To Renovate Or Relocate?

Fall Is The Best Time To Install Your New Fence Or Deck

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Preserving Your Habitat

all is a wonderful time, whether you fancy the wide array of color changes that brighten up the landscapes or the bonfires with friends and family. Just as this is a time of transition for people, the same happens within the habitat you have created around your home. It has a list of its own fall activities that will ensure a successful use of available resources, as well as ensuring your investment is protected through the winter.

Your habitat may consist of a wide array of perennials, trees, and shrubs outside your home or maybe it consists of an indoor houseplant jungle. Either way, our goal as stewards of our habitat is to preserve it to its truest form to the best of our ability.

When looking at your outdoor habitat, it's important to remember that you may not be the only one living in this habitat, and that is a good thing! Each member has an important role to play and meets different criteria to keep them thriving. One of the most important things to think about is housing. Inhabitants in our area are looking for a warm, cozy spot where they can rest through the winter. One of



the best ways to provide this is to leave as much plant material available as possible. Shelter does not always come from an evergreen tree or shrub but also from other places like the spent stems of flowers, or the dense foliage of ornamental grass. Some bees hide in the hollow flower stems of plants like black-eyed Susans, so it is important not to cut these away in fall but rather in spring as the new growth emerges and any tenants have moved out. The same rule applies for the grasses. Not only does this insulate and protect the root mass of the plant material and the insects that may or may not be seeking temporary housing there, but this will also act as a marker showing you have something planted there come spring.

As for indoor habitat, there's plenty to do to ensure your plants thrive. If you stored your houseplants outside over the summer, you should start thinking about moving them back inside for the winter. Two things should be asked: should we repot while we can still use outdoor spaces? And what sort of insecticide regiment should we put in place to ensure that we do not bring any unwanted hitchhikers inside? For most insecticides, you will need to apply a few applications for them to be successful, and we need to have them bundled inside by the time the overnight temps start to reach the 50-degree range, so the sooner we can start, the better!

all is here. This checklist can help you cover all the bases when it comes to fall cleaning. Leaves are falling – Now is the time to keep your eye on your gutters and drains. A significant number of leaves can create a major issue in and around your home. Leaves can block drains and clog gutters. If this happens, water runoff will have nowhere to travel, and it can eventually find its way into your home. Be sure to inspect your gutters, exterior drains and perimeter of your home. Fall cleaning is just as important as spring cleaning.

In Maryland, wind speeds increase in October and throughout winter months. Keep an eye out for trees that have dead branches or trees whose branches are too close for comfort. Fallen trees and branches can cause tremendous damage to a home and your personal belongings. At the very least, trim dead branches; even a small branch can create major issues if it falls on your home.

Inspect the foundation of your home. Walk the exterior of your home and make sure the foundation walls are flush and level. If you see cracks, this could be a sign for poten-

Right now, Just-IN-Time is getting many requests to remove bathtubs and install custom walk-in tile showers.

"We'll ask the homeowner what they want — are we doing fiberglass? Are we doing tile walls?" Justin explained. "We don't just steamroll people and say, 'This is our package, and you need to choose from A, B, C.' We try to make it more personal and make it more of their dream and less of ours. Their dream bathroom, basement, or roof."



Heating and cooling: You need to have a heat source for your new room since it is now part of the interior of your home. In lots of cases, people are adding mini-split wall-mounted heating units. This allows you to control the heat and air conditioning in your new space on its own remote without affecting the main home heating system. Consult your HVAC contractor for your best solutions.

Exterior: What is the outside going to look like? If your home has siding that is over 10 years old, it may be hard to match the existing siding. Will the new construction project interfere with any current windows and block the view? The types of new windows that you choose can affect the overall price of the project whether they are casement windows or double-hung windows, for example. These are things to consider.

Timeframe: There are many variables when having a major home improvement completed. Building permits and inspections take time. Supply chains are not what they once were. Be sure to discuss with your contractor what the expected timeline is for your specific project.

floor plan.

Another method to grow without growing is to combine existing functions. The guest room or den might make a great office, the garage can double as an art studio, and a small workstation can be built into the kitchen. Hideaway cabinets, storage benches, or custom built-ins will upgrade the look of personal living and dining rooms while concealing the printers, laptops, and other desktop appurtenances you use during work hours.

Empty nesters may be faced with the opposite problem, wishing they had less space to clean and upkeep, fewer stairs, and lower energy bills. Moving to a smaller home may be the best solution for some, but a reconfiguration of the home's interior lavout may allow the pair to live exclusively on the ground level. Insulation, window glazing, and heating and air conditioning systems can be adapted or supplemented to reduce energy costs.

Ground-level living can be created at the time of a renovation or roughed in for future accommodation, so you can age in place or take care of an aging relative. Larger bathrooms, wider circulation routes, and wheelchair accessibility can be built into the design, and elevator shafts can be carefully laid out in the planning stage, then framed in as closets until years later when the elevator is installed in the finished house.

Whether to stay or go is a big decision, so give it the time it needs. Residential architects should be happy to discuss your questions and concerns. Most offer a free initial consultation at your home, during which they can offer industry-informed insight about feasibility, practicality and cost — which can help you make this decision.

tial water damage. Keep wet leaves and debris away from the perimeter of your home. These can create water runoff issues. If water has nowhere to flow to outside, eventually it can seep into your home. A crack in your foundation could create a moldy mess down the road.

Aside from high winds, tree issues and foundation issues do not typically happen overnight. Keep a close eye on your property and you can stay ahead of potential disasters. A weekly walk around your yard should allow you to see developing issues before they become a real issue! SERV-PRO can make it "like it never even happened," but so can you if you keep a close eye on your property.

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Our Most Asked Kitchen Design Questions Answered

ou may have several questions about kitchen design. Here are answers to some of the questions we get most frequently.

Can I have an island?

This is by far one of my most requested elements for kitchen renovations. The way many of us live now is different from the way our original homes and kitchens were designed. Entertaining often revolves around shared meals in the kitchen. Kiddos are doing homework in common spaces. Morning and evening at-home meals with the family are usually placed around busy weekday schedules. These tasks all lend themselves to incorporating a functional island.

So, will your space allow for an island? Let's look at the depth between your cabinetry on the perimeter (or measurement from cabinetry to opposite wall). This is where your island would be placed. If you're considering an island for food preparation, you should allow a minimum space of about 104 inches. This gives you a walkway clearance on either side. For an island with seating along the back, you would need to allow a minimum space of 118 inches. There are some variances with this rule, but generally speaking, those are the numbers. Digital imagery can simplify this and you can have a functional island that is to scale with your home.

What's in that bulkhead over my cabinets?

Many people in our area have a 12-inch bulkhead over their existing wall cabinetry. About 50% of the time, those drywalled spaces are empty and were built to accommodate a shorter wall cabinet. The other 50% of the time, the bulkhead contains plumbing or HVAC. Before you renovate, you will want a contractor to examine the bulkhead and see if you can take the cabinetry to the ceiling. In some cases, the contractor can move the plumbing or hide it inside the top of the cabinetry, but we would want to have a close evaluation of the space and budget for those changes.

Should I use my rarely used dining room to expand my kitchen?

This really depends on how your family uses the home. If you do not use the dining room and need more storage and workspace, it is certainly worth considering. It can be a big change to open the wall between the formal dining room and the kitchen, as it can add a lot of light and versatility to the home. Our recommendation is to do what works best for your family and try to keep space for sit-down meals.

What is the difference between quartz and granite?

Quartz and granite are more alike than you think! Quartz, like granite, is a natural material harvested from the earth. It is hard, almost completely nonporous, and comes in a huge variety of designs and colors. Unlike granite, quartz does not need to be sealed, is harder than any stone surface, and can withstand spills October 2022

and cleanups. Most of our clients love quartz for its brighter designs. You can get the marble look without the stress of maintenance.

Granite, on the other hand, has a natural beauty that is difficult to replicate. It is truly art cut from the earth! Each slab is different, so no one will ever have the same countertop. Natural stones like granite, quartzite, and marble can have beautiful depth and luster that you may not find in quartz. Natural stone does require regular sealing with a spray-on sealant, and you would only use granite or marble cleaners on it to maintain resistance to chipping or etching. There are also new stone treatments available that can alleviate some of the vulnerabilities of natural stone. I like to walk clients through all options before we make a decision. Sometimes a client set on the ease of quartz falls in love with a stone they had never seen. Keep an open mind and do what you love.

Can I just paint my cabinets?

Of course you can, but expect some maintenance. The reality is that cabinetry painted in a factory goes through a multi-step process that includes industrial sprayers, catalysts, and ovens to create a hard, smooth and durable finish. Depending on your budget, replacing doors and spraying the cabinets may end up costing near the cost of new cabinetry. Another big consideration is the quality of the cabinetry and how it functions. Does the storage work? Are the hinges in need of repair? Are the drawer glides becoming rickety? Painted cabinetry may look beautiful on Instagram, but make sure it's worth the investment or if new cabinetry is really in order.

TCJA Reverts in 2026

Some of the bigger tax advantages that were implemented with the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) of 2017 will revert in 2026. So, there really is no better time than now to start reviewing your will, trust and estate plan to ensure that you have the best positioning possible.

Federal Estate Tax: For

2022, the federal estate exemption is \$12 million per person. However, that provision is set to expire in 2026, and the exemption will return to its previous amount of \$5 million (adjusted for inflation), unless otherwise changed by Congress. Today's real estate market puts this within reach of a lot of families.

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There are many issues to consider, and your estate planning attorney will work closely with your accountant and/or financial advisor to create an estate plan for your unique circumstances, especially if you are a small-business owner.

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




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Does Your State Have an Estate or Inheritance Tax? State Estate & Inheritance Tax Rates & Exemptions in 2021



Are You Prepared For Potential Estate And Inheritance Tax?

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Maryland Estate Tax: The current Maryland estate tax ex-

emption is \$5 million per person. The exemption applies to the total gross value of the estate including, but not limited to cash, stocks, investments, real property, personal property, and the value of LLC memberships or corporate shares. All these assets can add up and quickly exceed the estate tax exemption. There are several tools we use to help avoid these estate taxes, including trusts and LLCs.

Unlimited Marital

Deduction: This deduction permits a person to transfer an unrestricted amount of assets to their spouse at any time, including at the death of the first spouse, free from estate taxes and any potential gift tax. This tax provision, in effect, postpones the estate taxes until the death of the second spouse, when those assets are then transferred to the children or other beneficiaries. When the first spouse passes, it is extremely important to review and revise the plan to ensure that the children will also receive their inheritances free from the estate taxes.

Inheritance Tax: The

inheritance tax is imposed on the person inheriting the asset or property from an estate. In Maryland, certain classes of beneficiaries are exempt from the tax, including spouses, parents, siblings, and lineal descendants, such as children and grandchildren. However, others such as unmarried couples, partners, nieces, nephews, friends, or significant others, would be taxed at 10 percent. There are ways to mitigate these risks, so it is important to work with an estate planning attorney to review all of the available tools and strategies.

Income Taxes: Maryland estates and trusts are also subject to income taxes, which are separate from death taxes. If an estate or trust receives income of more than \$600 per year. then it must file a tax return reporting that income and is subject to income tax. A properly drafted estate plan can help minimize income taxes, ensuring that all income from a trust is distributed annually, to avoid the necessity of reporting any income.

Gift Taxes: During your lifetime, you may make gifts to others (cash, stocks, land, a new car), but you must be aware of the rules of gifting from a tax perspective. Again, an experienced estate planning attorney can help you determine which tools can be used to avoid estate and gift taxes. **Trusts:** Trusts are commonly used to avoid assets from passing through probate and to avoid federal and state estate taxes. By using marital and bypass trusts, an estate could avoid estate taxes entirely. This is where estate planning becomes invaluable.

Dry Weather Is Optimal For New Wood Fences and Decks

If you plan on using pressure-treated wood for your fence or deck, the material will have time to "season" properly outdoors, without being exposed to high temperatures and direct sunlight. Wood that has been pressure treated contains only 50% of its moisture content, so as the humidity dies down in the fall months, it helps the wood stabilize faster and it will dry more evenly. When it comes to staining, a wood stain won't adhere well to damp wood and can crack and peel. A stain should be applied to dry wood when it hasn't rained for several days, and the forecast calls for at least two days of dry weather between 50 degrees Fahrenheit and 90 degrees Fahrenheit — a common range for fall weather in Maryland!

Polyaspartics have about three to four times the durability of conventional epoxies, do not experience hot tire pickup from cars pulling into the garage, and do not yellow from ultraviolet radiation. FLOOR TESTING AND PREPARATION

Before applying anything to your floor, when dealing with concrete, it is critical to gather the necessary information for the best results. There are two main factors to consider: concrete slab **moisture** and hardness. Concrete is porous and allows water to move through its ranks, thus there are a plethora of environmental factors that can contribute to moisture levels in vour concrete floor. If moisture levels are high in your floor, a moisture barrier primer will need to be applied prior to the main coating system. It's also important

to know how hard the concrete floor is to decide what kind of grinding equipment to use. During the preparation process, a company might use commercial diamond grinders to scarify the surface layer of your concrete to create the optimal bonding surface. Surface grinding removes stains and small imperfections and opens the concrete to best accept the coating system. This is the most effective method to prepare your floor, compared to do-ityourself (DIY) acid etching techniques.

Additionally, this is the time to make any necessary repairs to the concrete, such as leveling

pitted areas, patching chipped edges, and most commonly, filling in cracks in the concrete slab. Making these repairs with the proper products will ensure an aesthetically seamless garage floor after the project is finished.

rees are givers, just as Shel Silverstein wrote in my favorite childhood book, "The Giving Tree," and they give us much more than what that apple tree gave the boy.

Yes, they provide children with something to climb on or swing from; yes, they shade us; yes, they provide us with food; and yes, they provide us with shelter, but they give so much more. Trees create habitat for wildlife, they clean the air by soaking up carbon dioxide and other toxic gasses, and they provide us with the oxygen to breathe. They prevent erosion, they reduce noise pollution, they play a vital role in the water cycle through transpiration, and they are a complete system (dropping their foliage, which decomposes, enriching the soil where they rest and then their roots extract nutrients from the enriched soil to feed themselves and this cycle repeats itself).

Trees heal us mentally. Hug a tree and walk among trees and see how you feel. They heal us through medicine, which is produced from them; they entertain us with a yearly show; buds breaking from their winter dormancy, producing flowers that mature into fruit, and leaves add color, changing for a colorful display each fall.

Yes, trees are givers, truly taking care of us all. We need more of them. Many more are removed than planted. Sadly, 42 million trees are cut down daily according to the science journal Nature, and only 5 million are planted



each day according to a few online sources; that is a huge imbalance.

Did you know the best time to plant a tree was 15 years ago? I have a colleague who planted a 12-inch sapling dawn redwood that he got from the Arbor Day Foundation 32 years ago. Now, that tree stands proud at 90 feet and is a site to see.

The second-best time to plant a tree is during fall 2022. Team KW is aiming to plant more than 75 trees this fall, pleasing Mother Earth with numerous adoptions.

My favorite tree, the giant sequoia, is a sight to take in. I was lucky enough to do so three times, and each time visiting them was a soulful treat.

My favorite trees for clients to adopt — that is such a hard list to narrow down, but here are some, starting with a few non-natives.

The dawn redwood, which dates back to the dinosaurs

The paperbark maple, which delivers a great exfoliating bark

The Japanese umbrella pine has thick and waxy needles, delivering a great texture

The black dragon cryptomeria delivers dramatically for a specimen evergreen

And what's not to love from any of the numerous Japanese maples, weeping habits or upright habits, and of course, the dramatic colors during the summer that change into a forte of color in the fall.

But I still have to push for the natives; they belong and keep the local ecosystem thriving. The serviceberry delivers three seasons strong, white spring blooms, reddish blue edible fruit and orange fall color. The American holly screens in the sun or shade, feeding the birds with plump red berries. The sweetbay magnolia has gorgeous white fragrant blooms and will live in deeply wet soils. The red maple offers shade in the summer sun and bright red foliage in the fall. Rounding this list is the fringe tree, which is smaller and pops with creamy white fringy blooms later in the spring — such a sight to see in your landscape.

The tree I am searching for to add to my personal landscape, the Franklin tree, is named after Ben Franklin. You have got to check this one out.

I challenge you to adopt a tree this fall for your piece of Mother Earth. She will be grateful and so will you from all the gifts the tree will give.
