Beyond The Kitchen: Screened Decks Without Limitations



with built-in outdoor bars of sorts. Picture your interior countertops extending through the wall into the screened deck, with a large pass-through window open to combine the spaces. These pass-through windows come in many sizes and styles including awning windows, bifold windows, in-line fold-up windows, and French-door style casement windows.

The strategic placement of the screened deck also optimizes natural ventilation. Opening the kitchen pass-through windows and doors allows for cross-breezes, which can help cool the kitchen and bring in fresh air during the spring and fall months, in particular. This natural ventilation can also reduce the reliance on air conditioning, contributing to energy efficiency.

This high-level design concept, when paired with other features such as comfortable seating, ambient lighting, and perhaps even an outdoor fireplace, can create an inviting atmosphere that you'll be sure to use throughout all seasons.

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Navigating The Evolving Roofing Industry

Understanding Insurance Changes And Market Trends



he roofing industry is experiencing significant transformations driven by a range of factors, including changes in insurance policies, advancements in material technology, and shifting consumer preferences. What recent changes have occurred in roofing insurance?

Don Kilcoyne is from GAF, North America's largest roofing manufacturer that produces quality, innovative roofing materials. He noted three trends GAF is seeing in the insurance industry. The first trend is rising deductibles. "In the past, it was typical for a homeowner to have a \$500 deductible and have replacement cost value (cost to replace at today's prices)," he wrote in an article. "A 2 percent-of-home-value deductible has become the standard in many markets and some insurance carriers are requiring deductibles as high as 5 percent. What this means is that an insured home of \$500,000 could have a deductible between \$10,000 to \$25,000. The reasons attributed to insurance increases could be due to climate change, inflation, materials cost, and risk aversion."

The second insurance trend that GAF notes is that there is a "move to basic and bare bones insurance coverage policies." This is where insurance companies limit what is covered by your policy. A third insurance trend GAF notes is that "replacement cost value policies are becoming less common as many companies are opting to offer actual cash value policies. One exception to this home insurance trend is that homeowners may be able to secure replacement cost value coverage on newer roofs."

What does all of this mean to you?

Roofing contractors are evolving alongside these industry changes too. Many roofing companies are enhancing their customer service and communication efforts to assist homeowners navigate insurance claims. This includes providing detailed estimates, performing thorough inspections, and assisting with the documentation needed for insurance claims. Now more than ever, it is important for homeowners to regularly review their insurance policies and communicate with their insurance agents to understand the specifics of their coverage. It is also important for consumers to work with a reputable roofing company that has experience in dealing with insurance companies and the claims process should you experience a loss.

contractor has an A+ rating from the Better Business Bureau. It is important to work with a very reputable, certified, insured roofing company that will be an invaluable partner and advocate for you in navigating the insurance process.





Summary

Rob Calhan, Landmark Roofing co-owner added, "Condition is crucial. Even if your roof is nearing the end of its lifespan, if it's well-maintained and shows no signs of significant damage, your insurance company may be more likely to renew your policy."

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Seven Expert Tips For Mosquito Control

e may not love all of the rain, snow and wetness that has inundated our area this past year, but we know of at least one insect that does — mosquitoes!

Mosquitoes require standing water for their eggs to hatch. Some species lay their eggs in dry areas but know it will be wet after a rainfall, while other species lay their eggs directly in water. Some species need only a teaspoon of water to deposit eggs into. They can hatch in places like gutters, plant container saucers, toys, buckets and small



ruts. Although not all water sources can be eliminated, homeowners can do their part in reducing the standing water on their property.

Homeowners can follow these tips or **seven T's** for mosquito control:

A small bottle cap filled with water holds enough water for mosquitoes

to breed. Since mosquitoes breed in standing water, the elimination of standing water decreases a mosquito's breeding ground. The biggest offenders are bird baths, play sets with tire swings, tree houses, portable fireplaces and pits, and corrugated drainage piping. Have a tire swing? Drill holes in the bot-

tom of the tire to empty water or even replace the tire with a wooden or plastic swing. After every rain event, homeowners can walk around the yard and tip over containers holding water and drain piping.

TOSS Toss that yard trash, bag up those clippings and leaves, and make sure firewood is stacked neatly. Another helpful tip: build or install a firewood holder to be sure that your firewood pile does not trap water.

TURN Walk the yard every few days and turn over items that could hold water and trash. Look for children's portable sandboxes, slides or plastic toys; underneath and around downspouts; and in plant saucers, empty pots, light fixtures and dog water bowls.



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HOMESTEAD GARDENS CELEBRATES MILESTONE ANNIVERSARY IN SEVERNA PARK

t's hard to believe it's been 15 years," Homestead Gardens owner Brian Riddle said of his Severna Park store's milestone anniversary approaching this spring.

Prior to Homestead Gardens opening its second of three garden stores in April 2010, Riddle shared that his father, Don Riddle — the company's founder who established its first location in Davidsonville in 1973 — had been eyeing Severna Park as an ideal location for expansion.

Don, who passed in 2011, recognized it as a great area even before opening the popular garden center on Ritchie Highway 15 years ago, and today Brian maintains his father's sentiment, noting that Homestead Gardens loves being in the Severna Park community.

With a wide selection of garden supplies, indoor and outdoor plants, farm and pet supplies, backyard birding items, boutique apparel, a pantry of specialty food items, and so much more, the team at Homestead Gardens prides themselves on being far more than an average garden store. But staff members agree that they are especially honored to be a community partner that is committed to giving back.

For over five decades, supporting the community has been a top priority for the Riddle family; today, Homestead Gardens supports over 100 local nonprofits, civic associations, schools and more each year.

Severna Park General Manager Aimee Miskimon shared that in 2024, she and her team were very proud of helping complete a beautification project at the American Legion Post 175. Homestead Gardens donated plants and products for the post's entryway, memorial flag garden and Gold Star memorial, and Miskimon said her team plans to work with the American Legion again this year.

Last year, Homestead Gardens also donated hundreds of saplings to Kinder

Farm Park, and in return, Miskimon said Kinder Farm Park's beekeeper hosted classes on beekeeping for Homestead Gardens' customers.

"That's probably the part of the job that I absolutely thrive on and love more than anything," she said, noting that Homestead Gardens also hosts charitable events for schools, a large annual fundraiser in support of University of Maryland Baltimore Washington Medical Center, and more recently, pet adoption days.

Giving back locally isn't the only thing that has set Homestead Gardens apart from other big box and area garden centers over the years; former Severna Park General Manager Heidi Tyler, who now serves as a buyer for the company, highlighted the importance of Homestead Gardens being family-owned and operated as well. And, she noted, many employees have been with the company for a long time — herself included — and are passionate about what they do.

"It's a hard market to be in with changing times and everything, so you really have to set yourself apart," Tyler said, stressing that the team at Homestead Gardens loves not only plants but also people.

"It's a form of hospitality," she added, explaining that the staff desire to make customers feel welcome, as if they are being invited into a home, so that they want to come back.

Tyler shared that many people call Homestead Gardens their "happy place." More than a store to run a quick errand, it has become a destination garden center where customers can not only shop for high-quality plants and garden supplies but also discover unexpected offerings like patio sets, specially curated gifts ranging from clothing items they won't find elsewhere to home décor sourced from around the world, and a children's area overflow-

ing with Jellycat stuffed toys for kids young and old. And, four-legged friends are welcome, too.

"Everybody knows us as a place they can bring their dogs. ... We have regular customers, but we also have regular dogs," Miskimon said, adding, "we do know them by name."

Plant enthusiasts appreciate the variety they discover at Homestead Gardens, whether that be rare house-plants they cannot find elsewhere, or exotic plants they've never even heard of. "We're really, really proud of our curated plant collection," Miskimon said.

A milestone within a milestone, the Rise Up Coffee Roasters café that opened adjacent to Homestead Gardens one year ago in February has been a significant boon for business. Tyler said the partnership between the two businesses — which are connected by an interior doorway — has created excitement and provided an opportunity for year-round growth. Homestead Gardens recently trialed a coffee and bouquet carrier, allowing customers to surprise their loved ones with two comforting favorites: coffee and plants.

With the advent of spring, Homestead Gardens has a plethora of events planned to help customers get their gardens and homes looking their best this season. Homestead Gardens' Spring Kickoff started March 7 and will continue through March 16, offering educational opportunities and promotions. The Easter bunny will be on hand for free photos at all store locations on April 13, and Herb and Veggie Weekend is slated for April 25-27.

2. Fasteners and Adhesives

Continued from page 15 be off of that floor for the duration of the work to let the stain and polyurethane dry. Therefore, you should plan on moving out of your home for this project for about three to five days.

Home Addition: This one can be tricky because it really depends on the scope of the work. If you are adding an addition off of the back of your house per se, you can most likely stay home for this project. Some projects can be built and framed before ever making a walkway or doorway into the new space. If you work from home, this is something you should plan around because of the noise and ruckus.

If you're getting into a second-story addition, part of your project planning and budget should be moving out temporarily. Aside from the dust and noise during a second-story expansion, your roof area will be covered with temporary tarps. Plumbing will be shut off to be relocated. You will have electric

shut off in parts of the house, which is inevitable because of the way wiring was previously run.

We had one family that had stayed in the home during their second-story remodel, and power was out in their son's bedroom for over a month. It was fun at first but then became a burden. If the family did the project again, they would leave for that large project.

Most companies give estimates for free. When meeting with your contractor, these are questions to discuss early on, especially depending on the size and scope of your project. Key Questions To Ask Before Hiring Your **Driveway Sealcoating Contractor**



onsider these questions to make the best choice when it comes to finding a contractor.

1. Are you a licensed and insured contractor in Maryland?

Contractor regulations and licenses are issued by the Maryland Home Improvement Commission. It is critical you hire a licensed professional because, as a homeowner, vou will be protected under the Home Guaranty Fund. The fund protects against "actual loss," or in other words, incomplete or poor-quality work done by licensed professionals.

Additionally, any contractor performing work on your property should be properly insured with both business liability and workers compensation policies. This will give you peace of mind that if anything goes wrong, or the unexpected occurs, you are protected against any liability.

2. Do you send an invoice after the job is completed or do you require money/ cash up front?

A contractor should understand that your time and convenience are valuable.

Make sure a proposal clearly stating the scope of work will be sent to you. For jobs over \$1,000, the Maryland Home Improvement Commission requires there to be a 33% payment. Once the project has been completed, you should get an invoice for the entire amount or the remaining amount if the project exceeds the \$1,000 threshold.

3. What material do you offer to your customers?

Your driveway is one of the first things people see and serves as the "welcome mat" to your property. Make sure you understand what is being applied to your driveway and how.

A quality asphalt emulsion sealer mixed with sand and fast-dry additives will properly protect and beautify your driveway against harmful elements by forming a protective film on the surface of the asphalt pavement "aggregate." These sealers are manufactured from byproducts of the petroleum distillation process with water to achieve the proper viscosity. This also means asphalt emulsion sealers are environmentally friendly since no volatile organic compounds (VOCs) are given off as the water evaporates from the sealer during the drying process.

Stay away from contractors trying to sell you on an "oil based" sealcoating application, which means receiving an inferior asphalt byproduct called "Gilsonite," which looks

shiny but provides no protection for your driveway. Gilsonite is often spray applied and cut with environmentally harmful solvents that evaporate and eventually leave your driveway more brittle than before. Beware of many paving companies that will try to upsell you on sealcoating immediately following installation of a new driveway.

Contractors should avoid applying "coal tar" emulsion sealers as they have been banned in Maryland and Washington, D.C.

4. What is the expected wear life of your materials?

When hiring any contractor for your property, communication and setting expectations from the initial contact can make or break the experience. While prep work and overall quality of the job play huge roles in how long the sealer will last, let's face it – nothing will last forever. Areas with oil stains, heavier tire turning loads, standing water, or even areas more susceptible to falling tree debris may begin to show signs of wear first.

We recommend having your driveway sealed every two

to three years on average, depending on how frequently it has been sealed in the past. Newly paved driveways with a more porous surface will need to be sealed again following the first application within a shorter time frame compared to a driveway that has been repeatedly sealed.

5. What type of equipment do you use to apply materials?

When applying pavement sealers to an asphalt surface, for both residential and commercial applications, it's imperative your contractor is prepared for the job. Proper mix designs require the addition of silica sand into the sealer mix to add wear resistance and traction. The sealer must be continuously agitated prior to application to ensure the sand does not settle to the bottom. A 300-, 550- or 700-gallon tank trailer with hydraulic agitation control is often used by legitimate sealcoating contractors.

Stay away from anyone with "truck bed" setups, spray guns, or small tanks with thin material hoses. This often means the material they are applying is not mixed/agitated with sand or often is diluted to stretch the life and overcome having a smaller equipment setup.

6. What other jobs have you completed in the area recently, specifically in the past three years?

Ask your contractor for references within the community, look for reviews online, and check around for examples of job pictures to know what you will get with your service. Do your homework. Check other online sources like the Better Business Bureau.

7. What do you do to prepare the surface prior to sealing it?

Proper cleaning and prep work can make or break a quality sealcoating job. The sealer needs a clean surface to properly bond to.

Your sealcoating contractor should perform an assessment of the existing asphalt surface to evaluate what prep work and repairs are necessary prior to applying sealer. Any adjacent lawn or mulch areas should be edged back to expose the outside edges of your driveway. In some cases, pressure washing may be required to clean off heavy surface dirt and debris.

Following pressure washing, steel carbon brooms and industrial blowers should be

used to clean any remaining dirt as well as clean out larger open driveway cracks. The entire driveway is then blown off carefully to remove every loose piece of stone, dirt, leaf, etc.

A chalk line is snapped at the driveway end, so a detailed straight edge is left where the sealcoating application starts and stops. Lastly, oil stains should have a spot primer applied to them to encourage better adherence.

8. Will anything be placed to cordon off the driveway and how long do I need to remain off of it once you're done?

Although we can all admit nobody really likes to wait, it's critical your sealcoating application be left to dry and begin to undergo the curing process. Depending on the time of year and sun exposure of your property, this can be anywhere from a recommended 48-72 hours before returning your vehicles to the driveway. You will want to gently turn your tires for the first week or two to avoid tire marks while the newly applied sealer is most heavily curing.

Caution tape attached to stakes will be installed at the driveway entrance to close it off once the job is completed.

Picking Plants That Work To Ward Off Bugs

tired-looking wall or a dull bedroom can be instantly transformed into a colorful oasis just by adding plant life. But looking good isn't the only gift these green gods have to offer. In fact, there are specific plants that keep pests out of your home. And if that wasn't impressive enough, some plants serve another function as well — adding great flavor to your cooking!

Herbs

Basil, lavender and rosemary not only taste great but also will keep the flies away. Basil specifically works to prevent flies and mosquitoes from inhabiting your living quarters and should be planted close to your house doors or outside in areas where you host frequent gatherings.

Lavender bushels can be placed in vases throughout your home.

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While we tend to find the scent of lavender calming, it has the opposite effect on mosquitoes, moths, fleas and flies.

Rosemary works to ward off mosquitoes and other insects that tend to feast on vegetable plants. If you have an indoor garden or small patio lot, consider adding some rosemary, as well.

Flowers

Although many flowers are only available seasonally, try a rotating assortment of flowers that can add pops of colors, attract human eyes and deter unwanted pesky guests.

Chrysanthemums are reasonably priced, come in a variation of bright colors, and their protective range is quite extensive, naturally repelling fleas, bedbugs, roaches, ticks, lice, spider mites and more. You can plant them in spaces where natural filtered bright light (avoid direct light) hits, like a window, and keep the temperature between 60-80 de-



grees Fahrenheit. Chrysanthemums also filter the air, removing toxins.

Marigolds produce an odor that repels rodents, flies and worms. When planting marigolds indoors, they require at least 10 hours of light per day. Placing them by a window that gets sunlight most of the day is ideal. While they generally survive best in a greenhouse, if you keep your home's tempera-

ture between 70 and 75 degrees Fahrenheit year-round, they'll have a good chance at a long plant life.

Houseplants

The talent of the Venus flytrap is given away by the name itself. As soon as a fly or mosquito lands on it, the "mouth" of the flytrap will snap shut, killing the gnat or other insect by trapping it inside. Place these plants in bright, indirect sunlight such as a windowsill. They tend to be bright green with a reddish pink hue to differentiate the trap, or mouth, of the plant.

Sage bushes can cleanse your home of insects. Place your sage plant near indirect light, either near a window or glass door.

Before you purchase any chemical-filled, human-made bug spray or deterrent, remember that nature often offers better solutions. Your reward will be healthier lungs and pretty plants instead. ■

TARP REMOVAL

Many homeowners have tarps or covers

on items in their outdoor spaces. If not stretched taut, the tarps are holding water. Check tarps over firewood piles, portable fireplaces, recycling cans, boats, sports equipment and grills. Use bungee cords to keep tarps tight.

TREAT Utilize a mosquito elimination barrier treatment around the home and yard. Using a barrier treatment at home reduces the need for using DEET-containing bug spray on the body.

TAKE CAREHome maintenance can be a deciding factor in property values and mosquito bites. Regularly clean out gutters and make sure the downspout is attached properly. Regrade areas where water stands more than a few hours, and make sure that all fallen branches and hollow trees or logs are removed from the property. Check irrigation systems to ensure that they are not leaking and causing a breeding haven. Keep your lawn height low and weed areas maintained.

TEAM UP Despite taking all precautions in your own home, talking with neighbors is a key component to mosquito and tick control. Education and knowledge can be used not only for your own yard but also for open spaces and community owned areas.



aryland is a dense state, covered with trees and vines introduced by travelers for nearly 400 years. With such a rich history, using native plants is essential to supporting our local ecosystems. Native plants are the

foundation of any sustainable landscape — they symbiotically assist pollinators, provide food and shelter for wildlife, and help maintain soil health. By choosing natives, we strengthen the bond between our gardens and the environment, creating spaces that thrive naturally.

So, how can we help sustain the Earth in this opaque shade that most of us share?

Here are my top 10 favorite native plants that flourish in low-light conditions:

- Jacob's Ladder (polemonium reptans)
 A delicate groundcover with fern-like foliage and clusters of blue flowers.

 Thrives in moist, well-draining soil
- Summersweet (clethra anifolia)
 A fragrant summer blooming shrub that attracts pollinators
- Doghobble (leucothoe fontanesiana)
 Not widely known, but this small shrub produces strings of tiny, bell-shaped flowers. It is an excellent evergreen option for year-round interest as well
- Cardinal Flower (lobelia cardinalis)
 A vibrant red blooming perennial that adds a pop of elegance to any shady spot. A favorite among hummingbirds
- Virginia Bluebells (mertensia virginica)
 A spring blooming perennial with sky blue, bell-shaped flowers. This beauty disappears into the soil once the summer heat hits (almost like a bulb), so be sure to plant summer-loving companions nearby to compensate
- Lizard's Tail (saururus cernuus)
 With arching spikes of fragrant white blooms, this perennial thrives in consistent moisture. An ideal choice for pond-side gardens
- Golden Ragwort (packera aurea)
 A super low-maintenance perennial, forming a carpet of yellow in the spring

- Creeping Sedge (carex laxiculmis)
 A hardy perennial with seafoam green blades that pop beautifully against the deep shadows of the shade
- Foamflower (tiarella cordifolia)
 A wonderful native alternative to hostas, with soft white blooms and attractive, deeply lobed foliage
- Fern species
 (polystichum acrostichoides,
 osmundastrum cinnamomeum)
 These native ferns thrive in shady
 areas, providing year-round
 texture and an ancient woodland
 feel to any space

Although natives are a must, a shade garden isn't just about the plants — it's also about the ambiance. Incorporating pathways with stepping stones, small water features, or even seating areas can turn these spaces into serene retreats. Pairing lush greenery with textural elements like wood, stone and mulch ensures that your shaded space feels intentionally designed rather than neglected.

Local stone quarried out of Marriottsville, Maryland, are a fantastic contrast against the monotony of foliage in shaded

areas. Their mica-filled texture allows them to stand out in dark places and reflect light, adding structure and interest to the space.

Native Plants

Nature's Problem Solvers



ollinator populations are globally in decline. By now, most of us know that native plants provide specialized feeding and breeding sites required for the survival of these tiny beings that we rely on for our food, economy and culture. Planting even a small container of native perennials like milkweed, turtlehead, coneflower or mountain mint can make a difference.

Did you know that native plants can do more than just contribute to the survival of pollinators?

Take erosion, for instance. Erosion is a natural process caused by water, wind and gravity, but it is exacerbated by development, deforestation, climate change, and inappropriate management of stormwater and runoff. If your property is succumbing to erosion, you can use native plants to mitigate the harm and prevent further damage.

Partridgeberry is a creeping, mat-forming

ground cover that is effective in controlling erosion on shady, wooded slopes. Native sedges like tussock sedge, plantain-leaved sedge, and Pennsylvania sedge are popular for erosion control and adapt to a variety of sun tolerances and soil types.

Itea, commonly called sweetspire, is a shrub that grows by suckers to form thickets of beautifully colored foliage that bursts into fragrant, four-inch spires of white bloom in late spring. Many native plants form deep underground root systems that retain soil and control erosion while providing bloom, fragrance, color and a home for wildlife.

Feeling the heat from climate change? The effects of climate change are real, exhibited by an overall warming trend, extreme temperature fluctuations, and severe weather events. Locally, the effects of global warming contribute to oak decline, the introduction of new pests and fungal diseases that negatively impact plants, and a shift in our plant hardiness zone from 7b in 2012 to 8a in 2023.

The easiest way to fight climate change is to plant trees! Trees pull carbon from the atmosphere during photosynthesis, cleaning the air while providing the very oxygen we breathe. Plus, planting a diverse selection of native trees can create

desirable shade and provide food and shelter for pollinators, birds and wildlife.

Red maples are workhorses for fighting climate change, with large leaves that boost photosynthesis levels and root systems that adapt to various soil conditions. Generally, oaks are host to more caterpillars than any other tree, 532 species to be exact. The stately willow oak is an important species for wildlife food production, and shelters blue jays, red-headed woodpeckers, flickers and other songbirds and raptors, while enhancing the landscape with beautiful fall color. The Eastern red cedar is a gorgeous native evergreen that provides shelter for over 30 native moths and butterflies to complete their breeding and egg-laying cycle.

Native plants can also be used to create an edible landscape, control drainage issues, contribute to soil health, and provide beautiful, beneficial screening.


