Mary Ellen and Harvester Church of Christ

Mary Ellen and Harvester Church of Christ is located at the corner of Mary Ellen and Harvester in Pampa, near Pampa High School.

The fundamental belief of any member of a COC is that the Bible is the Inspired Word of God and the only Absolute in the world. They believe that the Bible is the final authority for any religious discussion. Zac Green, who officially will take over as preacher on July 3, said the Church has several areas where they help the Pampa community.

“We have a food room,” Green said. “Families can come and get groceries once per week. The bag has cereal, spaghetti and sauce, peanut butter/jelly, basic stuff that doesn’t expire.”

There is a clothing room that is open the second and fourth Tuesday of the month. “It’s for the community to come and bag up clothes for free,” Green said. “We have several ladies that help with that and make sure it runs.”

That room is open on Thursdays between 1 and 4:30 p.m.

The Church aims to bring the gospel to those who are incarcerated with both a jail

and prison ministry. “We have people that go to the Gray County Jail for Bible

study,” Green said. “But we also have people that go to the Jordan-Baten Units on Sundays.”

The Church also has missions and ministries in Trinidad,

Chile, High Plains Children’s, Manuelito Children’s Home in New Mexico and many others. While MEHCOC had a large number of youth graduate high school over the last 10 years, their youth program has several children sixth grade and under. MEHCOC’s congregation is primarily made up of members who are 70-plus years old, but there are more than 25 younger members of the congregation. “That’s one of the reasons why the church felt comfortable hiring a younger preacher,” Green said. “They understand the generation gap that exists and are trying to bridge the gap.”

Green praised the church secretary, Lori Guyer, for being able to go between himself and the elders. “She understands my point of view and their (elders) point of view,” Green said. “With all of us working together, me, her and the church, we can get things where everybody sees on the same level.”

The church family is a team who comes together to support the church including members who handle the flowers/gardens, yard work, greeting/encouragement cards, visitor outreach, etc.

MEHCOC worships “a cappella” style.

“The reason is not whether we think it is a salvation issue,” Green said. “But, the verse in Ephesians 5:19-20 where it says to sing and make music with your hearts, we feel like it’s better to be safe than sorry.”

There are outreaches for women including Ladies Bible Brunch and seasonal events. Green would like to start a men’s and young family Bible study.

“We used to do a men’s prayer meeting once a month,” Green said. “I would like to get that started again. We have a Bible hour program for the young children. During the song before the sermon, they (the children) go upstairs to the puppet room for a children’s service. We are going to start a young adults class in August. We’re going to do more stuff for the young adults like cook-outs and other gatherings.” Classes are available for birth to 18 months, 18 months to 3 years old, pre-kindergarten to first grade, second through fifth grade, sixth through 12th grade.

There is a women’s class for adults and a Bible class for everyone else to attend. MEHCOC has Wednesday services at 7 p.m., Bible classes on Sunday at 9:30 a.m. and worship at 10:30 a.m.

Services are live-streamed on Sunday mornings through YouTube. Green also utilizes the Church’s Facebook page for both the sermon link and a daily dose of encouragement through scripture.

Calvary Baptist Church

For 80 years, Calvary Baptist has been in Pampa. The church started on the south side of town, in the location of Grace Baptist Church, in the '70s the church moved to where it stands now. The original build of the church is the current day fellowship hall, and grew outwards over the years to accommodate the members. The church ranges from all ages, and all backgrounds. No member is a stranger due to the mission of the church, and the motto, making disciples that make disciples.

“We have a diverse crowd, we have blue-collar folks here that just want to see the vision of God grow.” Pastor Paul Beam said. “We are mostly younger families, but we do have some older members.”

In efforts to fulfill the vision, the church offers many classes and Bible studies to its members, one of the classes is a seminary based class that is taught by the head pastor Paul Beam.

“We just want to teach who Jesus is and what he can do in your life. We don't just want people in the doors to fill seats, we really want to show how He changes your life.” Beam said. “Along with that, we take the safety of our church family and guests very seriously and all our volunteers have taken sexual abuse awareness training through a company we use called MinistrySafe.”

The church has many give-back efforts



to the community. In the past the church has hosted block parties to bring people together as well as a Trunk or Treat for the community around Halloween time. As well as an annual Vacation Bible School. While it isn't an extension of the church, Calvary and it's members help put on the annual Kicking Bear camp that happens in the summer time.

“Kicking Bear is a fun time, the kids get to be out doors doing stuff like shooting bow and arrows or any other types of out doors activities.” Beam said. “We also have classes for all ages and a really good pre-school. We life groups every Sunday for the different ages and then we all come together for worship.” Paul has been in ministry since 1998,

he became a pastor 11 years ago but has always been involved in many ways. He joined Calvary five years ago in August. Originally taking up preaching in Tipton, Oklahoma for six years before getting the chance to move to Pampa.

“We have such an incredible family over believers here, there are some churches where new people can feel on the outside. But the great thing about Calvary is we are such a family church, we enjoy being with each other and growing together.” Beam said.

First United Methodist Church: The First Denominational Church in Pampa

First United Methodist Church, located at 201 East Foster, opened in 1906 as the first denominational church in Pampa.

The present church site, Foster and Ballard, was purchased in 1924 from J.D. and Beulah Edgar just before the oil discovery and boom in 1925. The basement was built at the time and an Indian Jim was speedily laying bricks over Pampa's muddy main street.

The Adams Hotel was purchased in 1965 and the property from the main church to Kingsmill Street was cleared for parking space. It was black-topped in 1975.

In 1980, the remainder of the block was purchased.

Today, it remains one of the staples in downtown Pampa, where it's bell chimes can be heard across the District.

Interim Pastor Todd Dyess has been serving the church since January and said the congregation is an older con-



gregation but has a fair share of youth.

"We have a number of younger families in our congregation and membership," Dyess said. "They are there and they are working. It has a real potential for new, young families."

FUMC has a Sunday School service for all ages and a traditional service where the children even have a segment during the worship service.

"One of the members will deliver a special message, just

for the children," Dyess said. "The worship service is pretty traditional. We have the media and screens around the sanctuary to put out special advertisements for various events. It's pretty forward-thinking. We have different hymns and special songs with a fabulous choir/music program led by Suzanne Wood."

The youth program is "pretty strong" with a lot of involvement in missions and ministry.

"They've gone on several

work missions around the state as well as outside the state," Dyess said. "They have good leadership with Tad Smith, who is the youth minister."

Dyess said the community outreach includes a food bank.

"We feed a lot of people who are hungry," Dyess said. "It's a strong, strong ministry. We also have the benevolence ministry which will pay util-

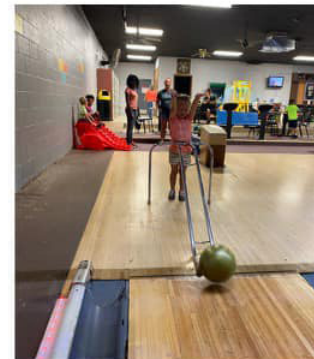
ity bills, hotel rooms (for those with no place else to go), etc. That's a good ministry."

FUMC also has the "cozy closet" with coats and gloves for those in need during the winter time.

Dyess added there is also a mission effort for work in Central America.

FUMC's staff is composed of the pastor, administrative assistant, building official, youth director and music ministry. Dyess especially noted Andora Roberts for her work as the administrative assistant.

Cornerstone Baptist Church

Cornerstone Baptist Church, located at 2410 W. 23rd Avenue, follows the mantra of “Loving God and Leading People to Him.”

The Church was originally founded as a renaming of Barrett Baptist Church in 2003.

Kyle Collins has been the Associate Pastor for seven years, along with senior pastor Rodney Weatherly.

“Rodney comes in and preaches on Sundays and leads a Bible Study in Wheeler,” Collins said. “He provides overall

leadership, vision-casting, guidance and direction.”

The congregation has a wide range of ages attending with a large portion being middle-aged worshipers. Their worship style is equally as “eclectic,” as Collins describes it.

“I’ve always believed we should use whatever resources the Lord has given us,” Collins said. “If we were in a church with an organist and a pianist, we would use that. Here he has given us a worship band and a couple of vocalist. So we sing and play. Our oldest song is ‘O come, O come, Emmanuel’ which is from the third century up to things writ-

ten last year. The goal is less to be focused on one thing or one genre, than it is to say things that are true to scripture.” The Youth Program will be spending time at Panfork Baptist Encampment outside of Wellington soon and will return to their Wednesday night youth services.

Cornerstone takes a unique approach to their Bible studies.

“We’ve got two Bible studies running,” Collins said. “Back in November we looked and saw we had families coming from Wheeler, Mobeetie-area and a large locus of Pampa folks. We launched two Bible studies, one in Wheeler and one in

Pampa.” Collins noted these discussions are centered around the message on Sunday and opens for more conversation. “Preaching is excellent for taking a passage and being real specific on where we’re heading with this,” Collins said. “But that conversational Bible study provides rabbit trails and tackling harder issues that you just don’t have time to be nuanced in a 30-minute sermon. It develops community in a new way. Sitting together

and having conversation is good.” Cornerstone Baptist Church is still trying to find its footing in the world of outreach in a pandemic world. “We had things we had done in the past but a lot of those have seemed to become less effective at serving people,” Collins said. “One of those things we have tried to avoid is doing things because we have always done it that way. We have a team right now trying to figure out what some of the outreach and opportunities are to serve the community in tangible ways.”

Cornerstone also spreads the Lord’s Word internationally through the Southern Baptist Convention. “We’ve got a particular relationship with a couple serving in a Muslim part of the world,” Collins said. “I was privileged to go to college with them and it’s been a blessing hearing back how they are ministering where they are and be prayer support for them.” Collins encourages anyone who is looking for a church home to come by any Sunday for Sunday school at 9:45 a.m. or worship at

10:45 a.m. “Seven and a half years of a weird staffing situation (two pastors) is a long time, but yet Rodney and I visit about it regularly and neither of us are looking for an end date/exit ramp,” Collins said. “This church has been so gracious, humble and welcoming. It’s fantastic for the first time in my life to be a part of a church that feels more like a family than it does a country club.” For more information on Cornerstone Baptist Church visit their Facebook page or call 806-669-6509.

St. Paul United Methodist Church

Founded in 1934, St Paul United Methodist has been apart of Pampa for many years. Starting out as McCullough Methodist under the leadership of Rev. Lance Webb the church moved in 1953 to where it sits today at 511 N. Hobart. Predominantly an older congregation, St. Paul is a family moreso than just a church body. The small atmosphere allows the church and pastor to take a personal approach to relationships. In recent years, the church has began to grow more into the younger crowd. After finishing seminary, Pampa native Vondel Stevens found her way to fulfill her calling.

“I have been a pastor for seven and a half years, but I was in volunteer youth ministry for years before that. I just feel all Christians have a calling in some way, I was a photographer for years before going to seminary. I felt called to go, and I went, a little bit of the way through, I felt I was called to pastor a small church.” Stevens said.

Upon leaving seminary, she found her way back to Pampa where she’d grown up and began pastoring at St. Paul. After attending schooling for ministry, Vondel began praying for a church to pastor near Amarillo, where she was living at the time. Not wanting to take on a large church, Vondel felt called to take on a small church and help it grow. After feel-

ing her calling she contacted the Methodist district superintendent and told him of her dream and calling. In May, she heard back from him about a potential church needing a new pastor.

“I didn’t hear about where I was going for a while, I was still in school finishing up and I got the call about Pampa, but I didn’t know it was Pampa, I just knew it was within the range I was hoping and praying for. I started pastoring here in Pampa in September.” Stevens said.

After growing up in Pampa, it was an opportunity Stevens was excited to take. When she started in Pampa, she made the third female pastor in Pampa. At the

time, First United Methodist was under the direction of Pastor Ruby as well as Clover Bailey at First Presbyterian Church. We have a youth

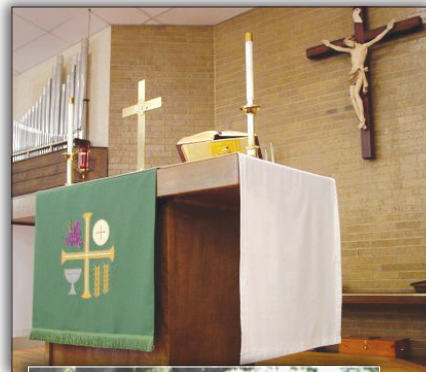

Everyone is here to serve, and understands reaching out and showing the love of Christ." The church does 30 lunches a week to homeless and people in need. bags and clothing to help them feel appreciated. The church also does a yearly free guitar camp for kids ages 13 and up, the church holds "No freight guitar camp" every summer, this year it will be taking place in September.
