- · Historic downtown charm, with opportunities to explore local shops, cafés, and the beautifully restored Commodore Hotel.



If history is y o u r thing, be sure to stop by the Perry County Chamber of Commerce and Welc o m e Center at 215 East



MOUSETAIL LANDING STATE PARK

Located on the banks of the Tennessee River in western Perry County, Mousetail Landing is a gem in the state's park system. The park covers 1,249 acres of forest, flowing streams, scenic limestone bluffs, and boasts more than two miles of river shoreline. To get there, go west from Linden on Highway 412 for 13 miles, turn right on Highway 438. The park entrance will be on your left about two miles north. Visit the Park Visitor's Center & Museum to learn more about the name.

Buffalo River

MAY 12TH, 1868 BURNING OF PERRY COUNTY COURTHOUSE

One of the most defining moments in Perry County's history took place on May 12, 1863, when Union forces captured and burned the county courthouse in Linden. This event was part of the broader conflict that engulfed Middle Tennessee during the Civil War, leaving a lasting impact on the region and its people.

The Battle in Linden

Before dawn on May 12, 1863, a Union flotilla commanded by Lt. Cmdr. Ledyard Phelps landed elements of the 6th Tennessee Cavalry Regiment on the Tennessee River, about 12 miles west of Linden. The small force of 55 men, led by Lt. Col. William Breckenridge, marched into Linden at daybreak.

They encountered Confederate forces under Lt. Col. William Frierson, who were preparing to leave Linden to join General Van Dorn's troops at Spring Hill. Caught by surprise, the Confederates, numbering around 100 men, were quickly overwhelmed. After a brief skirmish, Union forces captured Lt. Col. Frierson and 46 Confederate soldiers. Three Confederate soldiers were killed before reinforcements could arrive, while the only Union casualty was a single horse.

During the battle, the county courthouse, occupied by Confederate troops, was set on fire, destroying many early Perry County records. The Union troops then withdrew, escorting their prisoners back to the Tennessee River, where they were transported to Cairo, Missouri.

The intelligence gathered from this operation provided Union leaders with valuable insights into Confederate movements in Middle Tennessee, including plans to re-capture Fort Henry and attack Union forces under General Rosecrans. The engagement was even covered on the front page of The New York Times on May 17, 1863.

Lt. Col. Breckenridge later died of disease on October 15, 1863, and was buried at Shiloh National Cemetery.

Re-Enactment of the Capture and Burning of the Courthouse

For years, Perry County has honored this historic event through a unique re-enactment that takes place on the original site of the battle, complete with live-fire demonstrations on the courthouse square.

While the 2025 re-enactment is on hold, plans are being considered to bring it back in 2026. The event, which was last held on May 11, 2024, featured a full day of Civil War-era activities, including:







- Victorian Ladies' Tea
- A period concert by the 5th Alabama Regimental Band
- A re-enactment of the Battle of Beardstown
- A parade of troops
- The Capture and Burning of the Courthouse re-enactment
- A Grand Military Ball for re-enactors

The event has drawn history enthusiasts, re-enactors, and visitors eager to experience the only known courthouse battle re-enactment held at the original site.







From arts and agriculture to outdoor activities and unique shops, or whatever you're in the mood for, you'll find it. Here are a few suggestions to get you started right off the bat. So, take your time and plan to stay a while.

Hike Lady's Bluff Trail, a National Recreation Trail, to the precipice overlooking the Tennessee River as it passes through "The Narrows." In spring and summer, you'll enjoy spectacular wildflower displays; fall brings vibrant colors, while winter offers far-reaching views.

Immerse yourself in history. Grab a brochure at the Welcome Center and head out to explore Perry County's Civil War history. Discover Cedar Grove Iron Furnace, the only remaining double stack charcoal furnace within the Western Highland Rim region of Middle Tennessee.

Or head out to Pinckney's Tomb, an eccentric folk structure thought to be the largest grave house in Tennessee.

If you're interested in Native American artifacts, poke your head into Linden's City Hall to view the archaeological display in the lobby.

Spend a sunny day on the river. Local outfitters can set you up for a fun day on various sections of the scenic Buffalo River. Perhaps you would rather be fishing? The Buffalo River is renowned for its world class smallmouth fishing and the Tennessee is famed for bass, catfish, sauger, and stripers.

Mosey around our two downtowns. Check out the beautiful murals on downtown Lobelville and Linden buildings. Pop into unique shops or savor numerous dining opportunities.

...And While You're Here, Suggestions On What You Can See & Experience

Lend your ear to "Music on Main Street" for some hot rhythms. Linden and Lobelville alternate weekends hosting this free perennial concert series on five summer Saturday evenings in May and June. Bring a lawn chair and set up for some good listening.

Visit the local Mennonite community and find handmade crafts by local artisans, locally produced honey and baked goods, bulk spices, and at local farm stands on Cane Creek and Russell Creek, fresh produce and more.

Have a bite to eat. There is a plate full of choices from one end of Perry County to the other. Chow down on real southern barbecue or scarf down some delicious Tennessee River catfish. How about hand-tossed pizza or southern-fried chicken?

In Linden, find one-of-a-kind creations at the Buffalo River Artisans Cooperative gallery on Main Street, and also on the main thoroughfare, stop by Main Street Marketplace, an emporium of small business owner specialty shops offering gifts and goodies you'll find nowhere else.

Practice your long drive or just putt around Buffalo River Country Club in Lobelville. This nine-hole public course covers 3,185 yards with a par of 36.

Motorcyclists can rumble down Tennessee State Route 13, one of the top motorcycle roads in the country. Make a beautiful scenic loop without a lot of traffic from Linden, turn down Marsh Creek Road, then onto Cedar Creek Road. Continue to Highway 128 to circle back to Linden on 13. Motorcycleroads.com calls this route a "great 5 star road with everything from winding, hilly, to curving. Just what every biker wants."

Find out how Mousetail Landing State Park got its name. Located on the banks of the Tennessee River, this 1,247-acre treasure offers something for everyone to enjoy. Camping, boating, day hikes, backpacking, swimming, and picnicking are just a few activities to try in this scenic wonderland.


