permitted and any horse-drawn vehicle must be equipped with a brake.

All rules and regulations are included on the application and each application must include a signed release before being allowed to participate.

All entries must be appropriately decorated for Christmas, or you may be refused entry into the line-up for the parade. No live costumed Santa actors will be allowed on any entry.

The registration deadline for judging was last Thursday, but Ashe-McLean said those wishing to participate may still register.

"This is a judged event and I have to do a line up and then call everyone, so the deadline is firm. Participation will not be denied after that, however, because we want everyone to be in the parade that puts time and effort into a float. If you did miss the deadline you will be at the end of the parade and you will not be eligible for judging and the prize money," she explained.

In fact, she encourages those who want to partake to register.

"The parade is a wonderful way for any group to be involved. We believe the parade to be an iconic part of our small town Christmas and encourage anyone to

participate. We try to make it a wonderful night for everyone in the parade and for those watching it," said Ashe-McLean.

After registration your group's contact person will receive instructions on your entry number, line-up location and any other details organizers may need to give you.

"The floats have become so nice and everyone takes so much pride in their entries. We try to do our best to separate the music and light entries so they don't sound over each other, but it is getting harder each year, but again, we do our best. So, the more information included on the form, the better the line-up is," Ashe-McLean detailed.

The parade route follows last year's route, beginning on Wayne Road at Sherwin Williams and proceeding through town to the River Museum. Participants will line up down Shell Street and across on Fairgrounds Road. The judges are in front of CB&S Bank on Main Street.

Entry forms may be picked up at the Chamber of Commerce office at the Tennessee River Museum or Savannah City Hall. The forms can also be printed from the parade event post on the Chamber's Facebook page.

Registrations may be mailed, faxed, or hand delivered to the Chamber. No call-in entries will be accepted.

The rain date for the parade is Monday, Dec. 11.

in March, as part of her proposed annual budget, and that for five months she repeatedly asked about the status of her request but received no response.

She didn't find out the request was denied until August when the County Commission voted on the budget publicly, according to Harmon.

Hopper then sought to transfer funds from her budget for part-time employees, which usually

has money left over at the end of the year, and was told in essence, "maybe," Harmon said.

He said that under state law, county office heads have only 30 days to either accept their budget as passed by the County Commission, or file suit to work out any disagreement before a judge.

"Ultimately, an agreement was reached to allow the line-item transfer and drop the suit," Harmon said. "Without the suit, however, Trustee Hopper,

and more importantly her employees, had no recourse if her alternative request was again denied."

Prior to the settlement, Hoppers said in September that the employees she wanted to get raises were

paid \$23,645 and \$26,920 annually.

Attorney Amber Shaw, who represented Mayor Davis, described the settlement as "the best plan we could create where the taxpayers were not negatively affected."
