
Students grades 8-12 complete service hours per year. Each St. Vincent graduating class completes a required amount of service hours. Many of the hours are completed through certain projects.

Some of the service projects students participate in are Operation Christmas Child, Options for Women drive, assisting at the SV Food Pantry, March for Life, Penny War for the Annual Catholic Appeal, serving mass for weekday and weekend religious services, serving funeral services and Rake Day along with many other events.

Traditions are huge for any community or school. St. Vincent is no different as the school uses the "Pass the Light" Mass to kick off Catholic Schools Week.

All families of seniors and kindergarten students are invited to the "Pass the Light" Mass, which starts Monday, Jan. 30, at 8 a.m. The entire student body attends the special mass.

"Passing the Light during our CSW Mass is rich in tradition! The seniors are now ready to take their light into the world. This Mass involves our seniors handing the light over to our kindergartners as a testimony to continue igniting their light while at SV, so they too can develop and learn to be everything God created them to be,' St. Vincent Elementary School Principal Diane Unterreiner said. "All attending this Mass are able to see the transformation of a child from early steps to the present."

During the ceremony, St. Vincent seniors and St. Vincent kindergartners process into the St. Vincent de Paul Church and perform a ceremonial "passing of the light." Seniors pass a



candle to the kindergarten students to signify passing the St. Vincent tradition to the kindergartners. As the seniors are leaving, kindergartners are entering their journey to Catholic faith.

"We are rich in tradition much like the Catholic religion is," Unterreiner said. "We want our hearts to be quiet enough to be open and let the Holy Spirit in."

During normal weeks, elementary students attend chapel on Wednesdays while high schoolers take part in a weekly chapel mass Thursday morning. An all-school mass for kindergarten through 12th grade students is held once per month.

The 'Pass the Light' Mass is a big deal within the school.

"Parents and grandparents take off," Unterreiner said. "Our faith is a big deal and being able to build that relationship with God is huge. While academics are

In the past, there have been relatives within the school who have been a part of this special ceremony, but regardless, Unterreiner noted that the seniors become role models for their younger St. Vincent counterparts in the process.

"These kindergartners look up to these seniors,' Unterreiner said. "You can see it in the younger students' eyes sometimes, just how much they want to be a part of the older students' lives. It's a beautiful thing. As the elementary principal, I often share with my upper grade students that they are a hero in the eyes of those who are younger than them and each hero sets the example of the hero they want for them. This is like what happens during the Mass as our kindergartners look up to our seniors as their hero because of the example each SV senior provides."


Unterreiner noted that she looks forward to this particular ceremony each vear
