Plants That Help To Repel Mosquitoes

osquitoes have been a nuisance since they swarmed amongst dinosaurs. While they might be ancient, they have their likes and dislikes, similar to any other living creature. As a result, there are some plants that could help repel this ancient pest.

Since landscaping conditions vary by region, we always recommend asking your local greenhouse or landscaper which plants work best for repelling mosquitoes (and other pests) in your area. However, there are some common plants that aid in keeping pests at bay.

If you have pets, please note that some plants might be effective at repelling insects, but they could be toxic to pets if eaten. For example, while citronella can help repel mosquitoes, it can also prove deadly to dogs if enough is ingested. Make sure to ask your local nursery and consult with your veterinarian about geraniums, certain varieties of marigolds, and garlic plants as potentially harmful to pets if eaten. These

are all great plants that are natural pest repellents, but they should be used with caution around pets.

Plants that help keep mosquitoes away

These plants are like your secret weapon: beautiful, fragrant and repulsive to mosquitoes. One shopping trip at the local nursery could save you time and money on candles while Mother Nature packs a punch against mosquitoes. If you have trouble with mosquitoes getting into your home, make sure to place some plants by doorways and windows to keep them from congregating there and slipping inside.

Here are some of the most effective insect repellent houseplants



Lavender: This plant's beautiful fragrance comes from essential oils that gather on the

leaves of the plant, making its scent enjoyable to humans but potent to pests.



Camphor: This tree species originated in China but is commonplace in the south-

eastern United States.



Lemon balm: This ancient plant has been used throughout the centuries for a variety

of culinary and medical uses.



Rosemary: This plant is especially useful as a mosquito repellent when burned, so con-

sider it during your next barbecue.



Catnip: Named for its extreme appeal with cats and birds, this plant is also a strong

How To Keep Your Floors Clean For Health



leaning for appearance is often what motivates home or business owners to schedule with a carpet or duct cleaning professional. While the appearance of your space matters, it is critical to clean for health, whether surface cleaning or improving indoor air quality. In a post-pandemic era, there is a growing concern for indoor air quality for home and business owners.

Your floor is the largest horizontal space in your home or building, making it a breeding ground for all types of contaminants. When people hear the word contaminants, they often think of bacteria from foods or hair or mud, but many don't consider the microscopic spores hanging around in the air

and settled on the floor. These microbes can circulate in the air of high-traffic areas and settle on other surfaces.

Carpeting is especially difficult to keep clean, but it should be vacuumed regularly to reduce the collection of contaminants. You've probably seen videos where vacuuming alone creates a dust cloud that rises from the carpet once the vacuum is turned on. Hardwood floors and tile should also be cleaned regularly because of the contaminants trapped in the cracks, crevices and grout. Having a schedule for consistent cleanings helps preserve the longevity of your floors and contributes to cleaner and fresher air.

The six principles of effective cleaning are the following:

Remove Dry Soil

Studies show that 74% of soils found in textiles are dry soils, consisting of skin cells, hair follicles and dust mites. Using a vacuum or a dry-cleaning sponge are two of the most

used dry soil removal methods.

2 Identify Surface

This involves determining if the surface to be cleaned is porous or nonporous and if the surface is natural or synthetic. The second part, trying to determine if the textile is natural or synthetic, is a bit harder and is a critical step in determining the proper cleaning method.

3. Identify Soils

Soils fall into two basic categories, water based and oil based. The basic idea is that if it's water-based soil, the soil will be easily removed with a water-based cleaning product, and if the soil is oil based, the soil will be easily removed with an oil-based cleaning product.

4. Suspend Soils

The cleaning product is applied to the textile and agitated to help it penetrate and loosen soils. Soils are suspended within the cleaning product in two ways, dissolving and

emulsifying.

5 Remove Soils

Depending on the cleaning method, rinsing may occur before or after drying. Hot water extraction uses wet vacuum extraction.

6 Dry The Surface

Drying prevents the fibers from attracting and holding additional soils and prevents the growth of microorganisms. Drying time varies depending on the amount of moisture used in the cleaning process as well as temperature and humidity conditions.

Celebrating 50 Years:Homestead Gardens Is Rooted In Tradition

ust like the plants, trees and shrubs it nurtures, Homestead Gardens has blossomed over the last 50 years.

From its beginnings as a roadside produce stand, the business has expanded to include three stores, a landscaping division, and a horticulture supply center.

As the current president and CEO of Homestead Gardens, Brian Riddle has carried on the family legacy that was started by his grandparents and continued by Brian's father, Don Riddle Jr.

Marketing specialist Clint Albin has seen much of the business' growth firsthand since the Davidsonville store opened in 1973.

"In 1973, this was all farm fields," Albin said, standing near the entrance of the Davidson-ville store. "They used to land crop-dusting planes out here, so it was really rural and just a fruit stand."

Today, the Davidsonville store is 240,000 square feet, enough to showcase a variety of annuals, perennials, trees, shrubs, outdoor lighting fixtures, garden accessories, indoor and outdoor furniture, grills, gifts, décor and other products.

The Severna Park store opened in 2010, with a smaller footprint at 35,000 square feet of retail space. This location offers a large outdoor sales area with concrete water fixtures, pottery, seasonal plants and shrubs.

Homestead later unveiled a third retail location in 2021, bringing its horticulture services to Smyrna, Delaware.

Each of the stores is meant to offer various goods while inspiring each guest who walks through the door.

"It's a way for the community to engage with a group of different products that they're not going to find at Home Depot or Lowe's or those national brands," Albin said.

Inside the Davidsonville store, visitors will find Houseplant Haven, a greenhouse with top-quality annuals and houseplants to help guests whether they are looking to fill a flower bed or find a unique houseplant for their home office.

"This is a gateway product for a lot of new gardeners who are constrained to their home," Albin said. "We offer this as a year-round place for people to come, walk and engage with the product."





Named for Brian's grandmother, Evelyn's Boutique is a cozy space in the store, carrying handbags, jewelry, fashion accessories, apparel for women and kids, gift items and more.

While the store sells plenty of products, its mission extends beyond what guests will find on the shelves. Homestead Gardens serves as a community hub, allowing people to congregate for events that are fun and educational. Some of the store's most popular events and attractions are Chicks on the Loose, Fall Festival and the holiday lights display.

The spring kickoff, set for March 18 through March 26, is another anticipated event. Attendees can enjoy workshops, interact with barnyard animals and get gardening advice from the staff. Also this month, the Davidsonville Area Civic Association Green Expo will draw about 24 vendors to the store on March 26, prompting a discussion about sustainability.

"If you look at what we sell — be it plants, soil, or other things — we want to be here to support our community with plants and all plant-related things for the next 50 years," Albin said. "It's very important that we continue to be stewards of the earth."

With that in mind, Homestead Gardens hosted "The Pursuit of Houseplants," a 10-week program with workshops in the winter. Another 10-week course is planned for the spring.

Brian does not need a crystal ball to foreshadow the next 50 years for Homestead Gardens. His vision of the future starts with adding three new elements to the Davidsonville property: a brewery, a barnyard and an outdoor activity area.

He also plans to keep supporting local organizations like the Anne Arundel County Food Bank, Maryland Hall, Bello Machre, the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA), the Greater Severna Park and Arnold Chamber of Commerce, local schools and other nonprofits.

With that community focus, he hopes to see Homestead Gardens flourish even more over the next 50 years.


Maryland Protects Homeowners Who Want To Protect Their Environment



eauty is in the eye of the beholder. A recent change in Maryland law has made this old saying true for lawns and gardens within homeowners' associations, or HOAs.

Section 2-125 of the Maryland Real Property Article prohibits HOAs from imposing their standard of beauty on the lawn of an owner or resident. The law, which went into effect in 2021, prohibits any covenant from imposing unreasonable restrictions on low-impact landscaping. Low-impact landscaping includes measures that conserve water, lower maintenance costs, provide pollution prevention and create habitat for wildlife. The law means your HOA can't force you to cut

30% of the dust from the last customer redistributed into your home.

Carpet and upholstery typically require cleaning every 12 to 18 months just to keep the warranty in place. To receive this license, individuals must have trade experience, pass an exam on basic industry knowledge and applicable Maryland regulations, and show proof of insurance.

Expertise in Repairs and Customer Service

The BID vs. T&M

down or remove your native plant gardens, pollinators, xeriscaping or rain gardens.

The Letter of the Law

The actual statute provides that a restriction regarding land use may not impose, or act to impose, unreasonable limitations on low-impact landscaping. This is provided that the property owner owns or has the right to exclusive use of the property and maintains and regularly tends to the low-limit landscaping.

An unreasonable limitation includes a limitation that significantly increases the cost, significantly decreases the efficiency or requires cultivated vegetation to consist in whole or in part of turf grass.

In other words, HOA covenants are not allowed to force people who are caring for their rain garden or native lawn to remove those features in favor of turf grass.

The Backstory

This legislation came about in large part because some believers in native planting and low-impact landscaping stood their ground. In 2019, a Maryland couple took their HOA to court, alleging that the standard being insisted upon for the lawn — basically turf grass — was not fair or proper. They argued their rain garden and native plants were just as beautiful and appropriate as a full lawn of clipped green grass.

While their particular case ended up being resolved at mediation, it caught the attention of many people who felt strongly about the issue. Maryland Delegates Terri Hill and Jessica Feldmark noticed and saw an opportunity to effect real change. Their bill became the new law, which protects homeowners who want to avoid using artificial fer-

tilizers and chemicals that could end up in our rivers and streams.

The Right to be Green

Regardless of your opinion on HOAs, I think you ought to be in favor of this law. First, it gives clarity to everyone involved. Now, both owners and board members are aware of what rights they have and what rights the other party has. This helps avoid disputes and unnecessary litigation. Second, it gives options. If you are Scotts four-step lawn method disciple, that is still acceptable. If, on the other hand, you are a native plant enthusiast, vou now can practice vour art and show off your version of a green thumb without concern for any alleged violations coming from the homeowners' association.

What to Know

Homeowners have the right to maintain their yard using

native plants and rain gardens, just as they have the right to grow a flawless green grass lawn. Keep in mind that certain other covenant provisions, such as keeping the yard neat and orderly, restricting the location of vegetable gardens or play structures, and more, are still valid and enforceable. Contact and use local resources to implement best practices on your native plant lawn. And above all, when dealing with neighbors, remember that they are part of your community and deserve your respect, even if you disagree.

and raveling to occur.

Cracking

Cracks in your asphalt driveway can appear from a variety of causes. The most common types are "stress" cracking from vehicle and tire loads; transverse and longitudinal cracking, which occur at the joints where the asphalt meets other surfaces or where there were joints when the driveway was paved; and reflective cracking.

Reflective cracking occurs when cracks are in underlying layers of the driveway, most common when an "overlay" of new asphalt is done over an existing asphalt or concrete driveway.

Why is this important? Cracks in your driveway are a point of weakness and susceptibility. They allow moisture to penetrate the pavement and underlying layers. Asphalt expands and contracts with varying seasonal temperatures, which can exacerbate existing cracks and cause new ones to form. It is critical to make sure the cracks are treated and sealed. Consult your driveway coating professional for the best products and application methods for your property.

Structural Distresses/Potholes

Potholes are a nuisance for everyone, especially your car. They can come in many shapes and sizes but commonly appear due to poor compaction of asphalt base layers and from moisture freeze/thaw cycles. Cracks that are left untreated retain moisture in the pavement and expand as it freezes,

then contract when the temperatures warm again. This shift can cause gaps to occur when the frozen water expands and pushes down the base material levels. If the base material and asphalt material were not properly compacted during the paving process, potholes will occur more frequently.

A more economical method to filling in these potholes can be done by cleaning the area and "surface patching" with hot mix or cold patch products. However, for the best longevity, these areas should be treated with a full-depth replacement, where it is cut out, base material supplemented and compacted, and then new asphalt installed. A quality driveway coating company can help find the best solutions for your driveway based on the severity of the pothole and your budget.

Oxidation/Raveling

When asphalt is first paved, it is a rich black color. Over time, ultraviolet radiation from the sun and erosion of the "binder" in the asphalt pavement can cause it to become gray and oxidized. This is a telltale sign that your driveway needs a sealcoating application to replenish that binder in the asphalt while also giving it a fresh, appealing facelift. Applying an asphalt sealer also extends the lifespan of the driveway by blocking out moisture and chemicals from further deterioration.

a 20-year warranty with no overhang, or you may consider less costly options.

Paint or Stain

While any door can be painted, a stained door must be made of either wood or grained fiberglass. Without a protective overhang, grained fiberglass may be the best option for a durable stained door. Smooth fiberglass and steel doors can be painted, and smooth fiberglass doors have an attractive texture when painted and offer dent resistance, while steel doors are perfectly smooth but are susceptible to dings and dents. Aluminum-clad wood doors are not as popular but can offer a great option in certain circumstances. When painting

wood doors, even when protected by an overhang, most manufacturers prohibit dark tint exterior paints due to sunlight superheating the dark exterior surface, while the interior may be around 70 degrees. This causes the panels, stiles and rails to warp with the opposing surface temperatures.

Choosing a Door Style

Once the material and type of finish are determined, then focus on style. **Consider the style of home** - for instance, a mid-century modern home should have a similar style door. Some house types allow for a blending of styles, while others may be limiting. Some neighborhoods may have historic designations or homeowners' association requirements to consider.

Determining the number and placement of panels, the use of glass and privacy considerations, and other details such as beaded panels, sidelites, transoms and divided lites for the glass will all come into play.

Size and Budget

You now know exactly what material, finish and style door you want by this point. Also, make sure to source your door locks from the same company to ensure they get the specifications correct. Your local supplier will have higher-quality products that are guaranteed to fit, unlike some online budget outlets.

Container Color For The Spring

any front stoops, rear patios and even pool decks have containers on them. The trend is to plant them for the summers, adding additional color to your spaces and delivering more interest. But please do not forget about them during the other seasons. Now is the time to think about sprucing up your containers for the upcoming spring months.

First, though, you need to get your container ready for new plants, and this should be done at each season. Remove all the undesired plants and thoroughly mix the soil to loosen and remove any remaining root matter. You may need to top off your container with some fresh potting soil, such as an organic potting mix. Be sure to add a little bit of fertilizer, such as a low-nutrient value and slow-release organic fertilizer. A half cup is plenty for some initial feeding of a 24-inch container. This much of a higher nutrient value fertilizer could burn the plants.

Once the additional organic potting mix is added with the organic fertilizer, mix it to a fluffy state with your hands. Make sure the level of the soil is a few inches below the top of the container, but save the excess soil for additional backfill after planting is done. Now, pick some plants. Make sure your choices are cold-hardy as we might see frosts maybe well into April. Pansies, primrose and snapdragons add some fantastic color. But don't stop there — consider a perennial like hellebores or epimedium for other blooms. Maybe include some creeping phlox for color that will spill out of your container or add a grass (actually a rush) like juncus for an additional texture and some height.

The point is to have fun and play around a bit. The only mistake is not planting your containers for the spring. At times, we were bold and planted black mondo grass for an ultimate contrast in color.

Unlike your summer containers, these spring plant choices do not grow a tremendous amount, so plant like you feel when you are in a crowded elevator, and create a full look at the beginning. After an initial watering, and as long as the soil is moist a few inches down, no additional watering is needed — the spring rains come in handy for this. Now your landscape will have pops of color until the summer months arrive.
