Chili cook-off heats up HMC cafeteria

The atmosphere was getting hot in the Hardin Medical Center cafeteria last week – along with some tongues – as hospital employees gathered to taste samplings of the inaugural HMC Chili Cook-Off.

“Oh man, it was great and everybody that I know loved it. The goal was to boost morale and bring people together. We’re trying to improve our work environment and I’d say this certainly helped,” said Chris Lambert, an infection and quality control specialist at HMC.

He exclaimed, “It was crazy. We originally thought we might get, maybe, nine or 10 entries. We wound up having 18 chilis entered in the cook-off.”

There were five independent judges tasting all 18

chilis and scoring them on a 1 to 5 scale for the overall winner. There was also a People’s Choice award given for the chili chef who accumulated the most spoons.

After each HMC employee or guest tasted their fill of chili, they placed a spoon in a bucket in front of each chili container. The bucket with the most spoons was the People’s Choice winner.

Madison Buzanis was declared overall champion, representing the radiology department, and presented a trophy that will have her name engraved on it.

The People’s Choice winner Patti Murphy, representing Physical Rehabilitation Therapy.

It should be mentioned that one chili was a hit with pretty much everyone, judges included, even though it didn’t come in first overall or people’s choice – it came in sec-

ond place in both categories.

The chili taking second place in both categories was a white chicken chili cooked by Lamanda Taylor, representing Surgery.

“Oh, this is sublime,” said one judge after tasting Taylor’s chili, adding, “but I just can’t score it first place. I love it, but I’m a traditional chili kind of guy – red beans, red sauce, ground beef and chili powder.”

Another judge agreed, but also said, “True, but you’ve got to give the chef points for thinking outside the box and coming with something different. It’s not a traditional chili, but it’s really, really good.”

All five judges agreed there wasn’t a bad chili among the bunch, so their choice was difficult, but in the end Buzanis’ came out on top.

Lambert noted there was

one other fun contest at during the Chili Cook-Off last Tuesday, which was a “guess how many M&Ms are in the jar” contest, with the person guessing closest winning the jar full of candy.

“Jacob Bomar from (information technology) won it. I don’t know how he did it – he must be really good with computers, because he picked up the jar and counted up, and then counted over, and then he did some kind of calculation,” Lambert said laughing.

“He was only four off. He guessed 305 M&Ms in the jar, and there was 309.”

HMC Marketing Director Lisa Peterson said Buzanis gets to enjoy the trophy for the next year, when it will be passed on to next year’s HMC Chili Cook-Off winner with their name added.

Bids will be thereafter publicly opened and read aloud. **Hardin County School System** reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to waive any informality in the bidding whenever such rejection or waiver is in the interest of the Owner.

A certified check or bank draft, payable to *Hardin County School System*, U.S. Government bonds, or a satisfactory bid bond executed by the bidder and acceptable sureties in an amount equal to five (5) percent of the bid shall be submitted with each bid. No bids may be withdrawn for a period of **90 days** after opening of bids. Owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive informalities and irregularities.

All bidders are required to comply with General Licensing Act of 1976, also known as Tennessee House Bill No. 2180 and T.C.A. 62-6-119 of 1994.

Effective January 1, 2011, a masonry subcontractor must be licensed with an “LMC” classification in order to bid or to be listed on the outside of bid envelope as a Licensed Masonry Contractor (LMC) when the masonry portion is \$100,000 or more (including materials and labor). The BC-9 or BC will not be acceptable.

Bidders must be properly licensed under the laws governing their respective trades and be able to obtain insurance and bonds required for the Work. A Performance Bond, separate Labor and Material Payment Bond, and Insurance in a form acceptable to Owner will be required of the successful Bidder. The successful bidder will be required to furnish and pay for satisfactory performance and payment bond, bonds or insurance surety.

ADDITIONAL BID REQUIREMENTS:

- A. This project will have Federal Wage Rates for Hardin County. This project will have federal money included and should have federal wage rates in the bid.
- B. In addition to the Bid Form, Bid Bond, and all other required bid documents, the Bidder shall submit with his/her bid a list of at least (4) four commercial roofing projects completed in the last five (5) years that includes:

- 1. The project name and location
- 2. Owner’s name and contact information including address and working telephone number.

A. The Bidder is also required to submit proof of performed commercial roofing work completed under his/her license number within the last five years, and proof warranty work from manufacturer of any installed roofing system for the past five years.

B. As per the System’s participation in the U.S. Communities Government Purchasing Alliance’s Program for Roofing Supplies and Related Products and Services, as priced by and awarded to Garland/DBS, Inc., resulting from the competitively solicited Sealed Bid #09-5409 issued by the Cobb County Board of Commissioners, it is the intent of the System to purchase direct the identified materials on the “Garland Materials List”. The authorized Garland Applicants Bid shall include everything except for the materials listed on the Material List. The roofing contractor shall also be responsible for accepting the materials at the job site and staging them where they feel necessary. If materials remain once the job is complete, the System has the option to decide what to do with the materials. One option, if the System decides to return the unused/properly stored materials to Garland, the contractor shall be responsible for the restocking fee.
