Caring For Your Concrete In The Winter

Summer Hoder Worldwide Concrete



ith cooler temperatures upon us, it's a good time to start thinking about how to properly care for your concrete in the winter. Harsh elements like ice and snow, as well as freezing temperatures. cause many homeowners to use products such as salt or deicers to prevent slipping or falls. Preparing those surfaces properly is important for the longevity and beauty of your concrete, but knowing the right care is crucial.

Here are some things you can do to help protect

your concrete surfaces from the elements. One option for extending the life span on your concrete is to seal it. Be sure to clean your concrete surface and allow proper dry time before applying sealant.

Clearing it quickly is key. In the event of inclement weather (ice or snow), it is important to clear the surface as quickly as possible due to the freeze thaw cycle in Maryland. This freeze thaw cycle - causing the concrete to expand and contract - could eventually lead to cracking. It is advised to use a plastic shovel instead of a metal shovel and sweep remaining snow or ice with a broom. Metal shovels can damage concrete surfaces.

Although salt seems to

be a quick and easy way to prevent slips and falls with ice, unfortunately, this easy fix can prove disastrous for vour concrete surfaces. Salt alone can cause "water-like" stains on the concrete and eventually can begin to deteriorate the surface. Many of the chemicals used in deicers are highly corrosive and can severely damage your new or older concrete surfaces. We recommend using an alternative. One option is sand, which will not harm the concrete and will also provide traction for walking. Another substitute for salt or other deicing chemicals is cat litter, but this tends to be costlier. If salt and chemical deicers are your only option, make sure to get them off the surface as quickly as possible and avoid deicers that contain ammonium nitrate or ammonium sulfate.

Most of the time, the damage from winter is not visible until spring when you find your patio or driveway with spalling and/or pockets where you can see aggregate starting to show.

Concrete surfaces can be a durable addition, bringing beauty and functionality to your home in many ways, which is why proper care is important.

any homeowners express great pride and satisfaction in repairing things around the house. The typical garage door has the life span of nearly 20 years, but the most important garage door torsion spring, which bears the brunt of the lifting weight, has an average life span of nine to 10 years. To



ensure years of safe operation, it is a wise idea to have your garage door system inspected every spring and fall by a qualified professional.

On a monthly basis throughout the year, here are some basic regular maintenance tips you can safely perform yourself:

Lubricate

It is important to regularly lubricate all moving parts in your garage door system. Lubricate the chain drive and rollers, ensuring that you wipe off excess oil.

Tighten

As you are lubricating parts, be sure to tighten any loose fittings or rollers with the appropriate socket wrench. Parts that become loose and are not tightened can lead to major

breakdowns.

Inspect and replace

Home Upgrades For Better Indoor Air Quality

hen most people think about air quality, they're typically thinking about outdoor pollution. However, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the air inside your home can be as polluted, or even more so, than the air outside. The concentrations of some indoor pollutants can be as much as two to five times higher than typical outdoor concentrations.

This is partly due to increasingly energy-efficient home construction and the growing use of synthetic materials in furnishings and interior finishes.

The air inside your home also contains pollutants from everyday activities like cooking, bathing and cleaning. A family of four can produce the equivalent of 22 to 30 pounds of moisture per day from normal activities, according to the Institute of Specialist Surveyors and Engineers, while household cleaners and products like paint, upholstery, carpeting and plastics can release chemicals containing volatile organic compounds. Pets and dust mites also contribute to poor air quality.

On average, Americans spend an estimated 90 percent of their time indoors, according to the EPA. All that time with minimal access to daylight and fresh air can take a toll on your health. For example, damp and moldy environments can increase the risk of developing asthma by up to 40 percent, according to research published by the Fraunhofer Institute for Building Physics.

Particularly after all the extra time at home due to the pandemic, homeowners are placing greater emphasis on home design and habits that promote health and wellness. These steps for managing indoor air quality can help you create a healthier home.

Support your HVAC system

Many homeowners assume their heating and cooling (HVAC) system is adequate to manage their home's indoor air quality. Typically, these systems only circulate existing



indoor air, so you're missing out on the benefits of circulating fresher, cleaner air.

What's more, without regular servicing and frequent filter replacements, it's easy for standard HVAC systems to fall short. This is especially true in older homes or in households where there's a high volume of allergens like dust or pet dander. Adding standalone or integrated devices can help give your HVAC system some extra support. Air purifiers can effectively help filter pollutants while ultraviolet lights purify the air and help control pollutants like bacteria, mold and mildew.

Another common pitfall is humidity control. Too much moisture in the air can contribute to significant air quality problems. On the other hand, air that's too dry can promote dusty, abrasive conditions that are hard on allergies and other respiratory conditions.

Improve fresh air ventilation

When it comes to upgrades that improve air quality, better fresh air ventilation is near the top of the list for many homeowners. Improved ventilation allows you to clear out stale, polluted indoor air and circulate fresh, outdoor air in your home.

Polluted air tends to stagnate at the ceiling, so one effective and energy-efficient way to create natural ventilation is with skylights that open. Sometimes called venting or operable skylights, when you open skylights in combination with vertical windows, you create natural airflow that can help release indoor air pollutants and bring in fresh, clean air to keep your home. This concept is known as the chimney effect. Warm air naturally rises and escapes from open skylights while fresh air is drawn inside through the windows. This practice can reduce your reliance on air conditioning, improving your home's overall efficiency and keeping a lid on cooling costs.

Keep up with cleaning

Textiles like carpeting, rugs and window treatments can harbor a great deal of dust and dander that reduces air quality. It's important to regularly clean and air out these decorative fabrics and surfaces, especially

unappealing odors while releasing harmful particles into the air. Similarly, smoking indoors traps those chemicals inside your home, which can wreak havoc on indoor air quality.

Watch for unexpected culprits

For example, cooking food using gas appliances can emit hazardous chemicals and compounds, like nitrogen dioxide and carbon monoxide, that contribute to poor indoor climates when not properly ventilated. This will help you find a custom picture framer you can trust with design, workmanship and who guarantees their work for a lifetime. tain 50 to 400 percent higher concentrations of nitrogen dioxide than those with electric stoves, according to a report from the Rocky Mountain Institute, and the EPA found prolonged exposure to the gas can lead to asthma and other respiratory issues.

Similarly, when plastics are warmed up, they can give off potentially toxic fumes. Avoid leaving toys or other plastic items in direct sunlight. If you have heated floors or other heated surfaces, keep plastic away to prevent those heat-provoked emissions.

Check cables Check all cables for signs of fraying, crimping, or general wear and tear. It's safer to have a professional replace these.

Test auto reverse sensors

Similarly, close the door and cross through the path of the photo electric sensors. If the door does not auto reverse, your sensors need replacing.

Because you can easily damage the sensors or wires delivering power to them, keep debris, tools, and toys clear of the sensors and garage door tracks. This will enable smooth and safe operation.

Lawn Equipment: Get Ready For Backyarding In High Style This Year

B ackyarding is the new trend that's emerged during the pandemic. Our backyards are where we eat, work, play, relax and socialize, and the green spaces around our homes have proven to be vibrant places for connection and vital to maintaining mental health.

So how do you get ready for lots of backyarding? You organize your yard and ready your landscaping.

"Take some time to plan out your yard with your family. Once you know the purpose you want it to serve, it's time to start working with it," said Kris Kiser, president and CEO of the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI), an international trade association representing outdoor power equipment, small engine, utility vehicle, golf car and personal transport vehicle manufacturers and suppliers.

"A well-cared-for lawn and landscape provides the canvas for a year-round backyarding lifestyle," Kiser added. "You'll want to get out there with your outdoor power equipment, like your lawn mower and trimmers, and you want to do it safely."

He offered the following tips to get lawn equipment ready for fall:

Refresh your knowledge. Read your equipment owner's manuals and follow all manufacturer's guidelines. If you find

a manual online, save a digital copy for future reference.

Look over equipment. Lots can

happen in a garage or storage shed over the winter. Check the air filter, oil level and gasoline tank. Watch for loose belts and missing or damaged parts. Replace any parts needed or take your equipment to a qualified service representative. Check to be sure that you have the appropriate batteries if needed.

Drain fuel tanks. If you didn't empty the gasoline tank before storing equipment, drain it now. Fuel should never sit in outdoor power equipment for more than 30 days. Untreated gasoline (without a fuel stabilizer) will deteriorate, which may cause starting or running problems or damage the fuel system.

Protect your power. Use only E10 or less fuel in gasoline-powered outdoor power equipment. Most manufacturers recommend a fuel stabilizer be used, especially if you don't use up all the fuel in the tank right away. Any fuel containing more than 10 percent ethanol can damage small engine equipment not designed for it.

Store fuel safely. Label fuel cans with the date of purchase and ethanol content

of the fuel. If you don't know the date of purchase, dispose safely of the fuel and buy fresh gasoline. Always store fuel out of the reach of children or pets and in approved containers.

Don't mix up your battery packs.

For battery-powered equipment, use only the charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another. Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions.

Stash batteries safely. When the battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.

Tidy up. Clean equipment will run more efficiently and last longer. Clean equipment and store it in a dry place. Remove dirt, oil or grass. Never store equipment in a place that is damp or wet.

Native Plants — Hidden Gems Of The Landscape

ative plants are an essential part of the ecosystem, and unfortunately, they are often an underused addition to your landscape. These plants provide shelter and food sources for wildlife, which is often destroyed by development. Do you want to see a vast array of birds, butterflies and other pollinator insects in your landscape? Grab your shovel and plant more natives; birds, butterflies and other pollinators will surely return to vour garden.

Many native plants boast features that are abundantly eye-catching with colorful flowers, fruits or leaves. Some of my favorites include *conoclinium coelestinum*, commonly called blue mistflower or hardy ageratum. This perennial gem blooms in the fall with an abundance of violet blue flowers. Another perennial gem is *spigelia marilandica*, Indian



pink, which boasts a yellow and red bloom from late May into June and does a great job adding color to a shady spot.

When I think of native fruits, a must-have is *amelanchier canadensis*, serviceberry. This small tree loves partial sun/ partial shade sites, is full of white flowers in the spring, boasts edible blue fruit in June and ends its run with a showy orange fall color. Another fruitful native is *callicarpa americana*, American beautyberry; after the white blooms are complete, this plant is loaded with purple berries for the birds to devour.

As we are now in fall, we have to think about colorful leaves. One native shrub that delivers fantastic fall color is fothergilla gardenii, dwarf fothergilla, a compact shrub that desires full sun to partial shade (the more sun, the better the fall color). In the fall, the plant's leaves turn a brilliant orange, red and gold, but also, during the season, these same leaves are a calming blue/green color. The early spring white bottlebrush flowers cover this plant, which is just another feature to enjoy. Another winner to consider adding to your landscape is aronia melanocarpa, black chokeberry, which delivers on so many accounts. This shrub ends its season with a purplish-red fall color, but prior to that, fragrant white flowers develop into edible black berries. Though these berries are bitter, they deliver a high antioxidant value. These shrubs also are a larval host for many moths and butterflies; the flowers attract numerous pollinators, and if you don't eat the berries, birds and mammals will dine on them.

One last plant to highlight is pycnanthemum muticum, blunt mountain mint. When this gem is in bloom, the masses of pollinators come. It hosts a cast of characters that resembles the bar scene in "Star Wars." The beneficial bees, wasps, flies, butterflies, and moths are all over this plant and just go about their business with no interest in you watching them work.

Turn off your home's indoor water spigots that lead to your outside water spigots before the cold weather begins. Cold weather can lead to pipes freezing inside your home. When you turn off your outside water spigots, make sure you let any water drain out of the spigot so that water won't freeze.

Clean the area around your HVAC unit for leaves and debris as your HVAC unit needs to have outside air flow to make the unit run more efficiently. If it snows, always clear that area as well when you shovel your driveway and sidewalks.

Have someone inspect your roof for missing and/or damaged shingles as those could lead to leaks in your home as well. Many times after a strong storm, you may see shingles in your lawn and that is a sign that your roof may need to be repaired.

Check for water spots or stains around windows and doors. These may signal you need to recaulk or replace those windows and doors before they become a water problem in your home.
