Italian lemonade recipe

Ingredients

2 cups basil simple syrup (recipe to follow)

2 cups sparkling water, ice, and lemon twist in each glass.

Basil simple syrup recipe
 1 bunch fresh basil, washed and stemmed

2 cups white sugar

1 cup water

Directions

In a saucepan add water, sugar, and basil. Simmer until sugar is dissolved - about 5 minutes. Cool and strain into a bottle. Store in refrigerator.

Mix lemon juice, basil simple syrup, and water in a
