- preparedness for future emergencies Serve as the point of contact for disaster relief activities and
- coordinate with other agencies Prepare after-action reports following emergencies or drills to evaluate and improve response strategies

## **Oualifications:**

- Must be a U.S. citizen and at least 18 years old
- Valid Tennessee driver's license and no felony convictions
- A combination of education, training, and experience which provides the requisite knowledge, skills, and abilities for this job, which could include an Associates Degree or Bachelors Fire Science, Emergency Management, closely related field, at least five years previous experience with an emergency response agency (experience with multiple disciplines preferred), and/or training that includes progressively responsible emergency operations, disaster planning, public safety, hazardous materials operations. personnel management and public relations
- Knowledge of emergency management principles, disaster response, and relevant laws
- Must complete required FEMA and TEMA training within 24 months of employment
- Strong computer skills and ability to use emergency management software

This position requires strong leadership, communication, and decision-making skills, along with the ability to manage complex emergency situations.
