Drugs, guns and cash seized

On Friday, Aug. 25, agents with the 24th Judicial District Drug Task Force, the Hardin County Sheriff's Office, and the City of Savannah Police Department executed a narcotic-related search warrant in the 3000 block of Gladden Road in the Shiloh community, according to Sheriff Johnny Alexander.

He said that while there, agents located approximately 6.5 pounds of marijuana, more than 100 hydrocodone pills, 41 Xanax pills, two firearms, and approximately \$20,993 in cash.

Virgil Deshazier, the resident of the home, was arrested and taken to the Hardin County jail. Deshazier is charged with possession of Schedule VI (marijuana) with intent to distribute, possession of Schedule II (hydrocodone) with intent to distribute, possession of Schedule IV (Xanax) with intent to distribute, possession of a firearm during the commission of a dangerous felony, and money laundering, the sheriff said.
