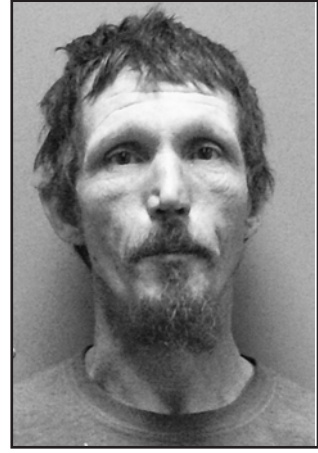

## Rep. Jackson Reintroduces Legislation to Protect Agricultural Industry from Foreign Interference

WASHINGTON — Today, Congressmen Ronny Jackson (TX-13), Pete Sessions (TX-17), Vicente Gonzalez (TX-34), and Jimmy Panetta (CA-19) reintroduced the Foreign Adversary Risk Management (FARM) Act which would combat foreign interference in the American agricultural industry by making reforms to the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS). These reforms would protect American land from nefarious activity by adversaries, such as China. Senator Tommy Tuberville (R-AL) and Senator John Fetterman (D-PA) introduced companion legislation in the U.S. Senate.

Jackson said: "America's agricultural industry is no exception to the increasing national security threats our country faces. Biden's failed leadership allowed unchecked foreign influence, particularly from the Chinese Communist Party, to interfere with and attempt to control our food supply chain. Representing Texas's top agricultural-producing district, I am committed to ensuring our nation's food production remains free from foreign manipulation. This is why I am proud to reintroduce the FARM Act, putting America first and ensuring that our agricultural industry remains robust, secure, and free from foreign interference. Thank you to Senator Tuberville for leading companion legislation in the Senate, and we hope this bipartisan legislation, which is crucial to our food security, will move forward quickly to President Trump's desk."

Tuberville said: "Over

the last decade, we've seen a surge of American farmland purchases from our foreign adversaries," said Senator Tuberville. "These foreign investments are now reaching every piece of the very large puzzle that makes up our agriculture industry, from farming and processing, to packaging and shipping. Food security is national security, and we cannot allow our adversaries to have a foot in the door to our critical supply chains. We must prioritize oversight of foreign investment in our food supply chains, especially from Russia, China, North Korea, and Iran. This starts with giving the agriculture community a permanent seat at the table on CFIUS. As Alabama's voice on the Senate Ag Committee, I will keep fighting to secure our ag supply chains so that our agriculture community can continue to put food on the table for America's families."

Sessions said: "Foreign investment in the American agriculture industry continues to grow at a rapid pace. A large percentage of this land is owned by Chinese Communist Party (CCP) backed investments, which poses a large national security risk, as it affords China the opportunity to undermine our food and investment industries. The United States farmland is a critical piece of infrastructure and should continue to be recognized as such. Our food insecurity is a matter of national security. The FARM Act will give us the opportunity to better combat maligned foreign investments in agriculture and protect the American people. I am proud to stand next to my

fellow members of Congress during this renewed effort to secure American interests."

Panetta said: "Foreign control of American farmland and businesses poses a risk to our national security and food supply chain," said Rep. Panetta. "That's why I'm proud to co-lead the bipartisan FARM Act, which ensures our agriculture industry is recognized as critical infrastructure and strengthens oversight of foreign investments. By adding the Secretary of Agriculture to the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States, we can better safeguard our farmland, protect our farmers, and secure our food system for future generations."

Gonzalez said: "Now more than ever, it is important that we safeguard American supply chains. The FARM Act would empower us to better monitor foreign investment for national security risks. I

am proud to join my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to protect American agriculture and our food supply chain."

Texas Farm Bureau President Russell Boening said: "Texas Farm Bureau (TFB) applauds Sen. Tommy Tuberville and U.S. Congressman Ronny Jackson for introducing the FARM Act," said TFB President Russell Boening. "As Texas has experienced a surge of foreign investors buying agricultural land, it is critical to provide proper oversight to ensure our national security. We are pleased this bill accomplishes this goal, while in-turn protecting private property rights of landowners who wish to sell their property. TFB appreciates these Congressional leaders for their steadfast leadership on this issue, and we look forward to working with them to secure passage of this bipartisan legislation."

## Kovar Capital: What Financial Goals Should I Set for 2025?

Hey Taylor - I set some fitness goals for myself as New Year's resolutions, but a few weeks into January I'm wanting to get my financial life in order. If you had to make a beginner's to-do list for me, what might it look like? - Nena

Hey Nena - No reason why you can't focus on fitness and finance for the year. Everyone's situation is different, but if we're talking about basic financial goals for the year, here are some starting

points: Build an emergency fund. If you haven't already started an emergency fund, 2025 is the year to make it a priority. It's hard for people to start with this because there are so many other pressing bills, but you have to be prepared for the unexpected if you ever want to get ahead. Having three to six months' worth of living expenses saved up in a high-yield savings account can make a world of difference when things go wrong. If you've already got some savings, ask yourself if it's really enough. Inflation and rising costs mean that what seemed like a solid emergency fund a few years ago might not cut it today.

If that's the case, aim to increase it by 10% this year. This won't be easy, but setting aside just \$50 a month that you'd otherwise spend on food or fun will make a huge difference. Pay off debt. If you need to pay off debt and beef up your emergency fund, it's really hard to imagine investing in retirement as well. Even if you can only spare \$50 or \$100 a month, starting to invest now will have a huge impact on your future wealth. Time is your best friend when it comes to investing, and the sooner you get in the game, the more you'll benefit from compounding interest. Focus on these three things and you will probably have a successful year. Good luck!

## Toni Says: How Do I File A Medical Claim With Medicare?

Hi Toni: This week, I went to see my primary care doctor and his office manager informed me that they are no longer accepting Medicare. I recently enrolled in Medicare and will have to pay the complete bill upfront and be re-

imbursed by Medicare. His office is a small one, and he will be retiring soon, so I need to find a new doctor. Can you please tell me what I need to do to submit the bill for this doctor visit to be reimbursed? Thanks Cybil...Louisville, KY

Hello Cybil: I am hearing through the Medicare grapevine from clients who come to the Toni Says office for a Medicare consultation, that a few primary care/medical providers are retiring. The office paperwork, whether it is for Medicare age patients or under 65 medical claims, is very overwhelming. These offices do not accept Medicare as your doctor is doing and will not bill Medicare for you. They want you to submit the claim to Medicare and wait to be reimbursed.

Did the doctor's office charge Medicare rates or charge you their rates and want you to be reimbursed from Medicare what Medicare pays rather than what they charged you? I have not heard of this type of problem with larger medical offices, especially those that are part of a hospital system.

My advice to clients who are new to Medicare is to begin searching for medical providers that are accepting Medicare, especially when a serious health issue is involved.

Below are tips from the Toni Says Medicare team

which can help you:

- Before you set the appointment for your medical visit, ask the doctor's office if they are still accepting Medicare. Most important, if this is a new doctor's office, ask if that office is accepting "new Medicare patients" and will that office will bill Medicare directly. If the doctor's office says "NO." Cybil, you need to make a decision:
  - a. Do you want to pay out of pocket and be reimbursed only what Medicare pays? Remember, doctors know they are not paid their asking rates. Medicare is not the only entity that discounts the doctor's bills. Group and individual health insurance plans with network providers, also discount the doctor's bills. Or...
  - b. Or do you want to look for a doctor or specialist who will accept Medicare assignment and bills Medicare directly? Again you should verify that the office is accepting new Medicare patients. Ask your primary care doctor for more than one doctor or provider that he/she recommends for your specific medical situation.
  - If your doctor does not accept Medicare, it is not hard to file a claim. You may have to pay the complete bill and submit the claim to Medicare. Make a copy of your medical bill to submit to Medicare, along with any information

regarding your medical claim.

- Visit Medicare.gov and in the search bar type "filing a claim." The information provided will explain how to submit a claim and to download the claim form CMS-1490S "Patient Request for Medical Payment". The CMS-1490S form has instructions regarding submitting the form with an itemized bill and supporting documents. The form lists by state where you need to send everything. Cybil, if you need help filing a claim call Medicare at 800-MEDICARE (633-4227) and ask the Medicare agent for help filing the claim. Medicare will be happy to assist.
- Readers, the Medicare.gov website is unique. The website offers those exploring Medicare-- whether turning 65, past 65 and retiring or laid off-- various options to make finding the correct Medicare plan simple. # Pet Talk

## Pets With Disabilities: Deafness



Pets can experience hearing loss just like humans. Hearing loss in pets may be the result of disease, old age, or the pet may even be born deaf. No matter the cause, pets with hearing loss can still be great companions.

Sometimes it may be difficult to determine if your pet is experiencing hearing loss. Because pets cannot verbally communicate how they are feeling, it is important for pet owners to pay attention to or record normal behavior in their pets in order to easily detect abnormal behavior. For instance, not responding to their name being called may be a sign of hearing loss in your pet. Other signs of hearing loss may include your pet being unresponsive to loud noises or food being poured into their food bowl.

One simple and effective way to see if your pet is experiencing hearing loss is to wait until your pet is asleep or not looking at you. Try to make loud noises without causing vibrations in the floor or allowing your pet to see your movement. If your pet is unresponsive to the noises you make, this could mean their hearing is not fully functional.

“When pets do not turn toward loud noises, this is a good marker they may be deaf,” said Dr. Stacy Eckman, clinical assistant professor. “If you clap or whistle, they should at least perk their ears up or turn toward the sound.”

Typically there is no cure for deafness or any way to slow the progression of hearing loss in pets. Since we cannot judge levels of hearing loss in pets like we can in people, pets can lose hearing ability before

a hearing impairment is even detected. Hearing aids are typically not used in pets because they are expensive, may not be comfortable for the pet to wear, and they do not work in pets who have complete hearing loss. Although pet owners may think deafness bothers their pet, it may actually bother the owner more than the pet itself. For example, most dogs are not bothered by their deafness because hearing is not their main sense.

Despite their disability, pets with a hearing impairment can still learn commands via hand signals. As long as the hand signals are clear and consistent, a hearing-impaired pet can learn commands. In addition to teaching their pet hand signals, Eckman said some pet owners utilize vibrating collars to train and get their pet's attention. These collars can be bought at most pet stores. No matter the method used, hearing-impaired pets are certainly train-

able. To keep your hearing-impaired pet safe, keep them in a fenced yard or in your home as you would with other pets. You may choose to add a bell to your pet's collar so you always know where they are. In addition, it may be beneficial to add a tag on the pet's collar to indicate they are deaf in case they ever get lost.

“If your aged pet becomes deaf, it can still be a wonderful companion,” Eckman said. “Teaching the pet commands based on hand signals

and vibrations can further strengthen the bond with your pet. If you are adopting a deaf pet, they are still very trainable and great companions as well.”

Although some may think it can be challenging to care for a deaf pet, hearing-impaired pets are just as loveable as a pet with full hearing.

## AAA Texas: State Gas Price Average Rising Amid Fluctuating Crude Oil Prices

The statewide gas price average in Texas is \$2.74 per gallon for regular unleaded fuel, according to the AAA Texas Weekend Gas Watch. That price is five cents more compared to this day last week and is two cents more per gallon compared to this day last year.

Of the major metropolitan areas surveyed in Texas, drivers in the El Paso area are paying the most on

average at \$2.96 per gallon while drivers in Wichita Falls are paying the least at \$2.61 per gallon.

The national average price for a gallon of regular unleaded is \$3.13, which is three cents more when compared to this day last week and five cents more per gallon when compared to this day last year.

The state gas price average experienced a slight uptick compared to last

week and the same period last year. While the statewide average is up five cents, some Texas metropolitan areas have experienced weekly increases as low as two cents to as high as 22 cents per gallon.

However, the longevity of this upward momentum remains uncertain. Recent data indicates fluctuating crude oil prices over the past week, which could influence future gas prices.

At the time this release was published, the price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) is \$75.51, which is up more than \$2 per barrel since the start of the year but has declined from the 2025 high, seen last week, by \$3 per barrel.

Historically, colder temperatures during this time of year typically lead to a decrease in demand for gasoline.

This property tax information is current and covers a wide range of topics, such as taxpayer remedies, exemptions and appraisals, and has information for select groups, such as disabled veterans and persons age 65 or older.

Whether you are a homeowner, business owner, disabled veteran or taxpayer, it's important you know your rights concerning property tax laws" said Tyson Paronto, Chief Appraiser of the Gray Appraisal District. "You can contact us about any property tax issues with full confidence that we will provide the most complete, accurate and up-to-date information available to assist you."

This includes information about the following programs.

- Property Tax Exemptions for Disabled Veterans** – The law provides partial exemptions for any property owned by disabled veterans or surviving spouses and surviving children of deceased disabled veterans. Another partial exemption is for homesteads donated to disabled veterans by charitable organizations at no cost or not more than 50 percent of the good faith estimate of the homestead's market value to disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The exemption amount is determined according to percentage of service-connected disability. The law also provides a 100 percent homestead exemption for 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses and surviving spouses of U.S. armed service members killed or fatally injured in the line of duty.
- Property Tax Exemptions** – Non-profit organizations that meet statutory requirements may seek property tax exemptions and must apply to their local appraisal district by a specific date. Child-care facilities; medical or biomedical property; businesses that receive tax abatements granted by taxing units; ship inventory out of Texas that may be eligible for the freeport exemption; store certain goods in transit in warehouses that are moved within 175 days; construct, install or acquire pollution control property; own and operate energy storage systems; convert landfill-generated gas; or store offshore drilling equipment while not in use may also be eligible for statutory exemptions
- Rendering Taxable Property** – If a business owns tangible personal property that is used to produce income, the business must file a rendition with its local appraisal district by a specified date. Personal property includes inventory and equipment used by a business. Owners do not have to render exempt property such as church property or an agriculture producer's equipment used for farming.
- Appraisal Notices** – Normally, taxpayers receive a notice of appraised value from the appropriate local appraisal district. The city, county, school districts and other local taxing units use the appraisal district's value to set property taxes for the coming year.
- Taxpayer Assistance Pamphlet** – This Comptroller publication explains in detail the functions of a taxpayer liaison officer, how to protest a property appraisal, what issues the county appraisal review board (ARB) can consider and what to expect during a protest hearing. The publication also discusses the option to request limited binding arbitration to compel the ARB or chief appraiser to comply with a procedural requirement and the options of taking a taxpayer's case to district court, the State Office of Administrative Hearings or regular binding arbitration if the taxpayer is dissatisfied with the outcome of the ARB hearing.
- Homestead Exemptions** – A homestead is generally defined as the home and land used as the owner's principal residence on Jan. 1 of the tax year. A person who acquires property after Jan. 1 may receive the residence homestead exemption for the applicable portion of that tax year immediately on qualification for the exemption if the preceding owner did not receive the same exemption for that tax year. A homestead exemption reduces the home's appraised value and, as a result, lowers property taxes. Applications are submitted to the appropriate local appraisal district.
- Productivity Appraisal** – Property owners who use land for timberland production, agricultural purposes or wildlife management can be granted property tax relief on their land. They may apply to their local appraisal district for an agricultural special appraisal which may result in a lower appraisal of the land based on production, versus market value.
- Residence Homestead Tax Deferral** – Texas homeowners may postpone paying the currently delinquent property taxes due on the appreciating value of their homes by filing a tax deferral affidavit at their local appraisal district. This tax relief allows homeowners to pay the property taxes on 105 percent of the preceding year's appraised value of their homestead, plus the taxes on any new improvements to the homestead. The deferral postpones the remaining taxes, with interest accruing at 8 percent per year but does not cancel them.
- Property Tax Deferral for Persons Age 65 or Older or Disabled or Disabled Veteran Homeowners** – Texans who are age 65 or older or disabled, as defined by law, or who qualify for a disabled veteran exemption may postpone paying current and delinquent property taxes on their homes by signing a tax deferral affidavit. Once the affidavit is on file, taxes are deferred, but not cancelled, as long as the owner continues to own and live in the home. Interest continues to accrue at 5 percent per year on the unpaid taxes. You may obtain a deferral affidavit at the appraisal district.
- Protesting Property Appraisal Values** – Property owners who disagree with the appraisal district's appraisal of their property for local taxes or for any other action that adversely affects them may protest their property value to their county's ARB.
- Informal Meetings** – Property owners can request an informal meeting with appraisal district staff to try and resolve their disputes prior to attending ARB hearings.

# AGRICULTURE MINUTE

## Egg Prices Continue To Climb



### Texas Crop and Weather Report

Outbreaks of highly pathogenic avian influenza, HPAI, continue to drive egg prices to record highs across the U.S., said Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service experts. David Anderson, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension economist and professor in the Texas A&M Department of Agricultural Economics, Bryan-College Station, said egg prices have skyrocketed to record highs due to ongoing supply disruptions caused by HPAI outbreaks in commercial laying flocks. The U.S. Department of Agriculture is reporting “sporadic outbreaks” within commercial meat and egg production flocks. Since Feb. 8, 2022,

more than 134.7 million birds have been lost across 1,410 flock outbreaks, including 637 commercial and 773 backyard flocks, in every U.S. state, according to USDA’s Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service. Wholesale prices for large Grade A eggs hit an all-time high of \$6.14 per dozen on average nationally Jan. 18, according to the latest USDA report. For perspective, the previous price peak for the same dozen eggs was \$5.38 in December 2022 and \$2.20 per dozen in January 2023. Similarly, the price peak in 2023 was related to HPAI outbreaks in poultry flocks, Anderson said. “There is seasonality to egg prices based on demand, but the cutting of supplies, in this case by disease, has driven prices

higher,” he said. “I wouldn’t be surprised to see them go higher in the next report, but there is price volatility when you consider the supply and demand factors in play.” **Laying hen numbers impacting egg supplies** The USDA reported 304 million table egg laying hens in the U.S. flock as of Jan. 1, a 2.3% drop compared to the 311 million laying hens at the same time last year. Greg Archer, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension poultry specialist and associate professor in the Texas A&M Department of Poultry Science, Bryan-College Station, said the time it takes to rebuild the laying hen flock will depend on factors still in flux. Environmental conditions are prime for the HPAI-causing pathogen, he said. The disease prefers temperatures below 90 degrees. The poultry industry, which has dealt with

Water lightly stained; 43 degrees; 5.60 feet below pool. The fishing pattern is still consistent. Catfish can be caught drifting fresh cut shad and spot locking out on the main part of the lake. Report by Brandon Brown, Brown’s Guide Service. Cisco-GOOD. Water slight stain; 50 degrees; 12.54 feet below pool. The bite is very slow for anglers who brave the weather. Report by Lake Cisco Rentals. Coleman-SLOW. Water normal stain; 50 degrees; 0.35 feet below pool. Largemouth bass are dispersed throughout the lake relating primarily near stumps and boat houses. Crappie are slow with jigs and minnows. Ft. Phantom Hill-SLOW. Water stained; 50 degrees; 7.00 feet below pool. Crappie are fair as anglers continue to wait for crappie to move to winter patterns on deep structures. Bass are slow with a shallow crankbait or spinnerbait on rocky structure on the south side. Greenbelt-GOOD. Water normal stain; 50 degrees; 47.49 feet below pool. Crappie are in standing timber. Sand bass are good. Catfish are good on minnows and worms. Largemouth bass are good. Hubbard Creek-SLOW. Water Stained; 50 degrees; 13.30 feet below pool. Bass are fair with a few three fish stringers over 10 pounds. Try dragging soft plastics slowly on the bottom in 8-15 feet of water. Blue catfish can be caught on juglines with live bait or cut carp. White bass are schooling throughout the day.

Meredith-FAIR. Water stained; 43 degrees; 47.53 feet below pool. White bass are good on silver blue rapalas and minnows. Largemouth bass have been caught on artificial grubs and minnows in Sanford Yake Cove and Bugbee. Catfish are good around Harbor Bay. Many are catching catfish on chicken liver and minnows. Crappie are slow with no reports this week. Bluegill and perch are fair underneath the docks and shallow areas around the lake with worms. Walleye are great on minnows. Floating worm harnesses and red head jigs are good. The Stilling Basing, Spring Canyon, has lots of trout and channel catfish. Report by Dave Wright, Wright-On Bait, Tackle and Watercraft Rental. Millers Creek-SLOW. Water stained; 52 degrees; 2.49 feet below pool. Bass are slow. Hybrids are still scattered, expect them to start schooling mid-December. Blue catfish are fair on shad in 14-20 feet of water. Very few catches of channel catfish. Crappie are slow in 14 feet of water. Nasworthy-FAIR. Water slightly stained; 50 degrees. 0.46 feet below pool. The bass bite has been fair flipping soft plastics around reed bases in 1-3 feet of water. The key is to cover water until you find a good stretch that holds multiple bass. It is also important to slow down your retrieve this time of year to trigger these lethargic winter largemouth. Crappie were fair around main lake boat docks on chartreuse jigs and catfish were fair on cut bait and stink bait around river channel bends. Report provided by the Angelo State Fishing Team. O.C. Fisher-SLOW. Water stained; 45 degrees; 38.85 feet below pool. Few reports and anglers fishing due to low lake levels. O.H. Ivie-GOOD. Water slightly stained; 48 degrees; 23.11 feet below pool. Largemouth bass are

fair with 9 pound catches possible on rage swimmers on umbrella rigs, small shad patterns swim-baits and jerkbaits to 10 feet suspended over deep water. Some bass reported upriver on hags half ounce tsunami jigs green pumpkin with trailer. Crappie are fair on minnows around Elm Creek, mouth of bull-hollow and Ranger Cove suspended over deep water trees. White bass good on mine like in 30-45 feet of water on slabs and jigging spoons. Report by Wendell Ramsey, Ramsey Fishing. Oak Creek-SLOW. Water lightly stained; 45 degrees; 18.21 feet below pool. Anglers are reporting a slow bite for all species. We have received some reports of crappie being caught in 8-10 feet of water. Black bass can be caught with Alabama rigs. Report by Bronte Guns and Tackle Pro Staff. Possum Kingdom-FAIR. Water stained; 47 degrees; 0.10 feet below pool. Stripper are fair in 20-40 feet of water with live bait. The water should now be cold enough to try deadsticking, but it may need to drop a few more degrees to really be worth trying. Look for them in 20-40 feet of water. Stay on the trolling motor and keep moving. If deadsticking, stay still and let the fish come to you. Hold your rod still and set the hook at the slightest hint of a bite. The fish are constantly moving and you should be moving too unless deadsticking. Sand bass are fair in 20-30 feet of water with live shad or small slabs and jigs. White and silver are good colors, but white seems to be preferred. Catfish are still fair to good. Fish up the river near Rock Creek Camp. Cut shad is producing good numbers of fish in 5-20 feet of water fished on or near the bottom. Some people like to use cut carp and Buffalo and have good luck with that. It may be worth

multiple avian influenza outbreaks since 2015, aggressively applies its biosecurity regimens, but intermittent outbreaks continue to occur. Archer said migratory birds have historically been the main culprit. For instance, the pathogen might be introduced to a poultry house in the form of migratory bird feces on the bottom of a shoe or from farm to farm in the tread of a feed delivery truck.

“Farmers take biosecurity seriously because they’ve been dealing with the threat for years,” he said. “The big question this time is the strain mutations and how outbreaks in poultry facilities are occurring.”

### Rebuilding the egg-producing flock

The recent transmission patterns have not been so clear cut, and the spread of the disease to and from dairy cows, pigs and humans has further blurred the lines for potential transmission sources, Archer said.

When it comes to replacing lost birds, Archer said it can take 20 or more weeks for birds to develop from incubated eggs to pullets to production-ready laying hens. Laying farms are typically large and can include 1 million or more birds living in several stand-alone laying houses.

If an entire farm is wiped out by the disease, Archer said farmers bring

those farms back online in phases to stagger their production by new and older birds. Eggs produced by younger and older birds are typically smaller while hens in their prime lay large to jumbo eggs.

Anderson said the flock rebuild will be a contributing factor on where prices go from here.

### Consumer demand amid high prices

Consumer demand for eggs had been trending upward but could wane with higher prices. The higher costs at grocery stores could also drive consumers away from more expensive niche egg categories like “cage free,” “free range” and organic until prices fall. The higher prices might also push consumers to calculate the cost-per unit difference between egg sizes like medium versus jumbo for breakfast or baking needs.

The impact of egg price increases is rippling into restaurants, bakeries and driving decisions and price increases across other markets, he said. The good news for consumers is that these disease-driven price spikes are temporary, historically.

For instance, by May 2023 the dozen large eggs that cost over \$5 the previous December had dropped to 84 cents per dozen, Anderson said.

“Producers will be expanding their flocks to produce more eggs to meet demand and capitalize on the high prices, while consumers might cut back,” he said. “That combination aligning

with fewer instances of avian influenza as the weather warms up would likely put downward pressure on prices. There is a natural ebb and flow to egg prices from seasonal supply and demand, and HPAI has just added volatility to the market.”

### Panhandle

Overall soil moisture was short to adequate. The district received 4-8 inches of snow that should benefit topsoil moisture. Planted small grain fields had emerged and were making good progress; however, recent dips in daytime temperatures will slow the rate of growth. Fields planted as cover crops needed additional moisture. The supplemental feeding of cattle continued. Pasture and range conditions were poor to fair. Overall crops were poor to fair.

Crappie are slow with mostly smaller sized catches in deeper water on structure. Channel catfish are slow on stink bait. Report by Captain Michael Peterson, 4 Reel Fun Guide Service.

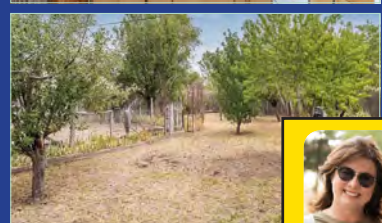

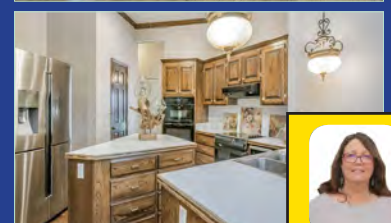

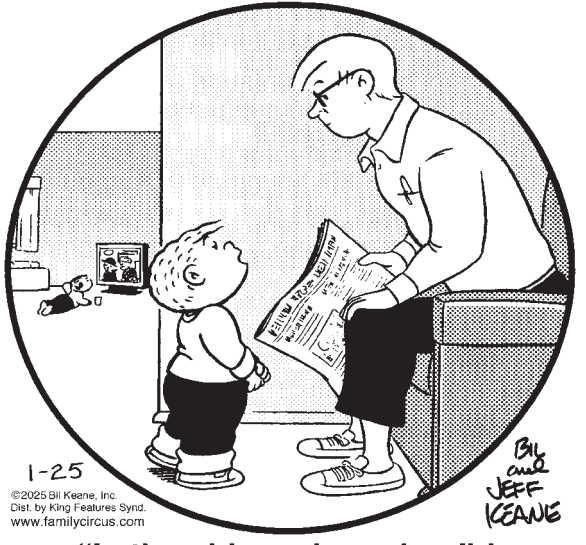

## Asking Eric...

Dear Eric: My 65-year-old brother Greg is dying. Lately, he has wanted to talk about how he has no regrets about the "wonderful" life he has led. Now he's pressing me to tell him I have no regrets about my life, which has only caused me to think about how many I do have.

When we were growing up, Greg made my life hell. He bullied me mercilessly; he threatened me with sexual abuse. My parents were too busy dealing with his teachers or the police calling about Greg fighting or setting fires.

I do have to credit him for turning his life around when he was 30. He dove into a New Age religion and made a career out of helping other troubled adults get past their traumas.

In his 50s, Greg went on a mission to make amends to all the people he had hurt earlier in his life. When he approached me, I thought I would finally be getting the apology I had waited for my whole life. But he claimed to have forgotten the specifics of any of the horrific things he'd done to me.

I know Greg's no-regrets mantra is his way of accepting his impending death. But I can't tell this mostly unrepentant brother that I have no regrets. Just growing up in the wrong family was bad enough. What do I say to him about all this?

— Trying to Reframe My Perspective

**Dear Perspective:** "Know your truth and tell your truth." So said Kent Matthies, a therapist at Council for Relationships, when I consulted him about this letter.

Timing and your brother's condition is a factor here. If he's, for instance, in and out of consciousness, you may not be able to have a conversation that's productive for you. Telling your truth may instead look like talking to a friend, a therapist or a support group for abuse survivors.

Next, Matthies advised to ask for what you need. It might be to your brother, but it can also be to others in your life. Particularly to intimate partners — don't be afraid to talk about where you are and what will help you feel safe.

You've been conscripted unwillingly into your brother's narrative. So, the goal is for you to find ways to define the story for yourself and reclaim your power.

That may mean forgiving, but that's not a given. It could also look like everyday self-care practices, engaging with nature or music, or being in community, said Matthies. "Yes, this really matters, and there's also a whole planet here. It can be easy to feel like this is our whole world."

When dealing with those who have harmed us but refuse to acknowledge the harm, Matthies advised to "allow yourself to grieve in whatever way you need to, in a supported manner that's effective to you." There is no timeline and there is no perfect grief.

Your brother may not be what you need to process your pain. You don't have to have no regrets. But acceptance of what the truth is and where you are emotionally is possible. You don't have to play a part in your brother's no-regrets outlook, either. You aren't required to be what he wants in this story.

Dear Eric: A childhood friend and I communicate every few months or so via email — brief messages of a few lines. We live across the country from each other. He's not a techie so we can't use FaceTime, etc.

In his emails, he wants my thoughts on issues then after I spend considerable time answering and providing my thoughts, I hear nothing back. Crickets.

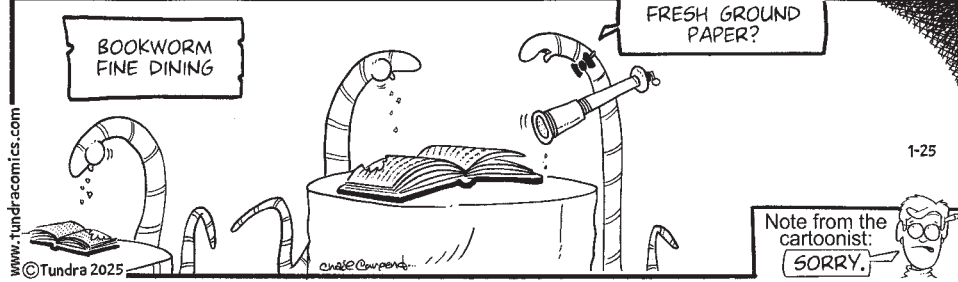
After not hearing back I asked if he received my email. His response? Nothing.

Recently we were in Europe for five weeks and he emailed wanting to know all about what we saw, the food and the people. I am not going to reply to the latest inquiry as I'm sure I won't hear back.

He's a college grad, was a school administrator and seems social. I have decided not to send any details of our most recent trip or any other inquiries that require more than a few, very brief lines. Honestly, I'm totally fed up with putting considerable time and effort into an email only to hear nothing in response. Why do people do this?

 Dear No More: Time to pick up the phone. If you enjoy communicating with him but hate his bad email etiquette, a quick catch-up phone call takes away the strife. It also creates a great opportunity for you to ask, "If you're so interested in my thoughts, why don't you ever write back?"

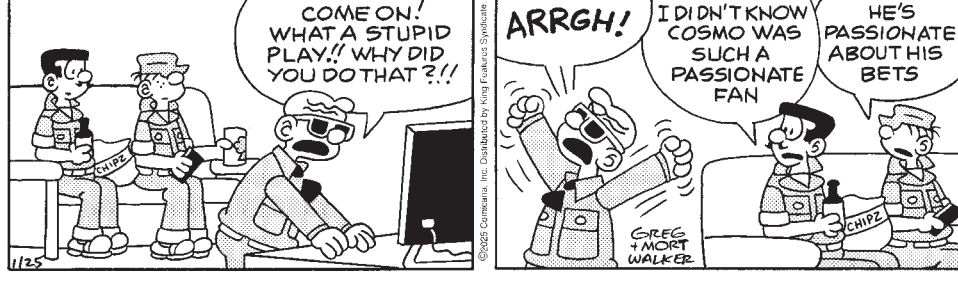
