Further to the timeline two organizations merged New Farmers of America NFA and Future Farmers of America they adopted the name Future Farmers of America. The organization let females officially join in 1969. The name National FFA Organization is our official name now with the FFA still standing for the history of our farmers but agriculture and FFA have evolved into more than just farming with us having more of a diversity in jobs and other opportunities we have for example becoming a science, working in food, being a veterinarian, and even working in construction all are apart of FFA and agriculture.

Missouri FFA was chartered in 1929 and the Perryville FFA was founded in August of 1934 with 32 members. From the beginning of this school year we have 105 members and our numbers grow each year. 

many hours the member has put into their project. They allow students to independently manage their project while also being supervised by the chapter advisors.




and what means to me
