

WELCOME TO THE 77TH ANNUAL

There's something for everyone at this year's Top O' Texas Rodeo!!!! The 77th annual event will be held August 9, & 10, at 7:00 nightly at the Top O' Texas/ B & G Electric Rodeo arena, east of Pampa on Highway 60.

Justin Russell and Wolf Creek Rodeo Company of Lipscomb, TX, will produce this year's show and rodeo fans can look forward to Bull Riding, Bareback Bronc Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, Tie Down Roping, Breakaway Roping, Team Roping, Steer Wrestling, Ranch Bronc Riding and Barrel Racing. Brandon Wren will return as The Voice of the Top O' Texas Rodeo. The Calf Scramble and Nickel Drop will be held nightly.

Those purchasing rodeo programs will have a chance at several nightly giveaways donated by local businesses.

The ever-popular Freestyle Bull-fights will return to the arena for both rodeo performances.

Rodeo festivities begin on Thursday, August 8, at 7:00 p.m. with the slack performance. There will be no charge for this performance. Friday, August 9, ticket holders will enjoy a free barbecue begin-

ning at 5:30 p.m. During the barbecue, spectators will be entertained by the annual Mutton Bustin' Extravaganza. Open to little cowboys and cowgirls ages 7 and under, this is always a real crowd pleaser! The Top 10 finishers will compete in the Finals during the rodeo performance on Saturday.

Mini Bulls and Walk & Trot Bulls will get underway following the Mutton Bustin Extravaganza. The Top 3 finishers in the Mini Bulls and Top 2 finishers in Walk & Trot Bulls will return to ride again on Saturday night.

Ward and The Silence. Saturday, August 10, is loaded with fun for everyone when the rodeo parade kicks off at 10:30 a.m.

Jacob Clifton and Rich Henkel of Gray County EMS are the 2024 Parade Marshals. Forming at the M. K. Brown parking lot, the parade will move south on Somerville to Francis, east on Francis to Cuyler, south on Cuyler to Atchison, east on Atchison to the train depot where it will disband. This parade always provides lots of interesting and unusual sights. Engraved trophies will be awarded to the winners of each division.

Entries are now being taken for anyone interested in participating in the parade. Entries will be accepted up until parade time.

The final performance of the Top O' Texas Rodeo will begin at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday. The Mutton Bustin' Extravaganza Finals will be held during this performance, as well as the Mini Bulls and Walk and Trot Bulls Finals.

Bart Crow will be performing at the rodeo dance with Seth Ward & The Silence opening. Dances will begin at 9:00 p.m. and will be held at the Top O' Texas Norris Rodeo Pavilion adjacent to the rodeo arena.


SETH WARD & THE SILENCE

American singer-songwriter Seth Ward is from Arlington, Texas. His sound has a country-based foundation but is also infused with Americana and alt country.

BART CROW

Born and raised in Maypearl, Texas, country music singer/songwriter Bart Crow made his first attempts to write songs while in the United States Army and started first performing live while studying at Tarleton State University in Stephenville, TX. With a sound all his own, Crow produces an ever-evolving flow of Red Dirt, Texas Country and Americana music. Crow has put together an impressive track record as a recording artist, having lofted six No. 1 singles onto the Texas Music Chart – one of which, "Wear My Ring," sold over 165,000 copies. He has sold over 40,000 albums, released eight self-co-produced records in just over a decade, including Dandelion, which debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's Heatseekers South Central chart. He's been cheered in Country Weekly, on CMT, and has been named one of Rolling Stones "artists you need to know".

Crow is also a dedicated husband and father with a passion for supporting our nation's Veterans. "Being a Veteran I will always pay homage to our brothers and sisters who heed the call to volunteer and preserve our peace and freedom," says Crow. He displays this sentiment in his self-penned song "Broken" from album "Heartworn Tragedy". Bart Crow has partnered with True Grit Talent Agency. The True Grit roster includes Cody Jinks, Sunny Sweeney, Whitey Morgan, Ward Davis & many more noteworthy acts.

With tours booked across the country and many more dates to be released along the way. Crow's latest release, "I'm Not Finished," caught much attention throughout the music scene, with new music on the way.

BRANDON WREN: PROFESSIONAL ANNOUNCER

His voice is heard and his image is seen by thousands of people across the country each year. He entertains thousands of fans per year in Oklahoma alone. From rodeo circuits to regional charity events, his is the voice people recognize and trust.

Brandon Wren resonance and style has become synonymous with professional rodeo. He has been voted BRI Announcer of the Year nine times and was awarded the 2014 American Cowboys Association Announcer of the Year.

He was selected to announce the LJ Jenkins Finals Bull Riding five consecutive years. In 2016, he was selected Iowa Rodeo Cowboys Association Announcer. Five times he has been named Announcer of the Year for the MT Bucking Bulls Tour Finals in Minnesota.

He has been voted as Youth Bull Riding World Finals Announcer in Abilene, Texas, four times and World Championship Miniature Bull Riding Association Finals Announcer four times. In 2021, he was selected to be the announcer for the Hooey Junior Patriot Rough Stock event with the Patriot Events during the NFR in Las Vegas.

Brandon was also the host of the Sam's Town Casino NFR Watch Party for all 10 rounds. He was the announcer at the 2021 LJ Jenkins Bull Riding Tour Championships at Resort Worlds Casino in Las Vegas.

His itinerary stretches from coast to coast with stops in New Mexico, Minnesota, Iowa, Oklahoma, Missouri, Arkansas, Kansas, Texas, Nebraska, Nevada and Wisconsin.

He has had television events and commentates on Texas Ranch and Radio Weekly and True Cowboy Radio. Brandon has over 25 years in rodeo.





THE HISTORY OF THE TOP O'TEXAS RODEO

June 20, 1945, was a red-letter day for the Top O' Texas Rodeo, Horse Show, and Fair Association. The charter was signed by 13 very enterprising men including Wade Thom- asson, Crawford Atkinson, Irvin Cole, E. J. Hanna, F. E. Imel. Rex Barrett, John Haynes, Roy Sewell, J. E. Murfee, Jr., Orval Christo-pher, John Sims, Arlie Carpenter, and E. O. Wedgeworth. These men often met for cof- fee at the Court House Cafe and felt the need for some kind of public entertainment where cowboys and cowgirls of the area could get together to show off their talents. Serving as officers for the first year were Wade Thom- asson, President: Crawford Atkinson, Vice President; Floyd Imel, Treasurer; and E. O. Wedgeworth, Secretary.

Many famous personalities and events

have helped to give the Top O' Texas Rodeo the name it has today. 1981 and 1983 saw rising stars Reba McEntire and Tommy Over- street in the Top O' Texas arena.

A popular feature of the current rodeo be- gan in 1958. The calf scramble has delighted crowds for many years.

The rodeo has been held annu-

ally except for May 1970, when a tornado hit the arena destroying part of the stands on the east side. No performance was held in 1971, as an out-break of Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyaly- tis quarantined the Panhandle livestock or in 2020, due to the pandemic.


The Kid Pony Show started the same year as the rodeo and continues today to give the younger cowboys and cowgirls a chance to develop their rodeo skills. Annually area residents also enjoy the search for the Golden Horseshoe. Clues are given in the local media as to where a "gold- en" horseshoe has been hidden and the lucky person who finds it is awarded box seat tickets to the rodeo.

Many great cowboys and cowgirls of area, national, and international fame have performed in the Top O' Texas arena since that day in 1945 when Wade Thomasson, O. W. Hampton, Red Wedgeworth and others met over a cup of coffee at the old Court House Cafe on Kingsmill Street.

We're glad they did.

Come join us for another great year of fast rodeo action and loads of excitement at the Top O' Texas Rodeo.


