# Goal remains the same for talented, BIG SV GOLF TEAM

To say the St. Vincent golf team has a large number of players this year would be an understatement.

The Indians boast 23 golfers, which is possibly the most on the team in the program's history. If it's not, then the total is high on the list.

"We had a great turnout this year," first year coach Eric Clements said. "We are going to do our best to get everybody out on the course and see what they can do."

Clements is hoping the large numbers will help with the success of the program, which has been doing well in recent years. 

# SV BASEBALL IS YOUNG, but still competitive this year

St. Vincent baseball will have to reload this season to maintain its successful ways.

The Indians have reached the district championship game in back-to-back seasons, and if they want to do it for a third straight season, they will have to do so with a new cast of characters.

The Indians lost six seniors from last year and a whole lot of production.

"We lost quite a bit production on both sides of the ball, and a lot of pitching," St. Vincent baseball coach Corey Squer said.

St. Vincent lost its three top pitch-

ers in Blake Monier, Grant Abernathy and Liam Krauss, all three of its outfields. However, St. Vincent returns a majority of its infield, including seniors Christian Schaaf (third base) and Simon Barber (shortstop)

"We have a talented group, but we will be young," Sauer said. "I'm very intrigued to see what we can do."

St. Vincent lost approximately 100 innings on the mound from last year and Sauer said he is looking for any capable arms. The returning player who pitched the most innings from last year was juniors Jacob Seabaugh and Nick Buchheit. Sauer said he will lean heavily on his two most experienced pitchers.

He also said that Tyler Hennemann will see some time on the mound as well as the two seniors.

"In Class 2 baseball, if you can throw strikes, you might find yourself on the mound at some point," Sauer said.

Offensively, Sauer said his offense will be a "work in progress," at least for the start of the season. He said

he will utilize bunt his team's speed early.

"I try to use the small ball method and we have a lot of speed this year," Sauer said. "We are replacing some big shoes and had some talented hitters. We have some young guys with some good swings that bring a lot of potential. They just haven't have the opportunity yet. It has the potential to be a very deep lineup."

Sauer called his offense "a revolving door," in that any one player could be hot at any given time.

Schaaf is the best returning hitter with a career .380 average, along with Seabaugh, Buchheit, and Barber. Sauer is also looking at Trenton Welker, freshmen Andrew Schumer and Gavin Hotop.

"It will be plug-and-play for the first part of the year," Sauer said.

Sauer is still confident in his young team in terms of a postseason run.

"To measure success it's going to be getting them out there and seeing that they can do," he said. "we still have enough talent and returners that we should still be able to compete."

The Crusaders saw an increase in numbers from last season and even an improvement from across the board from all his golfers.




