IT IS FAIR ME IN ALTENBURG

MULE JUMPING TO

The East Perry Community Fair has had a mule jumping event since 1982, but the number of mules participating has been declining in recent years due to a decrease in people owning and jumping mules in the area. Luke Ponder has taken over as superintendent for the competition and with the help of sponsors he secured, the prize money has been increased from \$300 to \$2,400. There will be three classes of mules based on the height of the mule plus a fourth open class where the top jumpers from the other classes will participate. In addition, there will be a \$500 bounty for a mule that breaks the existing world or fair record jumping height. Ponder has been in contact with jumpers from throughout Missouri and several top competitors plan to attend the event which takes place on Saturday, September 21 at 3:00 p.m.

The "Best Little Fair in the Land" will open with a parade at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, September 20 featuring several bands, floats and other entries. High School bands including Perryville, St. Vincent, Oak Ridge, Meadow Heights, Bell City, Bernie, Chaffee, Greenville, and Doniphan will provide musical entertainment during the parade. The parade will be led by its Grand Marshal Rev. Dr. Paul Winningham who recently retired after serving as the Pastor of Grace and Zion Lutheran Churches of Uniontown and Longtown for thirty-four years.


The first musical group to take the stage will be Him & amp; Her at 4:00 p.m. on Friday followed by Still Standing at 7:00 p.m. Saturday's music will bring a wide variety of music to the stage beginning at Noon with Landon Overbey, Carly Green, Deuce Denninger & Deuce East End Blend, and Clint Statler all performing hour-long sets. The Fault Line Band will wrap up the Saturday musical entertainment at 7:00 p.m. At 6:00 p.m. the traditional awarding of attendance prizes will take place.

The starting time of the 4X4 Truck Pull has been moved forward to 6:00 p.m. on Friday and on Saturday at 6:00 pm the Hot Rod Tractor Pull which will again feature the Illinois Hot Farm Stock Pullers will take to the track. The carnival rides this year will again be provided by Goldstar Amusements, which is a family owned and operated business with over six generations of history. They will be bringing around ten rides to Altenburg, including some big rides, as they return to the south after spending the summer in Iowa, Minnesota, and the Dakotas.

As always, the fair will feature the judging of entries in home economics, photography, horticulture, field and forage, 4-H, and FFA departments. Most of the livestock judging and shows will take place throughout the day on Saturday ending with the 4-H and FFA sale of all types of livestock and at 5:00 p.m.

This year there will be twenty food and soft drink stands including some newer selections like freeze-dried candy, hot dogs, fried Oreos, and seasoned fries. Traditional fair favorites like grilled cheese sandwiches, pork burgers, corn dogs, and funnel cakes will also be returning.

The "Best Little Fair in the Land" is pleased to be able to continue free parking, free admission, and free entertainment, but reminds everyone that having a large crowd in a small town requires patience in dealing with traffic and parking issues. All fair parking except for livestock trucks and trailers and pulling trucks and tractors must enter the fairgrounds via Poplar Street. Please follow the directions of the traffic staff and parking attendants who will only be on duty from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on both days. Arrive early to take in as much of the fair as possible before enjoying your favorite entertainment or event.

2024 East Perry Community Fair Parade Grand Marshal:

Dr. Paul Winningham

The East Perry Community Fair is proud to announce that Dr. Paul Winningham, the recently retired Grace Lutheran and Zion Lutheran Church pastor, will be honored as the grand marshal of the 2024 East Perry Community Fair parade.

The annual fair parade will be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 20, and will run through the heart of Altenburg. The route begins at Maple Street in Altenburg and travels east down Main Street until it reaches Church Street. At this point, the parade turns right and heads south on Church Street until its conclusion at the fairgrounds.

> The parade will once again include a cast of great participants. Many local high school bands, including Perryville, St. Vincent, Oak Ridge, Meadow Heights, Bell City, Bernie, Chaffee, Greenville, and Doniphan, will provide musical entertainment during the parade. In addition, local schools, athletic teams, civic organizations and area businesses will march, have floats or feature other entries

promoting their causes.

The parade has a history of being well supported and attended, so avoid heavy traffic by arriving early to find a clear, comfortable viewing spot. As a friendly reminder, traffic flow into Altenburg is stopped around 1 p.m. to organize the parade lineup. Please plan accordingly if you're expecting to attend.

The East Perry Community Fair is honored to have Dr. Winningham serve as this year's grand marshal for his 34 years of leading and shepherding the Grace and Zion Lutheran congregations in Uniontown and Longtown.

Born and raised in Akron, Ohio, Dr. Winningham has lived in East Perry County for over half his life. Born the youngest of four children of Jerry and Martha Simon Winningham, "Pastor Paul" is married to the former Diane Theurer, whom he met in college while both were studying to be teachers. The couple has been blessed with five children: Daniel (and Carolyn), Timothy (and Katy), Hannah (and Dustin) Welker, Peter (and Grace), and Sarah (and Jake) Glaus. They also count among their priceless blessings 11 grandchildren: Cara, Dominic, Evelyn, Collin, Caitlin, Braylin, Andrew, Leo, Nora Mae, Emma and Naomi,





who is with Jesus.

After graduating high school, Dr. Winningham attended Concordia University in Seward, Nebraska, where he graduated with a degree in elementary education, with no intention of ever becoming a pastor. Following graduation, he began teaching third and fourth graders in a combined classroom and coaching soccer, volleyball, and softball for grades 6 through 8 for two years in Sawyer, Michigan, and four years in the Chicago suburb of Hillside. He also worked with the youth of the congregations. Through the encouragement of others, Dr. Winningham entered Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, from which he graduated in 1990. That same year, he was called and installed as the pastor of Grace and Zion Lutheran churches, where he continued to serve until his retirement at the end of June.

From 2001 to 2005, he also assisted with teaching the Old and New Testament at Saxony Lutheran High School until a full-time religious instructor was installed.

In 2007, he was accepted into the Doctor of Ministry program at Concordia Seminary, where he continued to grow and learn. He graduated in 2015 after completing his Major Applied Project, a study of partnered congregations, with particular emphasis on the partnership that Zion and Grace congregations have shared since 1963.

In addition to serving Grace and Zion churches, he was appointed by the president of the Missouri District of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod to the office of circuit visitor twice and re-elected three times. In this post, he has served the local circuit of congregations by calling a new pastor when they were vacant, among other duties.

Beyond these duties, he has served two terms on the Saxony Lutheran High School Board and occasionally leads chapel services. Involved with the Perry County Ministerial Alliance, he writes occasional columns for the Republic-Monitor and produces the yearly schedule of contributors. Pastor Winningham and Diane also serve as occasional docents for the Lutheran Heritage Center and Museum in Altenburg.

For fun, he enjoys being outdoors, whether gardening, running, or anything else that fills the lungs with fresh air. Seventeen years ago, wanting to experience what the New Testament describes about running a race, he trained and ran in the Akron Marathon, traversing all kinds of familiar and historic places of his childhood home. For many years, he participated in the River Hills run, held on Saturday of the fair, and is likely the fair's only grand marshal to have participated in and won the race.

He loves the interplay of music and the Word of God, he enjoys setting Scriptures to music, playing those done by others and writing poetry occasionally, with the hope of bringing it to life in music.

Fascinated with the challenges of pastoring more than one congregation, he maintains a passion for encouraging and assisting those who serve in such settings.

From the time the Winninghams settled in Uniontown, the fair was a big deal! Their children marched in the parade and participated in the fun of the weekend, eating favorite 'fair foods' and even helping with Sunday morning cleanup after church some years.

They helped serve at the hamburger stand for 10 years with other Lutheran school parents while their children were in elementary school. Once their children began attending high school, they started serving at the fish stand alongside other parents and faculty of Saxony Lutheran High School. The Winninghams always enjoyed visiting with co-workers and customers while working at the stand.

Many of the fair's exhibits and displays catch Dr. Winningham's attention. He thinks it's neat to see residents' different gifts and talents, whether it is an eye for photography, gardening success, craftwork, kitchen skills, etc. The Winninghams are pleased that some of their grandchildren will also be exhibitors this year.

"I am humbled to serve as grand marshal, knowing full well that many others have lived here longer and served a broader spectrum of the community," said Pastor Paul. "In accepting this honor, I hope it can remind us all of many more faithful, hard-working, and loyal residents who will never receive this recognition but whose labor deserves recognition as well!"

God has blessed the East Perry Community Fair with abundant grace and mercy, and the fair recognizes that faith is the backbone of our community. With that, we congratulate Pastor Winningham on a job well done, thank God for bringing him to our community and are proud to have him serve as grand marshal for the East Perry Community Fair Parade.



- Each mule may jump in only one class based upon height of mule, except for mules in open class. All mules will be measured before competition begins.
- Mule will be limited to one handler and one hazer. Hazer may not contact mule in any way and must remain outside barriers. Only handler, hazer, and officials may be in the immediate jumping arena.
- No whipping or mistreatment of mules will be permitted.
- Top bar of barrier will be supported by dowel pins. If a pin is broken the jump will not be allowed.
- Twelve-foot side barriers will be used. Mule must be stopped inside barrier area before jump. Any mule leaving the approach area may receive one additional attempt.
- Each mule will receive two tries at each height. A time limit may be implemented or each mule may be limited to one try due to a large number of entries or other time constraints. Number of tries for each mule will be determined prior to the start of each class.
- In the event of a tie, a mule that completes the jump on the first attempt will be placed ahead of a mule that completes the jump on its second attempt.
- Inappropriate behavior and foul language will not be tolerated. A mule, or mules, may be disqualified for the action of its handler and hazer or helpers.



4-H&FFASTEERS

In addition to animal judging, the East Perry Fair also features an animal auction.

The annual 4-H and FFA Youth Steer Sale will be held on Saturday, Sept. 21.

This sale is open to all county 4-H members, as well as FFA students who have beef projects, meet all the show requirements, and have shown animals in the East Perry Steer Show.

> The official weigh-in will be at 5 p.m. Friday, Sept. 20. The steer show is at 8 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 21. The steer must weigh at least 1,000 pounds.

> All steers in the sale must be born on or after Jan. 1 and owned by March 1.

"It gives a chance for the kids with these animal projects to make some money," said publicity chairman Fred Eggers. "It started out with just steers, then they added barrows (swine)."


The event's Livestock Sale Committee and the respective 4-H and FFA superintendents have the authority to eliminate any animal from the sale that does not qualify under guide rules.
