



Babies are judged on personality, looks and behavior; clothing will not be judged. T-shirts will be awarded to the top three girls and boys in seven age categories: Birth-3 moths, 3-6 months, 6-12 months, 12-18 months, 18-24 months, 24-30 months and 30-36 months.

Children who have reached the age of 3 years are not eligible.

In case of rain, the contest will be in the Stockton Middle School gym, and those participating are asked to park in the parking lot outside the school cafeteria.

No taxidermied pets or props will be allowed. For more information, call 276-1770 or (417) 808-0895.




An annual tradition at the Black Walnut Festival is the pedal tractor pull sponsored by the Stockton FFA chapter.



Each worker will try to get the most dollars and, in exchange, will agree to work seven hours for anyone willing to fork out the cash. These students will do any-




thing from picking up rocks to hauling hay. **Legion serves**




Each plastic nut can be purchased for \$1 apiece, six for \$5 or 30 for \$20. Prizes totaling \$1,000 in value will be awarded.

Hammons plans BWF black walnut contest

Hammons Products, in conjunction with the Black Walnut Festival, sponsors the annual Black Walnut Contest scheduled from 9-10 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 23. Chairpersons for the event are Steve Rutledge and Kim Mesenbrink.

Entries need to be brought and registered at the front office of Hammons Products Co., 105 Hammons Drive, Stockton.

Black walnuts may be entered from named or unnamed variety trees. All black walnuts for each entry must come from one tree and must be from the current year's

crop. Fifteen nuts per entry are required. Black walnuts must have the husk removed and be clean.

Participants are encouraged to submit more than one entry. Entries become the property of the Black Walnut Festival.

Entries will be judged on nutmeat color, flavor, plumpness, size, thinness of the shell and freedom from dark nutmeats.

Prizes are \$30 for first place, \$25 for second, \$20 for third, \$15 for fourth, \$10 for fifth and \$5 for sixth through 15th. Also, the black walnuts from the winning tree will be purchased at 40 cents per pound
