

John McClain, starting his second year as cross-country coach at St. Vincent, said his team exceeded his expectations last year.

"I was a little uncertain going in," he said.
"They were a pretty new team and had some pretty low numbers, especially on the boys' side. "We weren't sure if they would make state or not. We were down to six runners on the boys' side."

The top four teams in the district go to state, and the boys finish in third place and make the cut. Out of 16 teams, St. Vincent was ranked dead last.

Despite that, senior Jackson Unterreiner ranked 15th in the state, and freshman Carter Henneman finished in ninth place.

Looking forward to this season, McClain described the boys' side of the team as "pretty young" but added that senior Ethan Hotop, who qualified for state last season, "is definitely a talented runner."

Another standout this season is Noah Hager.

"He has had some injuries — some health issues — so he wasn't able to run much last year, but we're hoping he can get back to health this year," McClain said. "We don't have any junior boys this year, just two sophomores and four freshmen.

As far as the girls on the team, McClain said they're every bit as talented as the boys.


"The ladies worked incredibly hard," he said. We had some more numbers, but still a lot of new faces last year. Again, it was kind of a learning experience, and unfortunately, they finished fifth at district, just one spot shy of qualifying for state. That was definitely a little bit of a heartbreaker for them."

Two of the women qualified for state on their own.

"The top 30 individuals at districts can still compete at state as individuals," he said. "Abby Kern, who will be a senior this year, was able to go, as well as Reagan Meyer. They both ran personal bests there. They didn't quite make the cut for all-state, which is making the top 30 at the state meeting, but they were knocking on the door."

McClain believes his team will have a successful season if they continue to put an emphasis on consistency.

SV FOOTBALL NOT LIVING IN THE PAST DESPITE STATE TITLE RUN

Beginning his seventh year as St. Vincent's head football coach, Tim Schummer doesn't have much to complain about last season.

"Last year, we finished with a 9-4 record," he said. "We lost in the state semifinals to Marionville, and they went on to win the state championship. We had a really good year. We won our conference for the second year in a row and had a lot of fun."

And while the team graduated six players, 17 starters are returning this fall. Still, Schummer isn't necessarily expecting another state championship to be in the cards.

"Last year was last year," he said. "We've got to move on and get ready to take on the new season. Nothing that happened last year is going to help us in any game this year as far as the score goes. So, we've just got to make sure that we're focused and ready to go for game time.

Despite losing six seniors last year, Schummer is confident the team has some strong players to take their place. One of those players is senior Cruz Reitzel.

"He's our starting running back," he said.

"He had a phenomenal year last year. I think he broke our school record for touchdowns in a season. So that's a big one to have back. I'm very excited to have him. On the defensive side of the ball, we've got a lot. Carson House is returning. He got injured at the end of the season last year, but he was a starter for us as a sophomore and was our second-leading tackler up until he got hurt in the ninth game of the year. So, it'll be fun to get him back on the field. John Schwartz is another kid who had a phenomenal year last year. That'll be exciting to see him play, but I'd say, for the most part, just getting the team back together, getting them all out there and seeing them perform will be exciting."

Schummer knows that no matter how well your team did the previous year, you never know how things will turn out when you start a new season.

"You've got to take it one game at a time," he said. "So, just focus on what we need to do right now, and eventually, it'll take care of itself."

SV GIRLS' VOLLEYBALL TEAM HAS NO SHORTAGE OF TALENT IN 2024



The SV girls' volleyball team finished a game under 500 during last season's playoffs. While the team won district, it suffered a heartbreaking loss in a sectional round to the Advance Hornets, proving that a third time isn't always the charm.

Despite losing a half-dozen seniors at the end of last season, Coach Darren Verseman has a solid team made up of seven seniors, nine juniors, seven sophomores and seven freshmen for the 2024 season.

One of the team's returning players is Allison Bierk, who made all-district and all-conference last year.

"She led our team in a bunch of statistical categories and was our team MVP," Verseman said. "We're really excited about what she's going to do this year, especially the way she's been playing all summer."

"Then, there's Brigid Sauer, who is also a senior. She's a middle hitter for us. She was banged up during last year's playoffs, so she didn't get a lot of post-season recognition that she might have. She's a five-foot-11-inch middle, and having tall girls is something that St. Vincent hasn't had a lot of historically."

Another outstanding senior that Verseman says "bloomed in full-flower" is Alaina Cates.

She's the other middle," he said. "She's a junior now. She played as a sophomore and did really good work for us last year. I expect her to be really good again this year."

Verseman is also looking forward to senior Haley Emmendorfer's return after she suffered a knee injury, but he doesn't expect her to get back out on the court until October. She was an all-conference and all-district center for the team last year.


"Clara Clifton got the call up last year for the district from JV to varsity as a middle when Brigid went down, and she really excelled," he said. "I wasn't sure how she would do against varsity competition, but she didn't shy away at all.

"Another outside hitter is a new girl to the school, Kate Rubel. She'll be our main outside, and she also has a ton of game, too. She'll probably play six rotations as well. Her twin sister, Bree, will stand in as one of our setters, and that's not giving her the credit she deserves because she could probably

play just about any position we have on the court."

SAXONY CROSS-COUNTRY COACH BELIEVES FOCUS MAKES THE DIFFERENCE



Over the past 12 months, Saxony's cross-country team has undergone a number of positive changes.

"Last year, we added numbers," said Max Weiser, who became the school's cross-country coach in 2019. "The year before, we had really low numbers, but last year we had our biggest boys' team since I've been coach, and we had two girls qualify for state, and one got all-state," "We were a growing team last year. We only graduated one, so this should be a big year for us. We've got five senior boys and two senior girls, so we're looking for this year to be a really big one.

"On the boys' side, I think this year, with our experience, we have a chance as a team to qualify for state if we can get top four in districts. Out of our leaders right now, we have

Mark Richey and Nick Chambless. They both ran under 20 last year, and they've put in a lot this summer. Seth Mueller, a senior, has been big for us as well. But we have, I think, about eight guys that should be under 20, and we have a couple hoping to get down close to sub-18.

Weiser said he was impressed with the team's effort during training over the summer.

"We had a pretty solid group," he said. "Again, the two I mentioned — Mark and Seth, and a lot of others on the guys' side have been really consistent this summer. And so, I think we're way ahead of where we were. A lot of them participated in the July 5k that HealthPoint puts on, and they were already pretty close to their times that they ended with last year.

"We've got five healthy girls right now, and I have a sixth one that I think, once she comes back — she has a bit of a foot problem — she'll be a contributor as well. We had two seniors that both made it to state this year, and Myra Roth made all-state last year for the first time. Faith Dreyer made it to state. I think she was a little intimidated by the size of the state meet, but I think this year she'll have that experience. I think she's going to look at getting all-state this year as well."

Weiser believes there's a reason for his team's recent success.

"I think that this team has grown well together," he said. "The guys are really close, and the girls are really close, but they also support each other. This year it just seems like the team's more focused than we were last year."



Starting his 11th season as boys' soccer coach at Saxony, Chris Crawford described last year's season as "decent" and admitted that with only one senior on the roster, the team was "pretty young."

"We struggled through some ups and downs early in the season, but you kind of expect that out of a young team," he said. "We ended up upsetting Perryville in the first round of districts last year and lost to Afton. We had a good season, probably a little better than what most people would have expected out of us, but we played well.

According to Crawford, he focused the team's summer training on fundamentals.

"The way that we're passing — passing to the correct foot, making sure that we're setting our teammates up for success by not putting them in poor positions based on how we're passing and just trying to get them to understand the way that we play and the way we want to do things."

Setting his sights on the upcoming season, Crawford believes the team has some outstanding players.

"This year, we have some seniors who are all going to contribute in a variety of ways. Jonathan Pfeiffer will be a center back for us, and he's a really exciting player. We had to move him out of a spot where he was

more of an attacking player into a defensive spot just for the team's needs. Then we have Jackson Wilson, who will be in the midfield and up top for us. He's a real technical player. Owen Buckeit will be in goal. It's his second year playing, but he grew by leaps and bounds over last year.

"Brayden Moore has scored a ton of really big goals for our program. Noah Kim will be on the outside as an outside back. He just keeps getting better and better every year. He's worked his way into a starting role. That's our seniors, and then we've got some younger guys that were freshmen last year that played a lot of minutes that we're looking forward to developing a little bit more. We've got a lot of guys that we're looking towards.

And what's Crawford's outlook for the upcoming season?

"We always try to make our schedule relatively tough, and this year is no exception," he said. "We're going to expect to be playing our best soccer at the end of the year like we did last year. We're going to focus on the team. It takes 11, not just one or two or nine. It has to be all 11, and everybody has to be brought in and on the same page. If we can do that, we'll be fine. If not, it's going to be tough for us."

SAXONY SOFTBALL COACH EXPECTS TEAM WILL FACE TOUGH SEASON — AS ALWAYS

Coming off last year's winning season, long-time Saxony softball coach Mark Lewis hopes for another great year for the team.

"We had an excellent year," he said. "We play in an extremely tough conference in our tough district, and each year it's very competitive. Now that he has his own program, Turner has some ideas on how to build the Saxony Lutheran program from the ground up. One of his most important goals is to build a culture for the program.



up with about 500 yards last year. We've got Barrett Wheeler returning at running back and Brett Bohnert is back there as well. Both of those guys are pretty talented.




Halpin said the orientation period proved to be a valuable one that influenced the coaches' direction for the team this year.
