How Is Climate Change Affecting Your Garden?

ave you noticed soggy spots in your yard that weren't there before? Are there brown spots in your lawn, holes in the leaves of your laurels, or yellow patches in your pachysandra? Mild winters and an increase in normal precipitation levels contribute to a number of insect, fungal, and other issues that negatively impact your plants and yard. Even well-established beds and mature trees and shrubs can suddenly and quickly succumb to disease if not managed.

Whether you operate on your own or enlist the help of a professional, early spring is a good time to take a close look at your lawn and landscape and act before minor issues become major problems.

Anthracnose on dogwood trees

Anthracnose is a general term used to describe a number of different fungal diseases that typically attack plants in spring when weather is cool and wet. Although this disease can affect many deciduous and evergreen trees and shrubs, it can severely damage our well-loved native dogwood tree if left untreated. Infected dogwoods usually have brown spots on the lower leaves and flower bracts. Ultimately, the infection spreads from leaves to twigs, causing cankers. In worst cases, infection leads to root rot diseases that can kill the tree. Healthy trees are able to withstand fungal diseases! Keep dogwoods mulched, fertilized and watered, especially during dry spells. Prune and discard limbs

that appear to be infected and use a fungicide to prevent the spread of disease. Make sure to sterilize tools used for pruning to avoid cross contamination.

Lace bugs on azaleas

We love good old-fashioned azaleas for bright spring color and evergreen interest. However, if the foliage of those once healthy and lush shrubs suddenly starts to fade and appear unattractive, it's most likely a victim of lace bug infestation! Unfortunately, warm, wet winters followed by periods of summer drought increase the likelihood that this pest will find its way to your yard. Lace bug nymphs and adults have piercing-sucking mouth parts and remove sap as they feed from the underside of the leaf. Eventually the feeding frenzy weakens the entire plant, making it more susceptible to other insect and fungal diseases and potentially leads to death. A great preventative measure is to treat azaleas and rhododendrons with a horticultural oil or insecticidal soap in early spring before new growth appears. Make sure to spray the back of the leaves, where lace bug eggs are generally found.

Shot-hole disease on laurels

Shot-hole disease is a common bacterial disease that affects cherry laurels and other plants in the genus Prunus. If you have no-

ticed small holes in the leaves of your cherry laurels, chances are your plant is infected! Generally, shot-hole disease is like acne in teenagers, unsightly but not life-threatening. However, like most infestations, this disease can weaken the plant and increase the likelihood of another fungal or insect invasion. Never water laurels overhead as poor watering practices increase the chances of bacterial development. If your shrubs are infected, cleanliness and copper soap are the solution. Rake up and discard leaves beneath the plants so the spores won't splash up and exacerbate the infection. Treat with a copper fungicide and take measures to increase airflow around the plants.

Other issues

Keep an eye on ivy and pachysandra beds as we have seen an increase in fungal diseases. Hollies and crepe myrtles are more infected with scale and resulting sooty mold than ever before! Brown spots or yellow patches in lawn mean that fungal disease is on the rise. And don't forget – it's the year of the locust. Cover young trees with mesh to prevent egg-laying and resulting damage on tender new shoots.

Three Steps To Get Your Deck Spring-Ready

he snowstorms are behind us and the sun is shining a little brighter, which means spring is just around the corner! As we say an enthusiastic goodbye to winter, we can't help but daydream about long afternoons spent outdoors under the sun with good food and drinks. Before you host your first barbecue, however, you'll want to make sure your deck is in tip-top shape and prepared for use. Below, you'll find a few steps you should take to beautify your

Conduct An Inspection

Winter weather can cause some unexpected damage to decks, especially if they are made of wood. Spend a few minutes walking the entire deck,

looking for any loose boards or railings. Be sure to also check under the deck for any mildew, rot or loose nails. If you find any corroding fasteners, damaged posts, or boards that are loose or warped, it's definitely smart to get those repaired as soon as possible. If it appears your deck needs guite a bit more work than just a few simple repairs, it might



be time for an upgrade: make the switch from wood to composite, expand an existing structure, or build an entirely new deck! With quicker installation times, winter and early spring months are ideal for homeowners wanting to maximize outdoor enjoyment in the summer.

Step 2: **Bust Out The Cleaning Supplies**

Once you know your deck is safe to use, it's time for a little outdoor spring cleaning. A pressure washer can clean dirt and grime away quickly and efficiently, but you'll want to make sure to use a

Water-Powered Backup Sump Pumps

Does rainwater keep flooding your basement? Are you tired of bailing, pumping, mopping and vacuuming? Have you lost personal treasures or endured the hassle of restoring your property? Are you facing increases in your homeowner's insurance because of basement flooding? Have you finally reached the point where you can't take it anymore?

After extensive research was conducted and approval

was gained from Anne Arundel County plumbing inspectors, the latest in backup sump pumps is now available. This pump does not require a battery that must be maintained and can only last for a limited amount of time when your electricity is out. Instead, it operates by using water power supplied through your public water supply, which flows virtually without interruption even when power is out.

The Basepump water-powered backup sump pump is the finest pump of this type on the market. Compared to similar products, the Basepump is capable of pumping twice the volume of water while using the same amount of fresh water (two gallons pumped per one gallon used). Additionally, the Basepump has a built-in atmospheric vacuum breaker (AVB). It does not require an expensive reduced pressure zone backflow preventer (RPZ), which is required by code on the installation of other pumps and also requires annual testing by a licensed plumber – an unforeseen expense.

During installation, a float is mounted in the sump pit above the normal high-water mark. Under typical conditions, your main electric-powered sump pump will handle all the pumping duties. When water rises higher than normal for any reason, the Basepump float in the sump is lifted and hydraulically activates the Basepump ejector in the ceiling through a pressur-

ized plastic tube. As municipal water rushes through the ejector, it creates a powerful suction force that causes the PVC pipe to act like a giant straw, drawing water up from the sump pit and ejecting it outdoors. As the water level falls, the float drops back down, and a pre-set timing control keeps the ejector running for about 30 to 45 seconds before shutting off the system. This allows a full pump-down of the sump, unlike some other pumps.

There are no impellers, turbines, motors or mechanical parts to wear out. There are no batteries, wires or chargers to monitor, tend to or replace. Ever! The operation is fully automatic. milder setting, as a high-pressure setting could damage the fibers of the wood. If you don't have access to a pressure washer, any areas where dirt and debris have gathered can be sprayed with a garden hose. For composite decks in particular, use warm soapy water and a soft bristle brush to remove dirt and debris from the embossing pattern.

Step 3: Give It A Spring Coat

You may have tucked your parka in the back of the closet until next winter, but you're still going to need a coat — a fresh coat of paint! If any parts of a wood deck seem faded or worn, repainting or restaining can certainly make the deck more visually pleasing. It also seals the wood, protecting it from moisture, staining and insects. Use long, smooth strokes with a roller or synthetic brush to apply solid stains in thin coats and semi-transparent stains or clear sealers in even thinner coats. Whatever type of stain you use, apply two coats to ensure there are no missed spots and to get a more uniform finish.

he only difference between gardeners and cheapskate gardeners is the amount of money they spend to achieve the same results. The truth is, like no other hobby, gardening is more productive when the cheapest even free — supplies are used.

CONTROL WEEDS

Homemade weedkiller. Dissolve two cups of salt in one gallon of white vinegar, and add one tablespoon of liquid dish soap. Move some of the vinegar to another container so you have room to get all that salt in there. Then replace the amount you removed and



add the soap. Apply with a spray bottle. Caution: Repeated use will sterilize the soil to where eventually nothing will grow.

KEEP CATS AWAY

Ammonia. Sink small open containers (baby food jars are good) into the soil up to the rim throughout the garden, and fill with household ammonia. Cats hate the smell of ammonia. **Pepper.** Sprinkle the garden with ground black pepper. Purchase it in bulk at a warehouse club or bulk grocer, and apply liberally to the affected area. It won't harm the cats but simply irritate their paws.

Plant flowers. Marigolds have a pungent odor that repels cats and other bugs and animals. Plant them among your vegetable and flower gardens.

PROMOTE NEW GROWTH

To guarantee the healthiest plants in town, when planting trees, shrubs and evergreens, scatter 10 unused match heads and one cup of Epsom salts in the planting hole. This promotes new growth and helps strengthen stems and roots.

Cheap fertilizer. Add two teaspoons of plain household ammonia to one gallon of water. Allow it to sit in an open container (and out of reach of kids looking for a drink) for 24 hours. Use on plants instead of commercial fertilizer.

BUILD SOIL

Fireplace ashes. Spread wood ash from your winter fires onto the garden beds. Also known as potash, it will gradually build the soil, adding potassium as well as 32 trace minerals. And it's free!

prices and will save you money over time. These systems are perfect for water softening, but they also work to remove harmful contaminants. The results of a water test and your water usage habits will determine the best system to treat your well water.
