first one would be Marquez Taylor. He's a tremendous athlete. Jackson Cassidy's done a good job, and I think he'll help us on the defensive side also. Daniel Latimer and Jose Luna, both of them are showing signs that they can help us this year from an offensive and defensive line standpoint. We're excited about having them. It's a real good bunch. There will be several of them earning some playing time before the year's over with.

Overall, Comer sees the skilled positions as one of the team's biggest upsides. "There's going to be some growing pains there, but I think that will be an



advantage for us. And then, sizewise, the offensive and defensive lines, we're real young up there. They look the part, but it's up to us to get them to play the part."

Besides youth, Comer says the biggest thing they'll have to overcome is depth. "We're thin in some areas. That's the biggest issue. Getting those young kids up where they can play winning football. They've got the talent and everything, we've just got to get them ready."

For the third consecutive year, the Rebels will open the season against their biggest rivals, the Huntingdon Mustangs. Comer said, "I don't have to do much motivating to get them ready to play Huntingdon. Our kids will come out ready. They're excited about it. We've been on the wrong end of the deal for the last two or three

years, and we're looking to turn that around. Huntingdon has an excellent football team with high expectations. We've just gotta come out ready to play."

Comer says region play is the main focus, and McKenzie's Region 7-2A got just a little easier with the departure of Trinity Christian Academy. "We've got to get back to where we belong, getting in the playoffs and making deep runs every year, and that's what our kids are focused on right now."

The Rebels open region play September 6 against the defending state champions. "We start off with Trenton Week 3... That's the thing about our region. It is tough. The last two years, the state champions came out of our region. And in the last ten years, somebody in our region has been in the state championship game. So, when you come out of our region, you're well-conditioned for the playoffs, I can promise you."


McKenzie's overall schedule will have a much different look as they replace TCA, Scotts Hill and Waverly with Stewart County, Dresden and Obion County.

The latter of those, unbeknownst to the two schools when they first scheduled the game, will offer an added layer of intrigue. Coincidentally, former MHS Principal Tim Watkins was recently named the director of schools at Obion County, a position held at McKenzie by his brother, Lynn, making the contest not only a battle of the Rebels, but a battle







Gleason Head Coach Noah Lampkins is looking to shake things up this season, promising in an interview with The Banner that his Bulldogs will "look different than we've ever looked."

With just 20 on the roster, Lampkins is pleased that about half of them have starting experience. He describes the "nucleus" of the team, seniors Dawson Arnold and Cody O'Callaghan, junior wide receiver Elijah Young and sophomore quarterback Kolton Crochet, as "as good as any four anybody has."

He says the team has been working hard and have good team chemistry and good attitudes. "They're the best team we've had in probably six years."

And to back up the claim, the



team has had an impressive preseason with a 6-0 record in 7-on-7s.

Arnold and O'Callaghan are the only seniors, and there are just three juniors. Lampkins said, "We'll have to play some freshmen, but they don't have freshman hodies"

The Bulldogs will open the season on the road against Fulton County on Friday, August 23. Kickoff is 7 p.m.

Wolfe's War Eagles Hope to Build on Breakout 2018 Season

The West Carroll War Eagles shocked a lot of people last year, beginning early in the season with statement wins against McKenzie and Dresden. They would end the season with a 7-3 overall record and 4-2 in Region 7-1A, good enough for third and a postseason berth. After a dominant win in their playoff opener at Hillcrest, the War Eagles saw their season come to an end in the second round against powerhouse Lake County.

As the next season approaches, Head Coach Josh Wolfe told The Banner, "A season like we had last year is hard to replicate, but the things that you did to get there, you can mimic that. So that's what we're trying to do. We obviously lost some really good kids [the War Eagles fielded a dozen seniors last year], and we're trying to replace them with some upcoming juniors that didn't have to play a whole lot. We're just trying to do the things that we did to get out of the mud, so to speak, those first couple years [since he arrived in 2015].

Wolfe is looking for his five seniors to lead on the field and in the locker room. "They had 12 seniors last year, they didn't have to do as much leadership in the locker room. So they're gonna have to try to pick up the torch and run with it."

Among the seniors are Jere-

miah Bryant and Jarrius Weatherford, who saw plenty of playing time last season. Wolfe said, "They're obviously going to be a huge part of our offense." Senior Zach Perry and junior Jack Barrow also have experience, and the coach is "looking for those kids to have a breakout." He added, "We've got some quality skill guys back, we're just going to have to replace a lot

of our guys up front this year."
Bryant will be the full-time quarterback this year after splitting time at the position last year. "Hopefully he can lead us on offense."

On defense, the coach is pleased to note that, "We've pretty much got our core linebacking group back: Perry, Cody Wildridge, Barrow. Jacob Blankenship is gonna play some at linebacker. Jeremiah's in the back with Devin Rader. We're gonna have corner by committee, Dylan Cox, C.J. Ray, Kaleb Brittain, [senior] Bryce Bolton. Being 1A football, you just don't have a lot of those big kids, so you will see a lot of people up front. Just rotating guys in, trying to create some depth,

especially early on."

Wolfe is also optimistic about his rookie class. "I've got a good freshman bunch. I don't want to say right now [who may see playing time]. It's early on in camp, and a lot of them are showing good signs. We're 1A football, so it's just one of those deals, it's a catch-22. Freshmen


get to play early, but they're freshmen, so you get a bad play for every good one most of the time. But they're showing a lot of improvement."

Overall, he sees speed as one of the team's strengths, as well as experience in the skill group. "But on the flip side of that, we don't have as much experience up front. We're gonna have to try to create some experience and some depth up front with those juniors that didn't have to play a lot last year."

Wolfe is looking for consistency to take the next step forward. "You've got to embrace the grind. We're trying to get to that point where we enjoy coming to work every day. We try to get one percent better every day at practice and then carry it over to the game."

The War Eagle's schedule is nearly identical to last year. They've swapped a trip to Fulton City for a trip to Houston County in their non-region contests. They'll look to repeat against McKenzie in Week 2 to follow up what was an instant classic last year, and West Carroll fans will all have September 13 circled on their calendars as the Dresden Lions will come to Atwood. Last year's contentious barn-burner in Dresden gave the War Eagles a 2-0 region start and put them on everyone's radar.

West Carroll opens the season on the road, Friday, August 23 at Hollow Rock-Bruceton. Kickoff is at 7 p.m.

Swenson's Senior-Heavy Mustangs Looking to Breach Quarterfinal Wall

The Huntingdon Mustangs are coming off of back-to-back undefeated regular seasons and state quarterfinals appearances. Successful seasons by any measure, but no more than bitter appetizers for a program eager to feast at the big table.

The two season-ending defeats were by a combined seven points, both to the same opponent and both in dramatic, last-minute fashion. In 2017, the Cornersville Bulldogs edged out the Mustangs 21-20 in double-overtime. The two teams met again last vear. and Cornersville broke a 7-7 tie with 17 seconds remaining for a 13-7 victory.

Huntingdon's quest for vengeance will be spearheaded by the core leadership of 19 seniors, all hungry for one last shot at ultimate glory.

In an interview with The Banner, Head Coach Eric Swenson said his seniors lead more through their effort and actions than verbally. He noted that the team has been without one of its senior leaders for most of the preseason. Quarterback Hunter Ensley has been away from camp playing baseball. "He's missed some football time, some weight room time. He's also just a really good athlete. He'll pick right back up where he was whenever he gets back. He's a good leader. He had a really good year last year. The thing about Hunter is,

not been here. When he comes back in, he competes instantly. He picks right back up where he was. That's the kind of athlete

Swenson spoke about other playmakers on the offensive side. "We have Brandon Lawton back from last year. He's got an injury, we're hoping that gets better. We have Konnor Pearson who ran the ball for us last year. We expect big things out of him. He's always just solid. We have Corieon Nance who we've moved to running back. He can fly. He's one of the fastest kids in the state, he's just never played running back. A young man named Ethan Reliford who we're trying to get to step up, and Malek Cannon who we're trying to get to step up at the running back position. At receiver, we've got Noah Belew and Austin Baker. We're trying to get those guys to step up. They both started some last year. There's a lot of skill back on this team, a lot of guys who played. There's not a lot of depth at those skill positions, but we've

got some guys that can run." On the defensive side, he said, 'We've got eight back on that side of the football, and we've some guys that are thoroughly capable of stepping up. We've got this many seniors, a lot of those guys are gonna go both ways. We should be really good on defense."

Swenson addressed hitting the

where he goes. That's why you got beat, we got beat up front. don't have to worry that he's Cornersville had like 19 or 20 seniors, and we've never had that years, but Swenson predicts many until this year. I felt like we were never quite as strong overall as what they were. They just beat us physically up front. I thought it was two great football games, obviously. What we try to do to take care of that is to get stronger up front and more aggressive. We always took a lot of pride in the fact that we were physical, and to be honest, I thought we got out-physical-ed. Especially last year. I thought we played great defense, but I felt like our offensive line got out-physical-ed. That's been a point of emphasis this year. Now. I don't know if we've made much progress, maybe we have, but if you want to get to the state championship game, if you want to get out of that third round, you've got to make plays and you've got to be physical."

For the third straight year, the Mustangs will open up the season against their biggest (or at least longest-standing) rivals, McKenzie. Swenson says he's happy to get that one out of the "Yeah, I like us going ahead and doing it. It does get it out of the way. And it's a good rivalry game. You've just really got to push yourself to get ready. A lot of people open with somebody that's a little easier team. It's good though, it keeps you focused. And then right on top of that you've got Camden. That back-to-back, there's no time to tarry around. You've got to be

Huntingdon has had no trouble in Region 6-1A the last few some of the teams could show some improvement. "Wayne County graduates 20 or 21 every vear. They have a lot of numbers that come out, which is a great thing. But they don't have but a couple back on each side of the ball. But they're picked to finish one of the top two or three teams in the region. I think Collinwood will be better. I don't know about Bruceton. I think Wayne County will always be Wayne County. I don't know a whole lot about Middleton and Perry County. That's the bad thing about being here, and them being way over there. We don't hear a whole lot about them.'

Swenson says the biggest thing to overcome this year in order to make that next step is, "We can't have injuries. Our depth at the running back position is good, but it's not great. You want a big senior class, but when you have that, the depth behind you is going to be less. That's been the biggest thing, is it drops off pretty good once you get past the second group. Those guys are just real young and they're not ready to play yet."

McKENZIE — For the second year in a row the Bethel Wildcat football program will begin a season under the guidance of a new head coach. After the departure of Brent Dearmon, who left for a position at the University of Kansas, Michael Jasper assumes the reins of a program he is very familiar with.

Coach Jasper said it is an honor to be named coach of the Wildcats.

"What an honor to be named head football coach of Bethel University. My history with this university runs deep from my years of playing football for Bethel. being the first player to be drafted to the National Football League, my return back in 2016 to coach offensive line, and, mostly recently, the 2018 historic, 10-0 regular season coaching the defensive line. The fact that I'm able to lead this program now means everything. McKenzie has become home for my wife and me. This community has embraced us, and we love it here. My wife, Allison, and I are thrilled to continue to pour love and our family values into the young men of character that make

The Wildcats will need to replace several key standouts. Quarterback Sam Castronova was named the MSC Offensive Player of the Year. He finished his career with 4,639 passing yards, which is third all-time in program history. He had 39 career touchdown passes, which is also third in program history. Castronova passed for 2,453 yards this past season. He threw 28 touchdown passes, which is a new single-season record at the school. Karrheem Darrington was named First Team MSC on defense. He finished with eleven career interceptions, which ranks fourth all-time in Wildcat history. Taye Davis was second team all-conference and rushed for 31 career touchdowns, which is fourth all-time in program history. Devante Jimenez was named First Team All-Conference. He was also named Second Team NAIA All-American. He led Bethel in receptions at 34 with eight of those for touchdowns.

Coach Jasper said, "We have our hands full trying to replace men like Castro, Davis, Jimenez and Darrington. Those Cats were the backbone of our team, along with guvs like Javlen Montague. Tristan Wood, Tito Hunter, Malek Holman and Anthony Patrick, but we feel we made great headway

this spring."

The Wildcats will lean on several key returners. J'Kobi Reddick was named NAIA First Team All-American as a specialist. He was No. 1 in the nation in punt return yards per attempt at 20.9. He had 355 total yards in returns. Reddick returned four for touchdowns. Jeremy Beaulieu was named to the NAIA All-American Honorable Mention squad. Beaulieu led the Wildcats in total tackles with 96. He also had 8.5 tackles for losses. Jeremy Johnson was a First Team MSC All-Conference performer and was tied with Chris Beavers with 5.5 sacks on the season. The Wildcats also return First Team All-Conference offensive lineman Trace Pierce. Coach Jasper commented, "We are extremely happy about these young men as well several other all-conference players and performers at various positions. He added, "Along with these returners we feel great about new personnel coming in who we feel will contribute greatly to our desired goals. Some of those include wide receivers Dieuly Aristilde, Jr. and Dayzell Wilson. On defense we are excited about defensive lineman Jared Gentry and defensive back Afiz Bhadmos. These are just a few of the young men we will count on to come in and be impactful players. Whether it was signing new young talent or through the development of guys already in the program during spring practice, I feel good about the roster we have been able to put together moving forward.'

Bethel returns 34 lettermen while losing 34. The Wildcats return ten players who started at various times on offense and nine who started on defense. They lost eleven on offense and eight on defense who started at various times last year. Two return on Bethel's

These men of God take so much pride in developing young people. They are relentless and honest recruiters. They are phenomenal teachers of the game and its techniques. But most of all

they love these kids and it shows.' The staff and their No. 16 ranked Wildcats face a challenging schedule in 2019.

The Wildcats play five home games and six road game this fall. The Wildcats will meet three teams for the first time in program history. Bethel plays four of their first six games on the road.

The Cats open the season on the road Thursday, August 29 at FCS and first-time opponent Lamar University. Kick-off is slated for 7 p.m. in Beaumont, Texas.

Second-week action on September 7 will find the Cats visiting Bluefield College in Bluefield, Virginia for a MSC affair at 5 p.m. Former Bethel Head Coach Dino Kaklis serves as the Rams Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator. He coached Coach Jasper while at Bethel.

Bethel's first home game will be a conference game against Warner University on September 14 with kick-off slated for 1:30 p.m. at Wildcat Stadium. It will mark the first meeting ever between the two programs.

After an open week the Cats hit the road again traveling to West Point, Georgia to battle the Point University SkyHawks at 12:30 p.m. It will be the first meeting ever between the Cats and the Hawks.

Another Thursday night game awaits the Wildcats as they host MSC Bluegrass Divisional foe No. 13 Lindsey Wilson on October 3. Kick-off is scheduled for 6 p.m.

Williamsburg, Kentucky will find the Wildcats in a MSC Bluegrass match-up against the No. 17 Patriots of the University of the Cumberlands on October 12 with

kick-off at 12:30 p.m. The Wildcats jump back into MSC Divisional action hosting the No. 21 Tigers of Georgetown on October 19. Kick-off at Wildcat Stadium will be at 1:30 p.m.

The Wildcats travel to Lebanon, Tennessee on October 26 to meet the (RV) Cumberland Phoenix. It will be the 30th meeting between the two programs. The Wildcats have met CU more than any other opponent in program history. It will be another Bluegrass Divisional battle.

A second time opponent will come calling on November 2 as the Thomas More Saints will tangle with the Cats in another Bluegrass Divisional showdown beginning at 1:30 p.m. It will be Homecoming for the Wildcats.

The Cats travel to the Eastern Mountains of Kentucky to play the always tough Bears of the University of Pikeville on November 9 at 5 p.m.

(RV) Campbellsville University and Bethel will close out the regular season with a Bluegrass match-up at Wildcat Stadium on November 16 at 1:30 p.m.

Coach Jasper expressed his thoughts about the schedule, "I am excited, the staff is excited, and the kids are excited. We get an amazing opportunity to drive down to Beaumont, Texas and play against Lamar. They're an FCS team that, like us, had a big turnaround year last season. It will be a great challenge to get the season rolling. We jump right into conference play after that. Every week playing in the Mid-South Conference is tough, especially in the Bluegrass division. We have a bullseye on our chest after last season. In order to repeat, we have to go through the front door now. It is going to be fun."

The Wildcats are in the Bluegrass Division with Georgetown, Campbellsville, Lindsey Wilson, Cumberlands (KY), Pikeville, Thomas More and Cumberland games being divisional affairs.

The opening game against Lamar marks the 448th game in Wildcat history. The program sports a 167-271-8 record.

Bethel is ranked 16th in 2019 NAIA Football Coaches' Preseason Top 25 Poll. The Wildcats were picked third in the Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division Preseason Coaches' Poll.

Selected games can be heard this season on WEIO, 100.9 and at www.thefarmradio.com, Home action will be televised on Wildcat Vision at www.bethelathletics. com. Several home games will be aired on a delayed basis by WL-JT-TV, Channel 11.
