



Korbin Cole and Kate Smith are the 2021-22 Pride of Pampa band drum majors, and are both juniors.

Since they are the first junior drum majors in a number of years, neither of the two were expecting to get the call to be drum majors. "It was kind of cool," Smith said. "We weren't really expecting it to be us two as juniors. But we both have a huge passion for music, love it and want to do something with the band program to help it grow a lot. For me personally, I really wanted to do something with the band program and was excited to be behind the scenes."

Cole added there is a lot that goes into band production and he enjoys the leadership that goes into it.

"Not a lot of people see how much hard work goes into the band," Cole said. "So when you're able to get everyone's feelings up front about how you can make everything better, it's pretty nice. Knowing that we are trying to prolong a legacy is pretty amazing.

They both started at Pampa Junior High in sixth grade, and stuck with the band program. Smith plays clarinet, but she started playing piano at a young age.

"That (piano) was when I was introduced into music," Smith said. "Ultimately, voice is kind of my passion. I love singing, music theater and it's what I'm good at. That's kind of my thing, but I do love band."

Cole plays trombone, but started playing guitar and bass in fourth/fifth grade. Now, he is



learning euphonium.

Smith's favorite memories have been going on the All-Region trips.

"Doing game nights with other people who make All-Region is very fun," Smith said. "I have older brothers who have been on band trips, so I've gotten to go. They are super-fun. Band trips and all-region is fun."

Cole's favorite memory came from a specific trip to All-State.

"Concert etiquette states that you just sit there and be quiet," Cole said. "But my friend had a banana and we all just passed the banana across the section. We ended up putting it on trumpet heads and on stands. We signed the banana and called it the 'All-State Banana.' By the end of the trip it was all black and gross. It was pretty funny."

Smith's parents are Lisa and Paul Smith. She has lived in Pampa her entire life and enjoys reading and music.

"I like to read a lot," Smith said. "I sing and listen to music. I feel like I have music on all of the time. I love music theater and am always watching Broadway musicals and reading plays."

Cole is the son of Amy Cole and has lived in Pampa since he was four years old. He enjoys arranging music.

"I don't have a lot (of things I like) besides music," Cole said. "I do a lot of arranging music (changing it's format for band). Right now I'm working on an arrangement of 'Can't take my eyes of you' by Frankie Valli, as a stand tune for the band."




