Shop Local This Season To Support Your Community

lip through the pages of this holiday guide and you will spot a few examples of local businesses giving back to the community, whether it's the tov drive at Arundel Federal Savings Bank or Lights on the Bay, the Annapolis display that is made possible by sponsors.

These businesses make it part of their mission to support the Greater Severna Park community by hiring local workers, donating to Boy Scouts and sports teams, and by making the area a better place to live. While these places have never stopped supporting Severna Park, during the COVID-19 pandemic, it's especially important to support them.

According to a report by Yelp, 163,735 U.S. businesses closed between March 1 and August 31, and those are just the ones listed on the Yelp website. Small businesses need our help to survive.

"Before you make

that purchase through the online marketplaces. please check out our local businesses," said Liz League, president of the Severna Park and Arnold Chamber of Commerce. "You can most likely find

anything you are looking for while supporting our local economy. If a business doesn't have it, they will surely be able to get it for you."

Local businesses have adapted to serve customers safely and efficiently during the pandemic. Franklin's Toys, for example, is offering curbside pickup and allowing customers to shop by phone and FaceTime.

"Now more than ever, it's appreciated if people shop local, not just here but everywhere," said Franklin's Toys co-owner Stephen Kaufmann. "Some businesses might not survive this. We're doing OK but not where we should be."

When the pandemic hit, Fishpaws

Marketplace started offering delivery throughout Anne Arundel County on purchases of \$75 or more. Garry's Grill started delivery and created an outdoor seating area.

Cafe Mezzanotte began offering curbside pickup and

is the season for ... catering! Though COVID-19 may hamper some holiday plans, it doesn't have to damper the spirit. A smaller party means more funds to amp up the food, and local restaurants have what you need to make the evenings (and days) bright.

Note: Delivery and pickup options could be changed based upon potentially changing COVID-19 restrictions.



Café Mezzanotte

Café Mezzanotte offers an assortment of platters to go — including appetizers and salads — think mozzarella caprese, grilled sausage, pancetta shrimp and fresh greens — and a variety of crowd-pleasing entrees. For \$55 or less, you can serve a small party of four to six people, giving them lobster penne, veal scallopini, shrimp scampi, or a choice for many premium Italian platters. A full tray of lasagna classico feeds up to 22 people for \$150.

The restaurant seasonally changes menus, and its fall/winter selections are now available, but Matthew Boyd, Mezzanote's banquet and catering manager, said customers' favorite appetizers are always

the mozzarella caprese and the 90-mile meatballs. Asked about the 90-mile name, Boyd explained the meat, comprised of veal pork and beef, is all sourced from farms 90 miles or less from the restaurant.

Other classic favorites include chicken parmesan, and lasagna, which offers a great family value and convenience. "They go a long way," Boyd said. Asked about the top catered desserts, Boyd quickly answered, "Our favorite go-to's are the mini cannolis. They are fantastic."

In addition to the catering menu, the restaurant customizes orders as needed.

The restaurant offers curbside pickup for regular day-to-day orders and large platters with payments accepted over the phone. Café Mezzanotte continues to do full-service catering and limited delivery for special circumstances arranged in advance.

Matinee and evening performances are available. Discounts are offered for seniors, students and Flexpass holders. For more information, visit www.annapolisshakespeare.org.




The Fingerprint Card



delivery through Grubhub.
Owner Kosmas "Tommie"
Koukoulis also opened a seafood market, which expanded
into an organic market to
support the local farmers who
provide Cafe Mezzanotte with
its meats and produce.

"I have learned that nothing can stop us," Koukoulis told the *Voice* in July. "I have learned that there are people within and around Mezzanotte who care about this place as much as I do."

There are countless examples of local businesses stepping up to help consumers.

By shopping local, customers are not only supporting their favorite businesses but also helping themselves, as Ben Birge, president and CEO of the Anne Arundel Economic Development Corporation, explained in the October edition of the Severna Park *Voice*.

"In Anne Arundel County, the Bureau of Labor Statistics shows there are more than 3,300 restaurants, retail shops and personal service businesses," Birge wrote. "These stores, cafes and beauty salons employ upward of 59,000 workers. So when you buy local, the money stays in our county."

According to U.S. Census data, Severna Park has more than 27,000 residents ages 18 and older. If each resident spent \$40 at local businesses this holiday season, the local economy would be infused with more than \$1 million.



the top and ending about an inch from the bottom. After drawing your triangle, divide your triangle into four horizontal sections, marking the bottom of each section with a wavy line. Using scissors, cut along each wavy line. Flip the smaller card with the tree shape inside-out so the tree is pointed toward you. Fold along the outside edges of the tree. creating a three-dimensional shape. Once completing these steps, glue down the cardstock, allowing the card to fold inward and the tree to fold outward. Once you have the fold of the card, you're ready to decorate. Add glitter, stickers or paint to bring your tree to life. You can add string or pipe cleaners to further decorate the card or act as a garland on




