## 'He's impacted so many lives'

### MV teacher battles cancer, community to host fundraiser

After undergoing several surgeries and starting treatment following a head and neck cancer diagnosis in September, Missouri Valley fifth grade teacher Taylor Herman is back home and feeling grateful for the community's support.

In late September, Herman noticed a sore on the side of his tongue that was continually growing in size. After being prescribed steroids and not seeing any results, the sore was biopsied and found to be

cancerous.

Treatment and surgeries moved quickly from that point on, Herman said.

"They removed the tumor from my tongue and lymph nodes from under my chin. They took half my tongue," Herman said. "They reconstructed half of my tongue with a part of my forearm and then they took a vein out my forearm and replaced the vein in my neck."

He has also had several other minor surgeries, including a feeding tube that is connected directly into his stom-

ach. He recently started chemotherapy treatment as well.

Herman, who is 28 years old and in his second year of teaching at Missouri Valley Elementary, said he always knew he wanted to be a teacher when he grew up.

"Just the thought of providing kids with a quality education and being able to set them up to be successful adults was what really interested me in education," Herman said. "The positivity that takes place

## Little Sioux Scout Ranch a priority for INHF

The Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation (INHF) is hoping to raise \$2 million dollars towards the purchase of the Little Sioux Scout Ranch by the end of this year.

The Gilwell Foundation, which owns the land used by the Mid-America Council of the Boy Scouts of America, conducted a year-long study in 2021 and found that usage rates of the property weren't where they used to be. Because of that, it was hard to justify holding onto it with all that goes into managing such a big chunk of land.

So, they approached the INHF to see if it would have any interest in buying the property.

"We immediately did just because of the spe-

cial place this is in and the special properties of this area," Joe Jayjack, Communications Director for INHF, said. "We wanted to see it stay in one piece, not be developed in any way, and be a place where people can continue to enjoy nature."

The Mid-America Council wanted a buyer that could do three things: open the ranch to the public, maintain the memorial to the four scouts who were killed in the 2008 tornado, and continue to recognize and tell the story of the property's history as a scout camp.

Those three things fall in line with INHF's goals, Jayjack said, which are to keep the property whole, protect the wildlife habitat there, and protect the natural resource value

# Harrison County Community Foundation Celebrates 2022 Grant Recipients

At its second annual grant celebration event, the Harrison County Community Foundation honored 29 nonprofit organizations and community projects that received grants throughout the past year. These honorees included grant recipients from both Spring and Fall 2022 grant cycles who were awarded a collective sum of \$226,020.

Throughout 2022, the Foundation received a total of 47 grant applications from community organizations, with more than \$480,000 requested.

"I would like to thank the Harrison County Community Foundation Advisory Board members that take this responsibility very seriously to invest grant dollars into our county's nonprofit organizations' visions and missions," said Board Chair Jay Smith. "It's common to have applicants requesting twice the amount of available funds for each grant cycle, and the Board members weigh many criteria from applications when making decisions."

As a part of its two grant cycles, the Harrison County Community Foundation awarded \$226,020 to 32 of the 47 applications.

"In 2022, we've been able to fund a wide array of projects and programs," said Smith. "Grants were awarded to support construction and renovation, recreational opportunities, and many more projects that will have a positive effect on all of our community members. It has been a privilege to see the positive impact these grant dollars have made, and we're glad to have this opportunity to celebrate the important work of these organizations throughout Harrison County."

Each year, the Harrison County Community Foundation holds two grant cycles with the objective of funding projects that will have a lasting impact in the county.

"Since the Foundation was established in 1997, it has infused more than \$3.9 million in grants and scholarships to support organizations and individuals across

the county," said Iowa Foundations Director Sunni Kamp. "This speaks to the generous, philanthropic spirit of our communities. With the support of our donors, charitable funds allocated through the community foundation, and our participation in the County Endowment Fund Program, we can continue to invest valuable resources back into projects and initiatives throughout Harrison County."

The Harrison County Community Foundation is an affiliate of the Omaha Community Foundation, which meets National Standards for Community Foundations, and is one of nine county members of the Community Foundations of Southwest Iowa. Each year it receives funds from the State of Iowa County Endowment Fund Program for endowment building and grant-making throughout the county. The spring cycle of grants is made possible through the County Endowment Fund Program and is

funded by a percentage of the state's commercial gaming tax revenue, which is distributed annually to participating community foundations associated with counties without a state-issued gaming license.

The Foundation's fall grant cycle is made possible through the generosity of donors to the Harrison County Community Foundation. The Foundation works with individuals, families, businesses, and organizations to create permanent and expendable funds that address changing, vital community needs and interests. Gifts to permanently endowed funds through the Harrison County Community Foundation may be eligible to receive a 25% Endow Iowa Tax Credit.

*The news has uncorked plenty of dusty memories*

It is amazing what takes up room in our memory.

Yes, our basement can accommodate stacks of storage bins and shelves lined with boxes filled with what we politely assure our spouse is "important stuff" from our life. Our memory is no larger than our head, but long-forgotten details are tucked away there amid the cobwebs.

Those details are brought back to life by the unlikeliest of events. For me, one of those occurrences was the launch and then the landing of the Artemis 1 spacecraft a few weeks ago.

I am a kid of the 1950s and '60s. So, naturally, it should not be a surprise that I have long been fascinated with space exploration, although I was too frightened by heights to climb trees or enjoy roller-coasters.

This kid spent hours sprawled on my stomach in the family living room during those breathtaking early years of human space travel. I scoured the Ottumwa Courier and Des Moines Register for articles. My most important link to the distant events was our black-and-white television, which was about the size as a washer or dryer today.

Last month, like the little boy from Bloomfield, I was up past midnight when Artemis

1 lifted off from the Kennedy Space Center on Nov. 16, lighting up the Florida sky. Before it returned to Earth on Dec. 11, this uncrewed capsule traveled 1.3 million miles and orbited the moon for six days.

The trip was a big step forward in what NASA plans will be the return of American astronauts to the moon's surface in 2025. Humans have not been there in half a century, not since the last Apollo landing in December 1972.

The news of Artemis 1's voyage has unearthed memories from my cranial storage space, many that were expected but some that came out of the blue.

Of course, my Iowa pride swelled as I thought about the native sons and daughters who have played key roles in space exploration.

That includes the experts at what now is called Collins Aerospace in Cedar Rapids. These men and women designed and built the communications gear used on space missions.

That also includes more astronauts and NASA ground controllers than you might think. Among them are Steve Bales, the school janitor's kid from Fremont, who played a pivotal role in the final, hair-raising minutes before the first moon landing in 1969, and Peggy Whitson, the farm girl from Beaconsfield,

who has spent 665 days in space, more time than any other American, man or woman.

Another memory Artemis brought to the surface was of James Van Allen, another kid from southern Iowa. Van Allen was a product of the Mount Pleasant public schools, Iowa Wesleyan College and the University of Iowa, and he was responsible for turning the university into one of the world's leading space research institutions.

It was Van Allen who designed and built the scientific instruments that were carried into space in January 1958 by Explorer 1, the first satellite to be successfully launched by the United States. Explorer weighed only 30 pounds and was less than 7 feet long, and its rocket was dwarfed by the massive missile that carried Artemis 1 into space.

Van Allen studied the scientific evidence collected by the Iowa instruments on Explorer 1 and the next Explorer to orbit the Earth. He concluded there were bands of radiation trapped around the Earth by its magnetic field. The existence of these cosmic rays was one of the biggest discoveries of the early years of space research — forever putting the name of the explorer from Mount Pleasant in the history books, alongside the ocean-going explorers

from centuries long past.

I was fascinated by the Van Allen Belts, as they came to be known. I eagerly followed every news report about space in the popular school newsletter called "My Weekly Reader."

When Van Allen died in 2006 at the age of 91, his death was reported around the globe because his pioneering work in space exploration led him to be called the father of space science.

The human mind has a way of hanging onto odd memories. One of mine involves Van Allen.

During my four years at the University of Iowa, I did not live in a dormi-

tory. It was too expensive. Instead, during my freshman and sophomore years, I rented a bedroom in houses five blocks up the street from the classroom and laboratory building where Van Allen worked.

During my sophomore year, my room was on the second floor of an elderly woman's home on North Linn Street. She rented a bedroom to students like me to supplement her Social Security income — just as her parents brought in extra money during the Great Depression by renting that spare bedroom to students.

She informed me that in the late 1930s, my room had been rented to

a polite, serious-minded young graduate student named James Van Allen.

He did not leave any stray scientific knowledge in that room when he moved on after obtaining his master's degree and Ph.D. Or, at least, I found none there.

But the two of us did have other similarities than just the room we occupied. Looking at photos of his office in Van Allen Hall, my family would feel obligated to point out that he and I had desks that could safely be described as cluttered.

Missouri Valley Eagle's Club starting at 5 p.m.

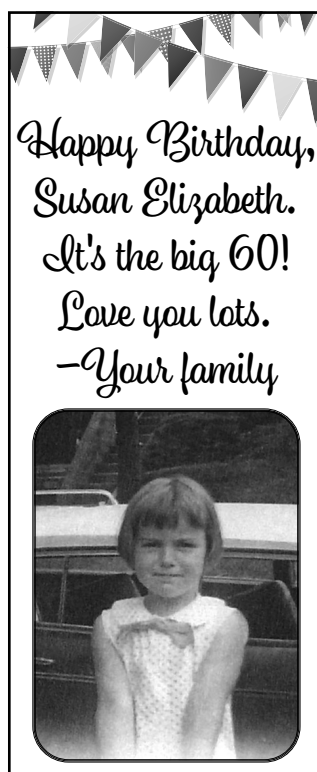

# Winter storm blows through with high winds, frigid conditions

The first true winter storm of the season went through Harrison County last week.

According to Harrison County EMA Coordinator Philip Davis, the storm arrived earlier and produced less impactful snow accumulations than initially anticipated. Residents in Harrison County reported anywhere from 1.1" to 2.2" of accumulated snowfall. Blowing snow caused some reduced visibility during travels, and as of Thursday, two hundred and fifty residents had reported power outages, with nearly all customers having power restored later that same day.

Davis noted that many people took the public warnings seriously and were well prepared for the weather system.

"Numerous people reconsidered or rearranged their travel plans, which might have been very difficult as people were making holiday travel plans long before the storm was on our radar," Davis said in an email to the Missouri Valley Times News.

As of Thursday, Harrison County had

no weather incidents reported. Road crews worked throughout the storm, and hazardous travel conditions were monitored due to strong winds and blowing snow.

"Travelers do not want to get stranded in this storm as with the current temperatures and wind chill values approaching -45 to -50 degrees, not only are these extreme cold temperatures life threatening, but frostbite can occur in as little as 10 minutes with any areas of exposed skin," Davis said. "According to the National Weather Service, we are experiencing some of the coldest temperatures dating back to February 1996 and these cold temperatures will remain in the area until at least Saturday."

Davis also gave a reminder that older vehicle batteries may have power issues, and diesel vehicle owners may also experience issues as fuel gelling is common in the extreme cold. According to Davis, diesel fuel contains a natural wax that can crystallize and cause the fuel to gel, even with the best winter blend of diesel fuels being used. Diesel owners are encouraged to use an anti-gel additive and use their block

heaters if installed.

The following tips for dealing with extreme weather are published verbatim from an email sent by Davis:

1. Raise the temperature in your home two to four degrees above your normal setting prior to the storm.
2. Take all programmable thermostats out of setback mode and set on a permanent HOLD.
3. If you have a furnace, replace the filter.
4. Keep garage doors closed.
5. Limit opening exterior doors.

6. Make sure air vents and radiators are not blocked or obstructed.

7. If you have a 90%+ furnace and boiler: You must keep the intake and exhaust clear of ice and snow. During these cold temperatures, ice can build up. A 90%+ furnace and boiler have 2 white PVC pipes; an exhaust pipe and an intake pipe that are generally on the side or back of your home. In some instances, they are on your roof. Do not go on your roof to clear the pipe.

If the temperature in your home is dropping and your radiators are hot with boiler systems or you have hot air coming out of your vents with furnaces do not panic. Please make sure that your heating system continues to operate.

If the temperatures drop in your home, it will not be able to recover until temperatures rise and the windchill diminishes. Our heating systems cannot overcome temperatures -20 to -30 with wind chill up to -50+. They are sized

to operate at zero degrees outdoors. Put your thermostat on hold 70 degrees or higher.

To help minimize temperature loss you can boil water, make soup, or stews; they help introduce humidity and warmer temperatures into your home.

Do not use your oven or a grill to heat your home.

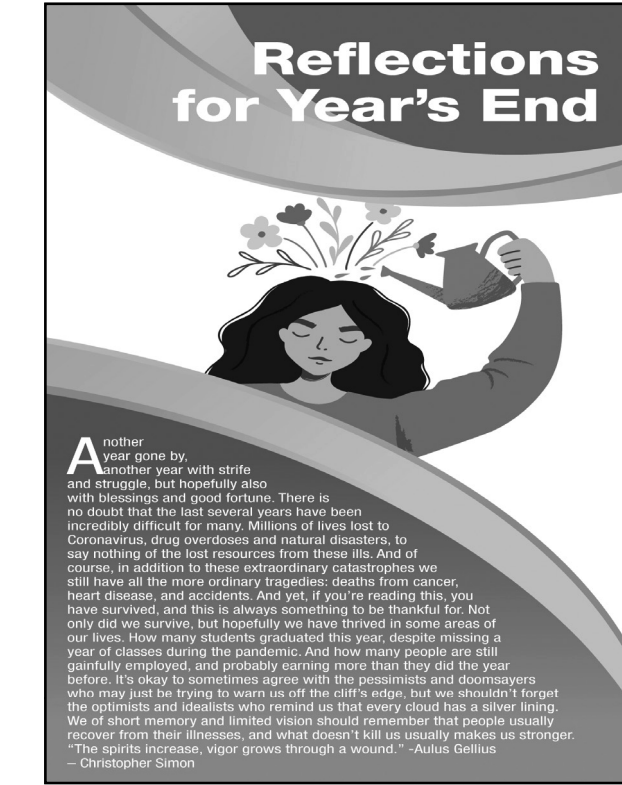

At 6:10 P.M. Mayor McDonald called the meeting to order. Agenda item 2 was the Pledge of Allegiance.  
Agenda item 3 was roll call. Council Members Hinkel, Sporrer, Fisher and Scheuring and Mayor McDonald were present. Council Member Moss was absent.  
Agenda item 4 was to approve the agenda. Motion was made by Fisher and seconded by Sporrer to approve the agenda. 4 ayes.  
Agenda item 5 was to approve the consent agenda which consisted of approving the minutes of the December 5th regular meeting, setting a date of January 9, 2023 for the next regular meeting, approve the claims register and a building permit for Matt Busing, 208 S. 1st Ave., deck. Motion was made by Hinkel and seconded by Sporrer to approve the consent agenda. 4 ayes.  
Agenda item 6 was the Visioning Committee to discuss their priorities and potential projects. Tammy Hinkel, Bruce Niedermeyer and Mat Gross attended the meeting to discuss the Final Report and Feasibility Study and their project priorities with the council. They requested that council consider allocating some funds in each of the next 5 years

to put towards visioning projects. They also asked the council to set up a long-term committee with a combination of council members and community members to work on visioning projects going forward.

## SCOUTS: INHF seeks to purchase Little Sioux Ranch

the land has.

The INHF purchased an option to buy the property which comes at a cost of \$7 million, since buying the property outright was unaffordable. The option expires at the end of this year, so the foundation set an internal goal to raise \$2 million in order to feel comfortable in exercising that option before making a full purchase, which will eventually cost more than \$7 million in total.

"We wanted to make sure there was enough public support before we take on a project like this," Jayjack said. "It's been amazing. There's dozens of donations coming in every day, we have a lot of support from public partners and private donors, and we have a couple big donations from Iowa West and the Gilchrist Foundation. We're getting close to that \$2 million goal, but we're making a big push before the end of the year."

The INHF website currently shows that slightly over \$1.2 million has been donated, which is about 60% of the goal. With donations coming in every day, Jayjack said that figure might be closer to 70% now.

Former scouts have taken an interest in supporting the project, as it's been a staple of the Boy Scout experience in the area for the last five decades. For several scouts, it was the first place they learned outdoor skills and got in touch with nature.

"They want to make sure that this stays protected, and would love to see it open to the public so that they can continue to go back and enjoy this place," Jayjack said.

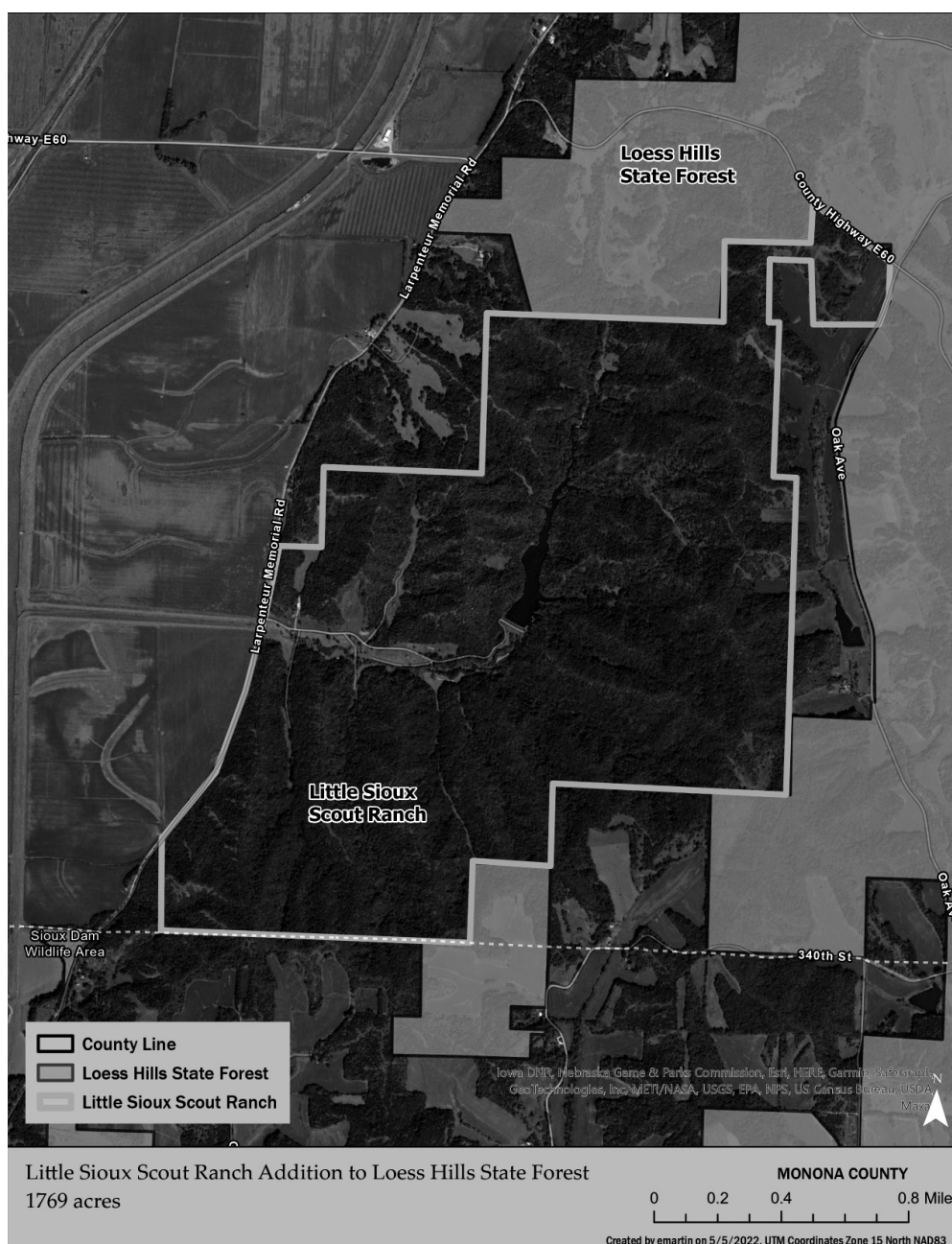
There have also been several groups that have an interest in protecting wildlife habitats and outdoor recreation. Measuring at nearly 1,800 acres, there's not many properties of that size that are that wild that go up for sale in Iowa.

Jayjack emphasized the importance of

continuing to offer that "wild, natural experience" to people who come visit the ranch. With a couple units of the Loess Hills State Forest surrounding the property, the INHF is essentially looking at this as an extension of those units.

"People would be able to use it in a very similar way," he said.

"It's a great spot for bird-watching, hiking, fishing, hunting, and backcountry camping."

There will be opportunities for the public to continue to be involved even after the hopeful purchase of the property.

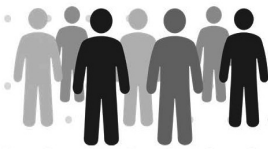
"We're just really laser focused on making sure it's protected and stays whole, then we're

These are the types of years that make my job fun, and I'm sure 2022 was an enjoyable one for all of you. Some years, it's a stretch to be able to find ten worthy stories to make this 'infamous' list. That is not the case this year, as I paged back through 2022 and was able to relive so many emotional moments.

Sit back and enjoy as I attempt to refresh the memorable 2022, and prep ourselves for an amazing 2023.

### 10) State Track, 2022:

When everyone knows how much I enjoy the fun, sun, and being on the run at Drake Stadium covering multiple student-athletes via our papers and the Iowa Newspaper Association photo pool, seeing state track at #10 might come as a shock to some, but this is just a sign of how stacked everything was this past year. Always a highlight of 'sprummer' as we transition at the end of the school year and end of the spring season and directly into the summer baseball and softball. Lo-Ma's talented 4 x 800 m relay team (Greytan Hornbeck, Haedyn Hall, Courtney Sporrer and Madison Sporrer) picked up a third place finish in the Class 1A, 4 x 800 m relay, with Courtney Sporrer capping her high school career with an eighth place finish in the 1,500 m run. Lo-Ma's Tru Melby added a sixth place finish in the Class 1A Discus, and Woodbine's Dylan Hoefer wrapped up an outstanding throwing career with an eighth place finish in the Class 1A State Discus, his third state medal for the Tigers.

### 9) West Harrison baseball makes fifth Substate Final appearance:

West Harrison's baseball team started to heat up at the right time, as the Hawkeyes won seven of their final nine games entering the post-season. West Harrison (17-7), who finished in fourth place in the Rolling Valley Conference regular season race, rattled off four straight wins, including knocking off the defending 2021 Class 1A State Champions St. Albert, and winning the rubber match against a formidable Woodbine squad. The Hawkeyes season ended against a very formidable Remsen St. Mary's squad. There is a lot to look forward to on the diamond, as the Hawkeyes return a majority of their pitching staff, after graduating just one senior.

### 8) Logan-Magnolia Panthers football – Back in State Playoffs:

Logan-Magnolia made their 19th state playoff appearance in school history. After graduating a huge senior class and making the Class A Elite Eight in 2021, not a lot was expected out of the Panthers' gridiron squad. But, once again, the Panthers reloaded with the pieces they were given, and found their way back into the 2022 state playoffs with a second place finish in a competitive Class A District. Lo-Ma's Matt Straight was named the Class A, District 8 Coach of the Year.

### 7) Two Area Standouts finish season at State Golf:

A pair of individual standouts finished their season at the 2022 Boys State Golf Meet at Ames in May. Missouri Valley's Jackson Tennis earned a 37th place in Class 2A, becoming just the second player from Missouri Valley (Dan Scobold, 1998) to reach the pinnacle of state golf. Woodbine's Cory Bantam earned a 16th place in Class 1A, becoming just the second player from Woodbine

(Davis Hackman, 2011, 2012) to earn top-flite status.

### 6) West Harrison Football, Undefeated District Champions, State Playoffs:

It was a unforgettable season for the West Harrison football team this past fall, as they posted their first undefeated 8-man regular season (8-0) in school history. This run included a pair of nailbiting wins over Rolling Valley Conference nemesis Exira/EHK and defending 2021 8-Man State Champion C-A-M, as well as a decisive victory over perennial power Audubon to clinch the school's district championship. The Hawkeyes nailed down their second undefeated regular season (11-man, 8-0, 1967) with a dominant win at Griswold to secure the school's first appearance in the 8-Man State Football Playoffs. The Hawkeyes posted their first state playoff victory in school history with a thrilling 29-27 win over Bedford. The Hawkeyes season came to a screeching halt in the second round, but that did not take away from all the memorable accomplishment from this past season. WH Head Coach Andrew Stevenson was named the 2022 KMA Coach of the Year.

### 5) Go the Distance, Finish in Fort Dodge:

It was another fantastic season on the cross country scene for the Harrison County area. The Logan-Magnolia girls continued their area dominance, as the Panther girls won eight meets again this season, including their sixth straight Western Iowa Conference cross country title. Lo-Ma won the regional title at Corning, and landed a fourth place finish at the Class 1A State Meet in Fort

Dodge. This was the Panthers fifth top-four finish in the state in the past six seasons. The Woodbine boys also made plenty of noise this fall, as the Tigers also won eight meets this fall. Both the Woodbine boys and girls won their second straight Rolling Valley Conference cross country titles, led by 2022 RVC Champions Landon Bendgen and Addison Murdock (both juniors) (more on these two later). The Woodbine boys cross country team earned their highest finish since 2009 (4th place) at the Class 1A State Cross Country Meet, as the Tigers' reached 'The Deck' with a third place finish at the Class 1A State CC Meet. Woodbine's effort was led by 2022 Class 1A State Champion, Landon Bendgen, who became Woodbine's first state cross country champion in school history. Woodbine's Addison Murdock also earned All-State honors with her 14th place finish in Class 1A. Woodbine's James Smith was named 2022 KMA Coach of the Year.

## 4) A Diamond Gem of a Season – Purrfection:

Logan-Magnolia's softball team returned seven of the nine starters from a year ago, plus another four with starting experience. The Panthers' coaching staff knew they were in pretty good shape entering the year. But what unfolded was an amazing year that no one expected. It just takes one bad throw, a bad hop, or a passed ball for an inning to go down hill. But all year long, Logan-Magnolia go the key hits and made the difficult plays look easy, finishing the

summer as Western Iowa Conference (16-0) and Regional (28-0) champions, their first undefeated regular season in school history. The Panthers made their sixth state tournament appearance at the Rogers Sports Complex in Fort Dodge, led by the talented seniors of Karsten Bruns, Kali Collins, Erikah Rife, Amelia Evans, and Samantha Yoder. Lo-Ma's Rick McHugh was named the 2022 KMA Softball Coach of the Year.

## 3) State Wrestling: Two State Champs, Two State Dual Trophies:

When you reach Wells Fargo Arena in mid-February, wrestlers know they are in elite company, and they have to be at their best if they hope to take part in the coveted Saturday night Grand March and Award Stand. The two Harrison County powers didn't disappoint, as 10 area individuals participated, and five returned with state medals. Logan-Magnolia's Gavin Maguire (4th place) and Rex Johnsen (2nd place) both capped their careers with their second state medal, and Corbin Reisz (3rd place) earned his first state medal.

Missouri Valley sophomore Eli Becerra (two-time state finalist) earned his first championship, joining Arron Olson (2019) and Dalton Jensen (2005, 2007) as Big Reds' state title holders.

Logan-Magnolia's Wyatt Reisz (two-time state finalist) recorded back-to-back state titles (2021, 2022), as he joined Rex Johnsen, sr. (1969), Lynn Johnsen (1990), Matt Straight (1990), Patrick Makey (2003, 2004), and Drake Johnsen

(2017) in the storied Panthers wrestling history). He is looking to become the first three-time state champion this February.

In the State Team Duals, Missouri Valley made their fourth state team dual appearance, and returned with a fifth place team finish (2-1), and Logan-Magnolia made their 18th State Team Dual appearance, winning two of three matches (2-1) for a third place team finish.

## 2) Lady Reds volleyball raises bar, sets new heights:

Incredible, Unbelievable, however anyone wants to word it, it was a tremendous season by the Lady Reds net squad. Missouri Valley set numerous single match, single season and career school records on their way to an amazing 34-7 record. The dynamite coaching staff of Megan West, Rachel Hack and Reahgan Johnsen guided the Lady Reds to a runner-up finish in the Western Iowa Conference regular season, a third place finish in the WIC Tournament. The sensational six seniors of Chloe Larsen, Addi Huegli, Maya Contreras, Ava Hiltz, Emma Gute and Ella Myler swept through the post-season as they found their way to the Class 2A Regional Final for the first time in school history. The packed stands in the Harlan gymnasium displayed how much the community was doused in 'Red Hot Volleyball Fever', and even though the ultimate goal fell one step short, the memories this team made will last a lifetime.

## 1) Dream Becomes Reality, Hawkeyes Boys Basketball Makes History – 2022 State Basketball:

They have been on the Boys Substate Basketball Doorstep on five separate occasions (1963, 1976, 2000, 2002, 2022), but never have been able to clear that final hurdle. But on that magical night on the final Saturday night in February, the West Harrison boys basketball team was not going to let Class 1A, #4 AHSTW get in their way. West Harrison pulled off a stunning 59-55 win over the heavy-favorite, capturing the first state boys basketball tournament appearance in school history. A total of 1,100 tickets were sold in advance as the southwest Iowa fans squeezed into the 1,000 seat Thomas Jefferson gymnasium. The two-time Rolling Valley Conference champions were pushed early on in the post-season, as Mason King took the inbounds pass and raced up court with under six seconds remaining, he threw the pass over a double-team right before half court. Mason McIntosh shook the hair out of his eyes after a pump fake, released the shot that touched nothing but net, sending West Harrison to a thrilling 58-57 win over heavily favored Tri-Center in the Class 1A District Semifinals. West Harrison came up short in the first appearance at the Class 1A Boys State Basketball Tournament to Remsen St. Marys, but they will be remembered as the team that broke down the state basketball tournament barrier for Hawkeye boys athletics. Rowdy Evans won the 2021-22 KMA Boys Basketball Coach of the Year.

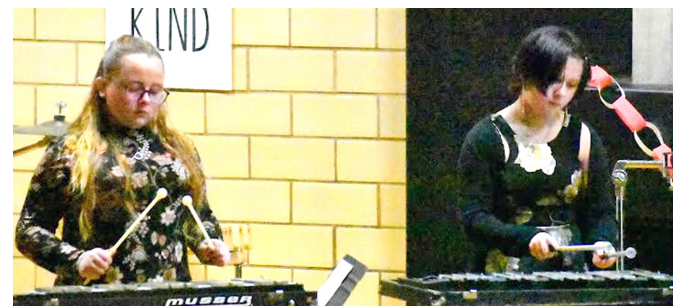
