A friend told me about her annual "found money" game.

She starts out every year looking for lost change on the ground. She looks in parking lots when she steps out of her car, steps up on a curb, goes for a walk. Everywhere she goes is on the lookout for dropped change.

She drops all the money she finds into a coin jar. At the end of the year, she counts her bounty and gives thanks for found money. I take that one step further. When I pick up found money I read the official motto of the U.S., "In God We Trust," on the coin and give God my thanks for found money.

It was nice to hear from Martha Stricklin this week. She was searching for a recipe she had shared with me

last year. I happen to have it written in my recipe log. I called it Are You Kidding Me cake.

When she sent me the recipe I compared it to similar ones I have and that is how I came up with the name.

**Recipe: Are You Kidding Me cake**
